Notice of Deficiencies, Imposition of Civil Monetary Penalty, and

Opportunity for Hearing

Dear Mrs. Sharpe:

On September 6, 2023, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") received notice of an "immediate" closing of Visicu, Inc., Permit Number D05157, located in Baltimore, Maryland. The Board subsequently sent numerous notifications and requests to arrange for a closing inspection in accordance with the Board's regulations. However, the Facility failed to complete a closing inspection. In addition, the Facility failed to provide the Board with 30 days advanced notice of its closing.

#### I. FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

The Board finds that the Distributor failed to submit written notification to the Board at least 30 days prior to its closure, and failed to complete a closing inspection.

Based upon the Distributor's failure to submit timely notification to the Board of its closure and its failure to submit to a closing inspection, the Board finds that the Distributor is subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Maryland Pharmacy Act and the regulations adopted thereunder. Health Occ. Art. § 12-6C-11; COMAR 10.34.22.10B(1) and (2).

## II. RECOMMENDED CIVIL MONETARY PENALTY

Under Maryland Health Occupations Article § 12-6C-11 and COMAR 10.34.22.05, the Board of Pharmacy has the authority to impose a civil monetary penalty based upon violations of the Maryland Pharmacy Act.

Based upon the Distributor's infractions above, the Board hereby recommends the imposition of a **civil monetary penalty of \$500.00**.

In determining the recommended civil monetary penalty, the Board took into consideration the aggregating and mitigating factors outlined in COMAR 10.34.11.08.

### III. OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

If the Distributor disputes the findings, conclusions or the recommended civil monetary penalty, the Distributor may request an evidentiary hearing on the Board's decision in this matter. In the event that the Distributor requests an evidentiary hearing, the Board shall initiate formal proceedings which will include the opportunity for a full evidentiary hearing. The hearing will be held in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Md. Code Ann. State Gov't § 10-201 et seq., and COMAR 10.34.01. Any request for a hearing must by submitted in writing to Trina Leak, Pharm.D., Compliance Director, Maryland Board of Pharmacy, 4201 Patterson Ave., 5th Floor, Baltimore, Maryland 21215, no later than thirty (30) days of the date of this Notice.

Please be advised that at the hearing the Distributor would have the following rights: to be represented by counsel, to subpoena witnesses, to call witnesses on its own behalf, to present evidence, to cross-examine witnesses, to testify, and to present summation and argument. Should the Board find the Distributor guilty of the violations, the Board may reprimand, suspend or revoke the permit, place the permit on probation, and/or impose civil penalties. If the Distributor requests a hearing but fails to appear, the Board may nevertheless hear and determine the matter in its absence.

# IV. OPTION TO PAY RECOMMENDED CIVIL MONETARY PENALTY

Alternatively, the Distributor may pay the recommended civil monetary penalty within thirty (30) days of the date of this Notice, in the form of a certified check or money order made payable to the Maryland Board of Pharmacy.

Ann. Code, General Provisions Art. § 4-101 *et seq.*, and posted and reported in accordance with State and federal laws.
