**ORDER LIFTING SUSPENSION AND  
REINSTATING PHARMACY TECHNICIAN REGISTRATION**

On September 6, 2013, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) issued an Order of Suspension of Registration for Delinquent Child Support (“Order of Suspension”) against Giovanni Vittoriano, Pharmacy Technician, Registration No. T08462 (the “Respondent”). The Board suspended the Respondent’s registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland due to his delinquent child support payments upon a request from the Baltimore City Office of the Child Support Enforcement Administration of the Maryland Department of Human Resources (the “Administration”), pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Fam. Law § 10-119.3(e)(2)(i) (2012 Repl. Vol.).


On or about December 3, 2013, the Board received a Notice to Reinstate the Respondent’s registration from the Administration. Pursuant to the Maryland Pharmacy Act, Maryland Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 12-101 *et seq.*, the Respondent otherwise qualifies for a registration.

Therefore, pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Fam. Law § 10-119.3(k), on this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2013, by the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, it is hereby:

**ORDERED** that the suspension of the registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland held by Giovanni Vittoriano, Registration No. T08462, is **LIFTED**; and it is further,

**ORDERED** that the registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland held by Giovanni Vittoriano, Registration No. T08462, is **REINSTATED** without restrictions or conditions; and it is further,

**ORDERED** that this is a Final Order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and, as such, is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., State Gov't §§10-617(h).
