Dear Pharmacist Das:

On August 17, 2016, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") conducted an annual inspection of Walgreen's Pharmacy #09-342 (the "Pharmacy") for compliance with statutes and regulations governing the operation of a pharmacy. The Board's inspection indicated that the Pharmacy was not compliant with laws relating to storage and labeling of drug inventory. Specifically, the Board inspector noted 2 medications in the Pharmacy's inventory with no labels or other identification; 4 return-to-stock medications without expiration dates; and 12 expired medications. The Board's records indicate that the Pharmacy's prior inspection on August 19, 2015, noted similar deficiencies with expired medications.

## I. FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

The Board adopts as findings the deficiencies as stated in the Board's inspection report, dated August 17, 2016, and attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Based upon deficiencies at your Pharmacy, the Board finds that the Pharmacy is in violation of the Maryland Pharmacy Act and the regulations adopted thereunder. Specifically, the Board finds the Pharmacy in violation of Health Occ. Art. §§ 12-403(c)(1) and (12), Health Gen. § 21-218, and COMAR 10.34.12.

#### II. RECOMMENDED CIVIL MONETARY PENALTY

Under Maryland Health Occupations Article § 12-410 and COMAR 10.34.11, the Board of Pharmacy has the authority to impose a civil monetary penalty based upon violations of the Maryland Pharmacy Act.

Based upon the deficiencies cited at the Pharmacy, the Board hereby recommends the imposition of a **civil monetary penalty of \$5,000.00**. The deficiencies upon which the civil monetary penalty is based are set forth above in this Notice and in the Inspection Report dated August 17, 2016.

In determining the recommended civil monetary penalty, the Board took into consideration the aggregating and mitigating factors outlined in COMAR 10.34.11.08.

#### III. FOLLOW-UP INSPECTION

Please be advised that the Board of Pharmacy may perform a follow-up inspection of the Pharmacy to insure that the deficiencies noted herein have been addressed and corrected. Should the follow-up inspection indicate that the Pharmacy has further deficiencies, the Board may pursue further disciplinary action against the Pharmacy that may result in the imposition of sanctions such as suspension, revocation or additional monetary penalties.

## IV. OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

If the Pharmacy disputes the findings, conclusions or the civil monetary penalty, the Pharmacy may request an evidentiary hearing on the Board's decision in this matter. In the event that the Pharmacy requests an evidentiary hearing, the Board shall initiate formal proceedings which will include the opportunity for a full evidentiary hearing. The hearing will be held in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Md. Code Ann. State Gov't § 10-201 *et seq.*, and COMAR 10.34.01. Any request for a hearing must by submitted in writing to Vanessa Thomas Gray, Compliance Investigator, Maryland Board of Pharmacy, 4201 Patterson Ave., 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Baltimore, Maryland 21215, **no later than thirty (30) days of the date of this Notice.** 

Please be advised that at the hearing you would have the following rights: to be represented by counsel, to subpoen a witnesses, to call witnesses on your own behalf, to

present evidence, to cross-examine witnesses, to testify, and to present summation and argument. Should the Board find the Pharmacy guilty of the violations cited in the Reports, the Board may suspend or revoke the pharmacy permit, or impose civil penalties, or both. If you request a hearing but fail to appear, the Board may nevertheless hear and determine the matter in your absence.

## V. OPTION TO PAY RECOMMENDED CIVIL MONETARY PENALTY

Alternatively, the Pharmacy may pay the recommended civil monetary penalty within thirty (30) days of the date of this Notice, in the form of a certified check or money order made payable to the Maryland Board of Pharmacy.

Upon the Pharmacy's payment of the civil monetary penalty, this Notice will constitute the Board's final action with respect to the August 17, 2016 inspection, and shall be a public document in accordance with the Maryland Public Information Act.
