MADAP Services

MADAP provides access to medications on the formulary in two ways:

- Drug Assistance Program (Prescriptions)
 - MADAP
 - TAP
- Insurance Assistance Program (Premiums)
MADAP Plus

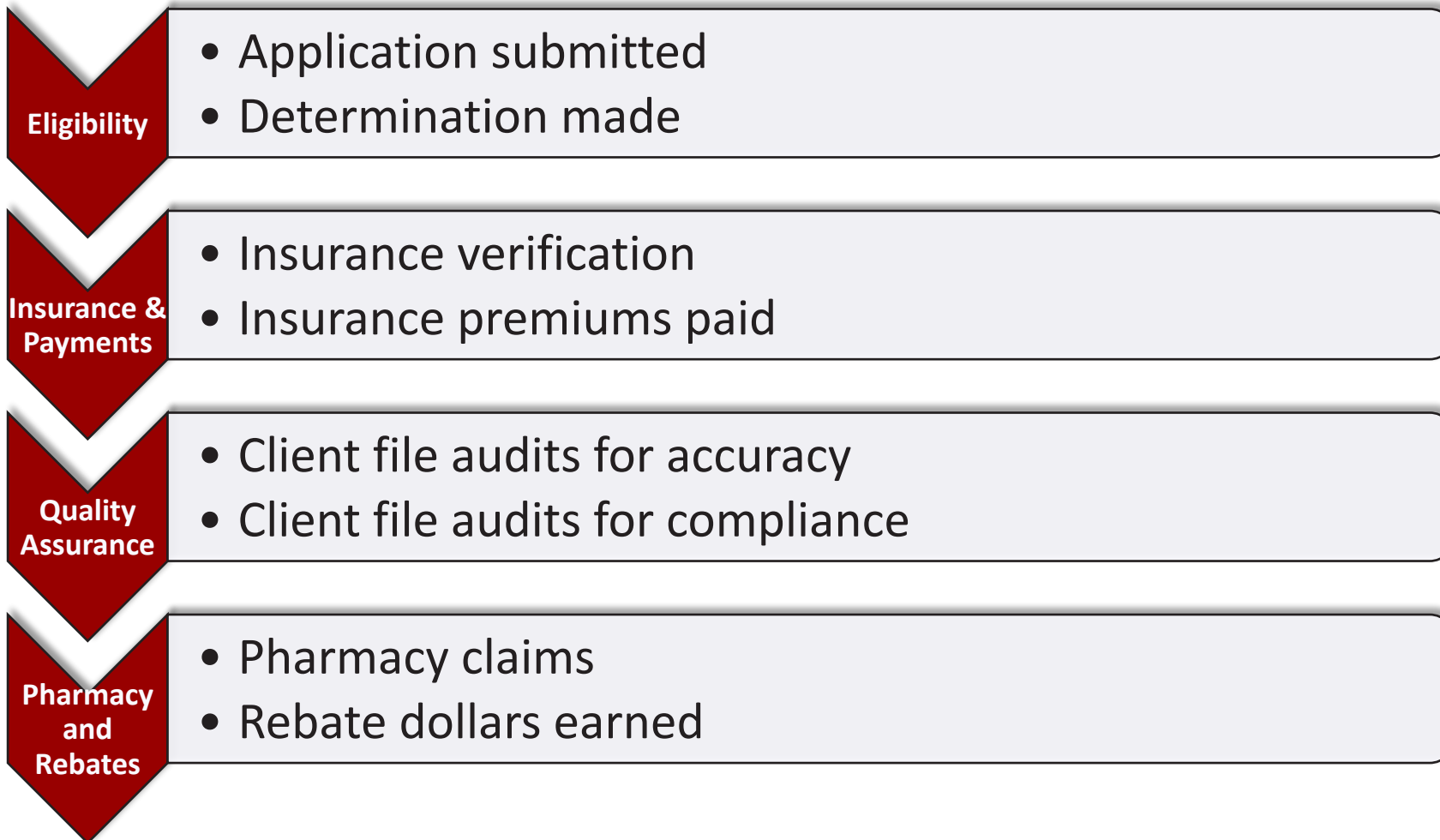


MADAP Services

What MADAP covers for eligible clients:

- 100% of the cost of drugs on the formulary for clients with no insurance
- Deductibles, copays and coinsurance of drugs on the formulary for clients with insurance, except for Medical Assistance (MA)
- Insurance and prescription plan premiums for eligible clients

Case Presentation: New Patient Visit

April 2022

Alexandra Hamilton is a recent graduate from the *End the Epidemic School of Social Work* who just started working with your clinic's *Ryan White* service. Ms. Hamilton's first patient, Preston Parker, was linked to care from an outreach program and is in the clinic for a new patient appointment and intake case management assessment.

Case Presentation: New Patient Visit

April 2022

Preston Parker:

- ❑ 26 y/o single graduate student who shares an apartment with a classmate
- ❑ Part-time rideshare driver, earns \$450/week plus tips
- ❑ Coverage on parent's insurance policy ended March 31, 2022
- ❑ Tested HIV+ 3 weeks ago after a negative HIV test six months earlier
- ❑ Lab requests for CD4 count, HIV RNA viral load and Hepatitis panel and new prescriptions from Nurse Practitioner

Case Presentation: New Patient Visit

April 2022

Mr. Parker has been scheduled for a return appointment with his medical provider in two weeks. He was given new prescriptions for *Tivicay* and *Descovy* and referred to case management to apply for Ryan White Program services and new health insurance coverage.

Ms. Hamilton reviews Mr. Parker's medical record and provider's referral. During the interview, she gives the patient a copy of the MADAP application. Mr Parker is instructed to complete the application and return it as soon as possible with four weeks of pay stubs, a recent bill, and past insurance information.

MADAP Eligibility



- To be eligible for MADAP, an individual must:
 - Be a Maryland resident
 - Be HIV positive (MADAP does not cover pre or post-exposure treatment)
 - Have a provider prescribe HIV medication(s) on the MADAP formulary
 - Have a household gross income below 500% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
 - Not be eligible for any Maryland Medicaid Programs or coverage groups that qualify for Medical Assistance (MA) with pharmacy benefits

Documentation

- The following of eligibility documentation must be submitted with an Enrollment Application:
 - Proof of HIV sero-positive status or other evidence of HIV infection on medical form (one time only)
 - Proof of Maryland residency
 - Documentation of gross household income
 - If the client has Medicare or any insurance, include a copy of the insurance and/or prescription card(s)
