The U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ) published revised regulations for Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA") in the Federal Register on September 15, 2010. These regulations adopted revised, enforceable accessibility standards called the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design ("2010 Standards"), which are available online at http://www.ada.gov/2010ADAstandards index.htm. The 2010 Standards set minimum requirements – both scoping and technical – for State and local government facilities, public accommodations, and commercial facilities to be readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities. It should also be noted that swimming pools and spas are specifically not eligible for the so-called "safe harbor" provision of the regulation, so that if they are subject to the regulation at all they must comply with the provisions of 2010 Standards by March 15, 2012.
