Notes

- Meeting minutes from 10.19.22, 11.16.22, and 12.06.22 were reviewed and approved unanimously (Jack Daniels abstained). Minutes from 12.06.22 will be updated with CEJSC members in attendance.
- School Workgroup Looking at MDA IPM Report, as well as information from MDA website. Has not met since last meeting.
- Previously CEHPAC had decided to draft a letter to the Offices of Governmental Affairs of state
 agencies explaining what CEHPAC does, especially in CEHPAC's role in reviewing regulations
 proposals that affect children's environmental health. This was deferred until the new
 administration was sworn in. Many of the agencies report that leadership is still getting
 situated. Cliff requested Devon and Jovonne to draft and co-sign a letter.

- Update to 2008 Children's Environmental Health Report, which was largely a product of MDE, MDH, and CEHPAC. Johns Hopkins preventative medicine residents have worked on this over time, as well as other JHU students and residents. Cliff reviewed the proposed outline for the report, as well as areas to work on in order to be able to publish this year. Suggests adding in a section on health disparities and environmental justice. Requests volunteers to assist:

 - o Dianna
 - o Ben
 - Devon
- Cliff reviewed a constituent inquiry which was sent to him as chair of CEHPAC. The inquiry was requesting a review of the potential health impacts of chromebook computers. Cliff shared with the constituent some of the reviews of research on screen times and directed her to the recent Guidelines to Reduce EMF Radiation.
- Eamon reviewed the process for scheduling meetings for 2023, which will be posted to the website shortly. Members were reminded that they are expected to attend at least half of the meetings, and if they anticipated difficulty in attending future meetings, to reach out to Eamon.
- 2023 Legislative Session Bills which Cliff and Eamon have identified as related to children's
 environmental health have been sent to CEHPAC members by email. CEHPAC's role is to be an
 outside voice to help shape what the government does. Ex officio members of CEHPAC serve as
 subject matter experts, and the input from non-governmental members are encouraged.
 CEHPAC discussed some of the pertinent legislation.
 - o HB 9 transportation equity act CEHPAC agreed to revise the 2021 letter on HB 1204
 - o HB 79 whole home repairs act
 - HB 147 Climate crisis plan Investment in the future generation, and leading planning with consideration for children. Planning for climate crises must include a specific focus on the health impacts and UNIQUE VULNERABILITIES that climate change has and will have on children at the local level. Nse to draft a position and send to Cliff and Eamon.
 - o HB 299 synthetic turf chain of custody Cliff and Eamon to circulate prior position.
 - HB 310 'Justice 40' bill Aimed at prioritizing MDE spending on overburdened lowincome communities.
 - o HB 473 Air quality monitoring
- Cliff highlighted the upcoming EPA webinar on lead poisoning data
- Cliff discussed an email received from a natural turf industry representative who requested a
 meeting with CEHPAC. Members interested in participating should contact Cliff. Cliff will also
 invite them to the next CEHPAC meeting.

Public Comments

Veronika Carella – Asks that CEHPAC follows the Sunshine Laws for meetings with more
advanced notice. Asks that meeting minutes more accurately document public input. Joint
Chairmen's Report – How will CEHPAC communicate its findings to the Joint Chairmen? Asks
that CEHPAC respond more specifically to the Joint Chairmen's Report, including submission
of findings of the Schools Workgroup. Notes that eight of the schools listed in the data only
had a general outline for what their IPM plan would be, not that it was developed and

implemented. Requests that CEHPAC allow more public participation in meetings in order to be more transparent, especially as it relates to the Joint Chairmen's Report and CEHPAC's contributions.

Devon Dodson moved to adjourn, seconded by Dianna Abney. Meeting adjourned at 3:00pm.
