

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 2 people diagnosed with HIV in Allegany County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 24 new HIV diagnoses in Allegany County.
- Of the 24 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 58.3% were among NH-White people, and 16.7% were among NH-Black people.
 Furthermore, 41.7% of the diagnoses were among adults ages 20-29 years old, and 20.8% were among those ages 40-49.


People Living with Diagnosed HIV

- Rates (per 100,000) were five times as high in males (376.3) compared to females (68.2).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 1.5 to 7 times higher among NH-Black (942.5) compared to Hispanic (610.3) and NH-Whites (137.3). 51.8% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Allegany County were NH-White.
