

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2021, there were 106 people diagnosed with HIV in Baltimore County.

- 68.9% of the 106 reported HIV diagnoses in Baltimore County during 2021 were among NH-Black people and 16.0% among NH-White people.
- Of the 106 HIV diagnoses in 2021, 28.3% were among adults ages 20-29 years old, 25.5% were among those ages 30-39, and 16.0% were among those ages 40-49.

At the end of 2021, there were 3,814 people living with diagnosed HIV in Baltimore County.





- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (705.0) as compared to females (377.7).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 2 to 9 times higher among NH-Black people (1,280.6) as compared to Hispanic people (538.6) and NH-White people (145.4). 71.6% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Baltimore County were NH-Black.
