




HIV IN BALTIMORE COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 92 people diagnosed with HIV in Baltimore County.

- 75.0% of the 92 reported HIV diagnoses in Baltimore County in 2020 were NH-Black and 13.0% were NH-White.
- Of the 92 HIV diagnoses in 2020, 35.9% were among adults ages 20-29 years old, 23.9% were among those ages 30-39, and 15.2% were among those ages 40-49.



People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 3,793 people living with diagnosed HIV in Baltimore County.




- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (724.7) compared to females (385.7).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 2 to 9 times higher among NH-Blacks (1,323.6) compared to Hispanics (533.1) and NH-Whites (149.9). 71.6% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Baltimore County were NH-Black.
