


HIV IN CALVERT COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 6 people diagnosed with HIV in Calvert County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 24 new HIV diagnoses in Calvert County.
- Of the 24 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 66.7% were among NH-Black people, and 25.0% were among NH-White people. Furthermore, 37.5% of the diagnoses were among adults ages 20-29 years old, and 29.2% were among those ages 50-59.




People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 137 people living with diagnosed HIV in Calvert County.

- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (246.8) compared to females (105.3).
 - Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 2.5 to 10 times higher among NH-Blacks (723.1) compared to Hispanics (277.8) and NH-Whites (75.5). 55.5% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Calvert County were NH-Black.
