



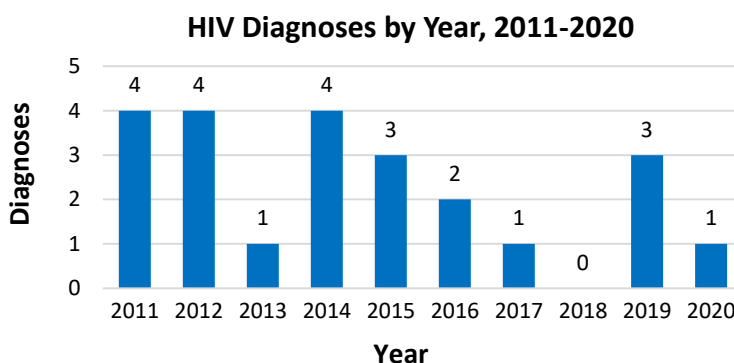
HIV IN CAROLINE COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there was 1 person diagnosed with HIV in Caroline County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 7 new HIV diagnoses in Caroline County.
- Of the 7 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 28.6% were among NH-Black people and 42.9% were among NH-White people. Furthermore, 57.1% were among adults ages 20-29 years old, 42.9% were among those ages 40-49.



People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 64 people living with diagnosed HIV in Caroline County.

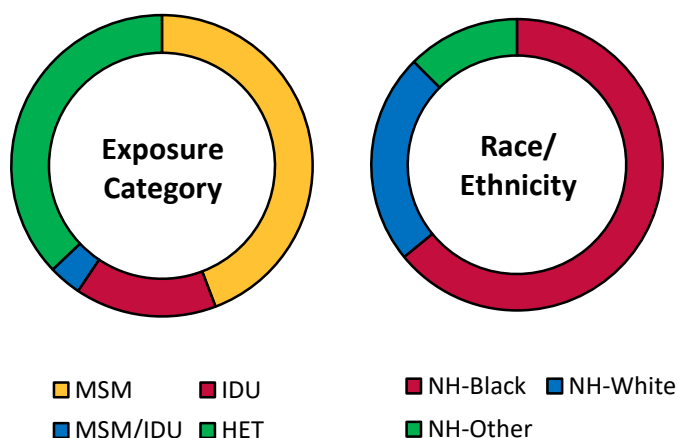

- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (318.5) compared to females (146.2).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 15 times higher among NH-Blacks (1,089.6) compared to NH-Whites (69.7). 64.1% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Caroline County were NH-Black.
