




HIV IN CARROLL COUNTY, 2021

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2021, there were 8 people diagnosed with HIV in Carroll County.

- 50.0% of the 8 reported HIV diagnoses in Carroll County during 2021 were among NH-Black people and 37.5% among NH-White people.
- Of the 8 HIV diagnoses in 2021, 37.5% were among adults ages 30-39 years old, 25% were among those ages 20-29 and 60+, respectively.



People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2021, there were 173 people living with diagnosed HIV in Carroll County.





- Rates (per 100,000) were three times as high in males (168.5) as compared to females (67.3).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 5 to 14 times higher among NH-Black people (971.2) as compared to Hispanic people (196.7) and NH-White people (67.6). 50.9% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Carroll County were NH-White.
