




HIV IN CARROLL COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 2 people diagnosed with HIV in Carroll County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 24 new HIV diagnoses in Carroll County.
- Of the 24 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 50.0% were among NH-White people and 41.7% were among NH-Black people. Furthermore, 33.3% were among adults ages 30-39 years old, 20.8% were among those ages 20-29 as well as ages 50-59.



People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 161 people living with diagnosed HIV in Carroll County.




- Rates (per 100,000) were three times as high in males (165.9) compared to females (60.3).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 5 to 13 times higher among NH-Blacks (876.4) compared to Hispanics (193.3) and NH-Whites (68.3). 54.0% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Carroll County were NH-White.
