


HIV IN FREDERICK COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 14 people diagnosed with HIV in Frederick County.

- 42.9% of the 14 reported HIV diagnoses in Frederick County in 2020 were NH-Black and 28.6% were NH-White.
- Of the 14 HIV diagnoses in 2020, 14.3% were among adults ages 20-29 years old, 57.1% were among those ages 30-39, and 21.4% were among those ages 40-49.




People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 470 people living with diagnosed HIV in Frederick County.

- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (285.4) compared to females (141.4).
 - Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 3 to 8 times higher among NH-Blacks (877.8) compared to Hispanics (262.7) and NH-Whites (111.5). 41.7% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Frederick County were NH-Black.
