
DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 16 people diagnosed with HIV in Howard County.

- 43.8% of the 16 reported HIV diagnoses in Howard County in 2020 were NH-Black and 31.3% were Hispanic.
- Of the 16 HIV diagnoses in 2020, 43.8% were among adults ages 20-29 years old, 43.8% were among those ages 30-39, and 6.3% were among those ages 40-49 as well as 50-59.


People Living with Diagnosed HIV

- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (332.4) compared to females (186.0).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 3 to 10 times higher among NH-Blacks (846.4) compared to Hispanics (296.8) and NH-Whites (88.7). 64.2% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Howard County were NH-Black.
