


HIV IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, 2020

SEPTEMBER 2020

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2019, there were 135 people diagnosed with HIV in Montgomery County.

- 62.2% of the 135 reported HIV diagnoses in Montgomery County in 2019 were NH-Black, and 21.5% were Hispanic.
- Of the 135 HIV diagnoses in 2019, 33.3% were among adults ages 30-39 years old, 27.4% were among those ages 20-29, and 18.5% were among those ages 40-49.




People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2019, there were 3,544 people living with diagnosed HIV in Montgomery County.

- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (522.5) compared to females (295.5).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 4 to 10 times higher among NH-Blacks (1,368.6) compared to Hispanics (334.2) and NH-Whites (136.4). 62.2% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Montgomery County were NH-Black.
