

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2021, there was 1 person diagnosed with HIV in Queen Anne's County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 9 new HIV diagnoses in Queen Anne's County.
- Of the 9 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 44.4% were among NH-White people, and 44.4% were among NH-Black people. Furthermore, 66.6% were among adults ages 20-39 years old.

At the end of 2021, there were 56 people living with diagnosed HIV in Queen Anne's County.





- Rates (per 100,000) were four times as high in males (204.4) as compared to females (54.9).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 13 to 15 times higher among NH-Black people (877.0) as compared to NH-White people (69.0) and Hispanic people (59.9). 46.4% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Queen Anne's County were NH-White.
