




HIV IN SOMERSET COUNTY, 2021

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2021, there were 2 people diagnosed with HIV in Somerset County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 12 new HIV diagnoses in Somerset County.
- Of the 12 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 75.0% were among NH-Black people. Furthermore, 33.3% were among adults ages 20-29 years old, and 33.3% were among those ages 50-59.



People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2021, there were 93 people living with diagnosed HIV in Somerset County.





- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (577.2) as compared to females (255.9).
- Of the 93 people currently living with diagnosed HIV in Somerset County, 48.3% had an estimated or reported exposure of MMSC, followed by 35.7% for HET exposure and 12.6% for IDU exposure.
