




HIV IN SAINT MARY'S COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 4 people diagnosed with HIV in Saint Mary's County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 23 new HIV diagnoses in Saint Mary's County.
- Of the 23 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 56.5% were among NH-Blacks, and 34.8% were among NH-Whites. 65.2% of the diagnoses were among adults ages 20-29 years old, and 17.4% were among those ages 40-49.



People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 160 people living with diagnosed HIV in Saint Mary's County.





- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (227.8) compared to females (108.7).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 10 to 12 times higher among NH-Blacks (748.5) compared to Hispanics (61.4) and NH-Whites (67.7). 64.4% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Saint Mary's County were NH-Black.
