




HIV IN TALBOT COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 2 people diagnosed with HIV in Talbot County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 6 new HIV diagnoses in Talbot County.
- Of the 6 HIV diagnoses in the past 5 years, 50.0% were among NH-Blacks, and 16.7% were among NH-Whites. Furthermore, 100.0% of the diagnoses were among adults ages 20-29 years old.



People Living with Diagnosed HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 79 people living with diagnosed HIV in Talbot County.

- Rates (per 100,000) were three times as high in males (391.3) compared to females (116.2).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 10 times higher among NH-Blacks (1,051.3) compared to NH-Whites (108.9). 51.9% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Talbot County were NH-Black.




