


HIV IN WICOMICO COUNTY, 2019

SEPTEMBER 2020

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2019, there were 20 people diagnosed with HIV in Wicomico County.

- 70.0% of the 20 reported HIV diagnoses in Wicomico County in 2019 were NH-Black, and 15.0% were NH-White.
- Of the 20 HIV diagnoses in 2019, 55.0% were among adults ages 20-29 years old, 30.0% were among those ages 30-39, and 10.0% were among those ages 50-59.




People Living with Diagnosed HIV

- Rates (per 100,000) were two times as high in males (441.1) compared to females (180.5).
- Rates among people living with diagnosed HIV were 2 to 8 times higher among NH-Blacks (775.0) compared to Hispanics (402.9) and NH-Whites (99.0). 65.5% of people living with diagnosed HIV in Wicomico County were NH-Black.
