

HIV IN WORCESTER COUNTY, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses

In 2020, there were 2 people diagnosed with HIV in Worcester County.

- Over the past 5 years, there have been a total of 10 new HIV diagnoses in Worcester County.
- Of the 10 HIV diagnoses in the last 5 years, 60.0% were among NH-Blacks, and 30.0% were among NH-Whites. Furthermore, 70.0% of the diagnoses were adults ages 20-29 years old, and 20.0% were among those ages 50-59.
