

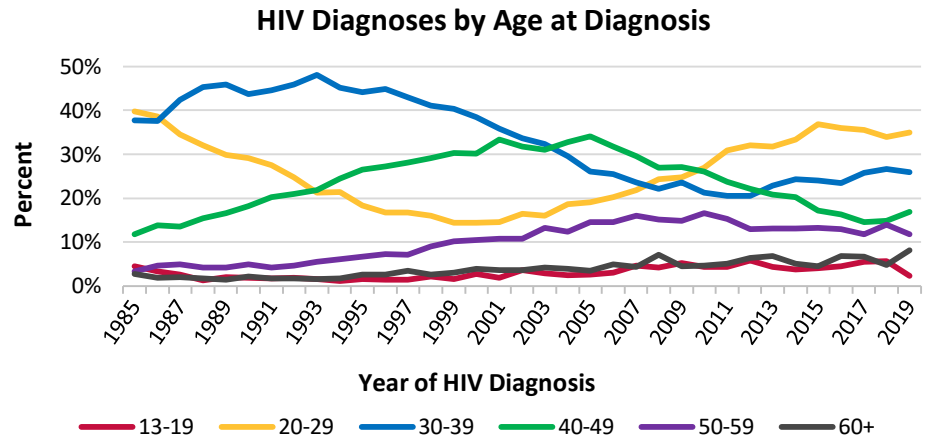


HIV BY AGE IN MARYLAND, 2019

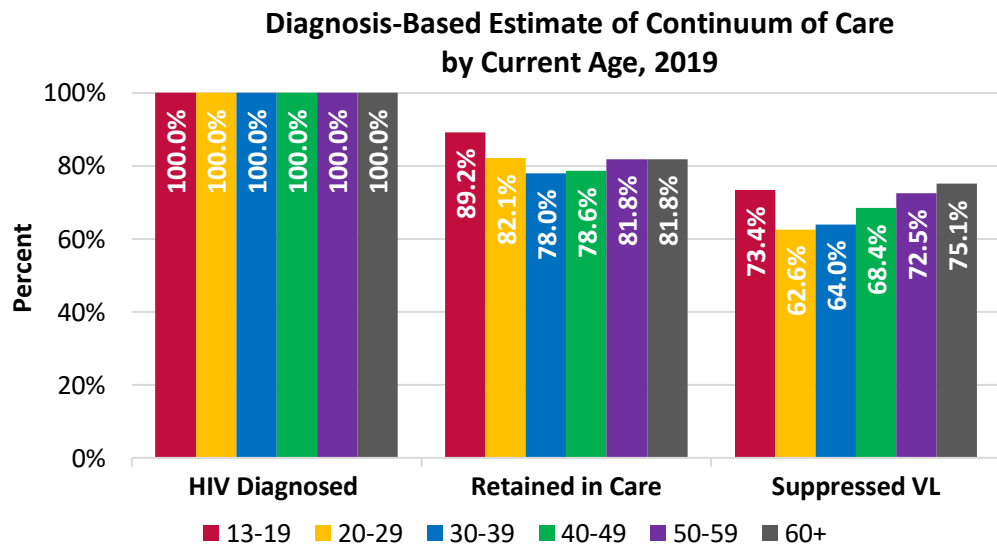

New HIV Diagnoses in Maryland

- Over half (60.9%) of the new HIV diagnoses in Maryland in 2019 were among adults ages 20-39.
- 22 of the 931 HIV diagnoses in Maryland were younger than 20 years old.
- The HIV diagnosis rate is highest among those aged 20-29 (41.5 per 100,000 people).
- 32.7% of HIV diagnoses among those aged 50-59 were diagnosed with AIDS within 3 months.



Characteristics of Marylanders Living with HIV



- Of the 31,630 people living with diagnosed HIV in Maryland in 2018 (all ages), 51.1% are 50+ years old.
- Rates of HIV were highest among those aged 50-59 (1,122.9 per 100,000), or 1 in 89 persons aged 50-59 years old have HIV.
- The average age of individuals living with HIV in Maryland is 49 years old.

- It is estimated that an additional 38.5% of persons aged 13-24 living with HIV in Maryland remain undiagnosed, as of 2018.
- Of the total HIV-diagnosed persons living in Maryland with a viral load test reported in 2019, viral suppression was lowest among persons currently aged 20-29 years old (77.7%).
