




HIV BY AGE IN MARYLAND, 2020

DATA REPORTED THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses in Maryland


- Over half (58.0%) of the new HIV diagnoses in Maryland in 2020 were among adults ages 20-39.
- 29 of the 724 HIV diagnoses in Maryland were younger than 20 years old.
- The HIV diagnosis rate is highest among those aged 20-29 (30.1 per 100,000 people).



- 35.6% of HIV diagnoses among those aged 50-59 were diagnosed with AIDS within 3 months.

Characteristics of Marylanders Living with HIV

Diagnosis-Based Estimate of Continuum of Care by Current Age, 2020



- Of the 31,676 people living with diagnosed HIV in Maryland in 2020 (all ages), 52.7% are 50+ years old.
- Rates of HIV were highest among those aged 50-59 (1,125.1 per 100,000), or 1 in 89 persons aged 50-59 years old have HIV.
- The average age of individuals living with HIV in Maryland is 49 years old.

- It is estimated that an additional 37.5% of persons aged 13-24 living with HIV in Maryland remain undiagnosed, as of 2019.
- Of the total HIV-diagnosed persons living in Maryland with a viral load test reported in 2020, viral suppression was lowest among persons currently aged 13-24 years old (41.7%).
