Measuring Progress

Percent of targeted change achieved:

The “percent of target changed achieved” used in NHAS represents the difference between the baseline and present value as a percent of the targeted change between the baseline value and NHAS target. This method provides a way to compare percent of targeted change achieved for each NHAS indicator and highlight areas that require additional focus.

$$\frac{\text{Annual result} - \text{Baseline result} \times 100}{\text{2025 target} - \text{Baseline result}}$$

Important Definitions

Linkage to Care	Reported CD4 or viral load test performed less than or equal to 1 month after their initial HIV diagnosis.
Viral Suppression	Recent viral load measured in the specified year of less than 200 copies per milliliter.
Knowledge of Status	An individual’s awareness of their HIV infection.
LGBTQ Supportive Policies	(1) having a Gay/Straight Alliance (GSA) or similar club, (2) identifying safe spaces, (3) prohibiting harassment based on sexual orientation or gender identity, (4) encouraging staff to attend professional development; (5) facilitating access to out-of-school health service providers, (6) facilitating access to out of school social and psychological service providers, and (7) providing LGBTQ-relevant curricula or supplementary materials.
MMSC	Male-to-Male Sexual Contact.
