Cancer Program Updates

The Baltimore County Department of Health Cancer Programs provide cancer screening, diagnosis, and treatment services. Baltimore County residents who meet program eligibility requirements and are recently diagnosed with colorectal, anal, and skin cancer may be eligible for financial assistance to pay for treatment services.

Qualified individuals will be required to complete a Medicaid application, if financially eligible, and/or an application for a Qualified Health Plan through the Maryland Health Connection during open enrollment routine screening and the HPV vaccination. periods. If uninsured, these services may be paid at the current Medicaid rate, with CRF grant funds, as funds allow.

Open Enrollment

If you enrolled in a Qualified Health Plan in 2014, and received tax subsidies or credits, you must reapply by December 18 to continue to receive financial assistance. Everyone who purchased a plan in 2014 is encouraged to shop and compare to make sure your 2015 coverage is right for you!

Cervical Health Awareness

January is cervical cancer awareness month, and according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, millions of women are still not being screened. Screening for cervical cancer can increase the probability of diagnosing cervical cancer at a more treatable stage.

In addition to being screened, talk with your physician about the HPV vaccination, which may lower your risk of developing cervical cancer. About 93% of cervical cancers could be prevented by

According to preventcancer.org, cancers such as breast, cervical, colorectal, lung, oral, skin, prostate, and testicular can be prevented through lifestyle changes along with early detection.

Research shows heredity is a small percent, but with adopting healthy lifestyle habits such as eating a balanced diet, staying active, and not smoking may help lower risk.



ABOUT THE COUNCIL

The Council acts on behalf of the Governor of Maryland to improve support services for unpaid, informal caregivers in the state of Maryland. During its 2001 session, the Maryland General Assembly enacted legislation to create the Maryland Caregivers Support Coordinating Council. The 17 Council members serve a three-year term and represent various state, public and private agencies that provide caregiver support services including the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Department of Aging, Department of Disabilities, Maryland Respite Care Coalition, two consumers of respite services, three family caregivers and advocates that have an interest or expertise in resources for the informal, family caregiver.

The Council advocates for individuals and families by providing a strong voice for the needs and goals of Maryland caregivers. The Council increases public awareness about the full range of caregiver needs and the support to address them, striving to attain barrier free systems. By facilitating and coordinating information, systems and people, the Council improves the lives of Maryland caregivers and their families.
