Presentation: Legislative Update Presentation

Jody Sheeley, Director for the Maryland Department of Health's Office of Support Services (OSS) presented information about the Maryland General Assembly's legislative session and the role of the OSS in supporting councils.

Presentation: GUIDE Model Overview

Halima Amjad, MD, PhD, MPH-Associate Professor of Medicine and Cynthia D. Fields, MD, Assistant Professor of Medicine at Johns Hopkins University presented information on the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare's Guiding an Improved Dementia Experience (GUIDE) model of care. The GUIDE model establishes a comprehensive and standardized set of services to support people with dementia and their families and caregivers. This model includes care coordination and respite care services.

State Alzheimer's Research Support (StARS)

Lauren Stratton, PhD, Director, Psychosocial Research and Program Evaluation for the Alzheimer's Association presented information about the State Alzheimer's Research Support (StARS) Center. The StARS center is an organization funded by the National Institute on Aging to assist states and organizations with examining and advancing the efficacy, accessibility, and affordability for dementia care services.

BOLD Implementation Plan Update

Raia Contractor, Evaluation Lead at the Maryland Department of Health's Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Control provided an informational update about the status of the BOLD grant.

Subcommittee Workgroups Update

- Goal 1: Public Awareness work group
 - Approved letter advocating for ADRD competency training for health professionals following the November Council meeting.
 - The subcommittee is setting up office hours during the Spring 2025 semester to provide information about what kinds of ADRD training professional schools should include in their curriculum.
- Goals 2 and 3: Enhanced ADRD Care and Coordination/Enhance/ Expand Supports for Caregivers
 - Gathering information relating to the efforts of the MD Department of Aging and MD access point.
- Goals 4 and 5: Advance ADRD Research and Enhance Data Capabilities
 - Continuing to build the state dementia dashboard. Data visualization is still in progress.
