Discussion of Open Positions on the Council

Workgroup Reports

Quality of Care

The subcommittee is still recruiting new members.

The Beacon Institute was successful in their grant application.

- Technically two separate grants including a federal grant from the Civil Liberties Penalties Fund
- The grants will fund the program in 10 nursing homes in Baltimore City and 2 in Charles County.
- The grants will fund the program in 17 Assisted Living facilities in Charles County.

The nursing home portion of the grant begins on August 31, 2016 (today).

- 1. Coordinator Recruiting
- 2. Purchasing licenses and recruiting facilities
- 3. Demonstrate the training effectiveness
- Originally it was intended to focus on smaller facilities but restrictions in the grant do not allow for this.

This training was developed in partnership with the Alzheimer's Association

There have not yet been long terms studies of this training.

Several other states are using the modules created in conjunction with this training.

Sampling of the module is available.

• Previously the Council had access to the training and this could be explored again if the Council is interested.

The pilot is scheduled to last for one year with pre- and post-measurement.
