1. Roll Call

Jessica Kiel took roll call. A quorum of the Diabetes Committee was present.

2. Approval of minutes from 10/16/2019 and 11/22/2019

Jessica Kiel requested approval of the October 16, 2019 (in-person) and the November 22, 2019 (interim phone call) committee meeting minutes. Dr. Vivienne Rose made a motion to approve the minutes and Pamela Xenakis seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.

3. Select New Committee Co-chairs

Jessica Kiel former co-chair for the Diabetes Committee recently volunteered to serve as Council Chair. With the co-chair of the Diabetes Committee now being vacant, the committee voted for new co-chairs. Dr. Vivien Rose and Pamela Xenakis were unanimously approved as committee co-chairs.

4. Guest Presentation - Chad Perman, Maryland Primary Care Program

Chad Perman with the Maryland Primary Care Program, presented on the Total Cost of Care Model. Maryland has entered into a Total Cost of Care All-Payer Model contract with the federal government that is designed to coordinate care for patients across both hospital and non-hospital settings, improve health outcomes, and constrain the growth of health care costs in Maryland. Highlights of the presentation included:

• A pilot program with Prince George's County was started with Chesapeake Regional Information System for our Patients (CRISP). CRISP is a regional health information

- exchange (HIE) serving Maryland and the District of Columbia. This pilot will test an e-referral tool between the county and surrounding healthcare practices
- CareFirst BlueCross BlueShield has joined the program as a payer and there are future plans to bring Maryland Medicaid in as a payer as well
- The program has open enrollment until 2023

The Diabetes Committee is interested in working with the Maryland Primary Care program and the practices in the program that serve pregnant and/or postpartum women. The goal is to close the gap between delivery and postpartum follow-up for those women who had a diagnosis of gestational diabetes since this population is at risk for developing type 2 diabetes once they deliver.

5. Open Discussion – Public Participation in Diabetes Committee Meetings

Kristi Pier opened the discussion about having public participation at the Diabetes Committee meetings. The committee showed a positive reaction to this idea and the topic will be discussed further on the next interim committee phone call.
