1. Please describe any recommendations made by your team for local action.

- Continue with distributing portable cribs through the Healthy Start Nurses, Family Support Center and BWMC Stork's Nest. Add an educational message and agreement provision to crib distribution program: Baby's crib is for baby only! Do not store anything in baby's crib.
- Continue with local hospital education (NICU, Nursery, OB/Delivery Nurses) and discharge instructions for infant safe sleep.
- Continue LHD safe sleep message and promote at all community events/health fairs, etc.
- Consider parental safe sleeping and no shaking pledges at hospitals for all newborns.
- Encourage parents to always lock doors and gates to backyard pools and closely observe children when they are in pools.
- Look for opportunities to collaborate with county permit office; home pool installation and pool cleaning and insurance companies to promote home pool safety to residents.
- Continue to support community mental health education programs for parents and teens.
- Explore additional data analysis from police reports related to suicide attempts.
- Explore additional data collection on suicide attempts from local emergency departments.
- Explore adding a "Texting" capability to a suicide hotline as another avenue for outreach and follow-up.

Please describe any actions taken by your jurisdiction that stem from your CFR activities. <i>Briefly highlight any special activities.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CFR member obtained a \$1000 grant from the Chaney Foundation to purchase 20 pack and plays from SIDS Mid-Atlantic for local crib distribution program with the Annapolis Family Support Center and DOH Healthy Start program. In addition to a pack and play given to each family, 2 crib sheets are given and an educational component/parental agreement done. • Nurses from the Department of Health provided parent education at various health fairs on SIDS/SUDI, safe sleeping and shaken baby syndrome prevention. • Students (siblings or close friends of infant/child death cases) received monitoring and counseling at their public schools. School Guidance Counselors/Psychologists provide bereavement/grief counseling. • The Department of Health and the County's Mental Health Agency are continuing to explore additional data collection on suicide attempts with local hospitals. • The Department of Health communicated with county medical providers about adolescent suicide issues in Spring 2011 newsletter http://www.aahealth.org/physicianslink/newsletter.asp?id=84

Begin to incorporate these messages in community and provider education sessions.• Continue to educate Baltimore City and Baltimore County providers on the importance of completing the Prenatal Risk Assessment (PRA) consistently and accurately.• Enroll women in evidence-based home visiting programs, allowing women to benefit from services such as case management, safe sleep education, free crib demonstrations, etc. Ensure programs are at capacity through communication at monthly Babystat meetings.• Design a Prevention Wednesday to highlight Bike Safety month. The Department of Health plans to incorporate this topic into a public safety campaign that is currently underway in public middle and high schools.

Please describe any actions taken by your jurisdiction that stem from your CFR activities. <i>Briefly highlight any special activities.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Department of Health developed a short slide show with voice-over to promote infant sleep safety practices. This was played for five weeks during winter of 2011 in local movie theatres for public outreach and education and was repeated in the fall of 2011. • Home visiting nurses of the Department of Health's Prenatal Enrichment and Bright Beginnings Programs expanded their teaching for new and expectant parents to include resources from CPSC regarding preventing tip-over hazards and crush injuries. On March 3, 2011 the Suicide Prevention Conference was held at the Clarion Fontainebleau Resort Hotel in Ocean City. There were 215 attendees at this conference. These events were well attended and made possible by partnerships with the Worcester County Health Department, Wicomico-Somerset Region CSA, Mid Shore Mental Health Systems, Salisbury University, NAMI MD Lower Shore, Lower Shore Friends, and other community organizations.</p>
