The Department of Health developed a short slide show with voice-over to promote infant sleep safety practices. This was played for five weeks during winter of 2011 in local movie theatres for public outreach and education and was repeated in the fall of 2011. Home visiting nurses of the Department of Health's Prenatal Enrichment and Bright Beginnings Programs expanded their teaching for new and expectant parents to include resources from CPSC regarding preventing tip-over hazards and crush injuries. The nurses also attended community health fairs to provide resources on home safety/injury prevention and safe sleeping. The Departments of Health, Police and EMS initiated a collaboration to monitor for trends in home births as well as complaints or reports of illegal practices regarding home births. The Department of Health provided technical assistance to two local hospitals regarding each hospital's plan to supply car safety information to parents of newborns. The local CFR Chair sent letters to the Director of Pediatrics of birth hospitals to educate new parents on safe sleeping practices for infants. The local CFR team collaborated with the Baltimore County Fatality Review team in developing a written guide and resource for family members who have experienced a loss due to domestic violence. The local CFR Chair provided technical assistance to medical experts in Los Angeles, CA. to aid them in developing a hospitalbas of shaking infants.

On March 3, 2011 the Suicide Prevention Conference was held at the Clarion Fontainebleau Resort Hotel in Ocean City. There were 215 attendees at this conference. These events were well attended and made possible by partnerships with the Worcester County Health Department , Wicomico-Somerset Region CSA, Mid Shore Mental Health Systems, Salisbury University, NAMI MD Lower Shore, Lower Shore Friends, and other community organizations.
