Dear Newborn Screening Specimen Provider,

As you are aware, newborn screening (NBS) specimens that are longer than 10 days in transit are considered unsatisfactory. We advise providers to ship specimens overnight to arrive at the main laboratory for testing within 24 hours of collection through use of a commercial carrier like Federal Express (FedEX) or United Postal Service (UPS). An alternative option which would help to expedite specimen transit is to use our regional public health laboratories located on the Eastern shore or in Western Maryland to drop your NBS specimens. A state courier goes daily to these laboratories on Monday through Friday, except for holidays, to retrieve specimens and delivers them to the main laboratory in Baltimore City. If you choose to use this option, here is the information you need to facilitate the specimen drop (see below). You may start to use this option beginning on Monday November 10, 2025.
