Congratulations on the birth of your baby!

The Maryland Department of Health's Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Program (MD EHDI) is required by law to ensure that all infants receive a newborn hearing screen and are referred for all appropriate follow-up care. For children who are deaf or hard of hearing, early intervention is crucial in promoting the normal development of language skills and in avoiding the language delays experienced by late-identified children.

Our office recently received a report that «PatientFirstName» has been identified as deaf or hard of hearing. «HeShe\_UC» is fortunate that you made sure «HeShe\_UC» was identified early enough to get the help she needs for early language development. It is important that your baby starts the process to develop language now.

Delays in exposure to language can lead to language deprivation, which could have lifelong impacts on your child's development. While there are many communication options for you and your child to consider later in life, it is critical that your child receives exposure to language immediately.

We want to be sure you know that there are a large number of places and people ready and able to assist you in helping your infant develop language.
