Activities to Reduce Exposure to Secondhand Smoke

The LHD provided materials to make smoke-free and vape-free posters in concert with the College of Southern Maryland's smoke-free campus policy change. The agency's cancer outreach worker provided secondhand smoke posters to medical offices in Charles County. Health departments have vinyl smoke-free campus policy banners on the porch and railings of public entrances.

Innovations

An innovative program at the LHD that had excellent community participation were the eight to ten minigrants given to community organizations in the fiscal year.

Accomplishments

The LHD created programs such as the Anti-Tobacco Advocate youth program and a cessation program. The cessation program developed trust within the community to come back after a relapse. The LHD also implemented an anti-vaping movie theater campaign, mini-grants to community organizations, and school-based education.

Most Effective Program⁽¹⁾

The LHD's most effective program was the Tobacco & Cancer Coalition which highlighted funded subvendor projects. The LHD also had a cessation program which was a valuable resource for smokers who wanted to quit.
