Dana Moncrief

a. Overview of HB837

- i. Required a baseline study
 - ii. Established Cannabis Public Health Fund
 1. Administered by MDH
 2. Supported by tax revenue (adult-use only)
 - a. 50 percent to state general fund
 - b. Of remaining 50 percent, 5 percent goes to the Fund
 3. Funds may be used for supporting the Council and other public health activities
 - iii. Established Public Health Advisory Council
 1. Study the public health impact of adult-use cannabis legalization
 2. Focus on youth prevention and treatment
 3. Structure
 - a. General Health Article §13-4501 through §13-4506
 - b. Consists of 17 members (10 Governor-appointed)
 - c. Led by Chair elected by members of the Council
 - d. May establish workgroups
 - e. MDH to provide staff support and technical assistance
 4. Term Limits
 - a. Began Jan 1, 2023
 - b. 4-year term limit (staggered)
 - c. Member cannot serve more than two full consecutive terms
 5. Disclosures and Expenses
 - a. Members must submit financial disclosure forms
 - b. May not receive compensation as a member
 - c. Entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses
 6. Council Duties
 - a. Study the public health impact of adult-use cannabis legalization in Maryland
 - b. Recommend best practices
 - c. Make additional recommendations
 - d. Submit annual report by Dec 1
 7. Workgroups are TBD and optional
 8. Meetings
 - a. Subject to the Maryland Open Meetings Act
 - b. Must meet at least four times per year
 - c. Requires a majority of members (quorum) to vote
 - d. Includes workgroup updates
- b. Council Member Roles/Expectations
 - i. Roles and Contributions
 1. Actively participate in meetings
 2. Review and contribute to documents in a timely manner
 3. Attendance
 - a. 75 percent of Council meetings

- b. 50 percent of workgroup meetings (as needed)
 - ii. Time Commitment
 - 1. 2-4 hours per month plus Council and Workgroup meetings
 - 2. Council start-up may require more time upfront
 - 3. Council chair anticipate 5-6 hours/month plus meetings
 - 4. Suggestions
 - a. Monthly meetings through December
 - b. 2 hour meetings
 - c. Location is TBD (virtual, in-person, hybrid)
 - iii. Open Meetings Act
 - 1. Council will approve minutes at the next meeting
 - 2. MDH staff and Council Chair are required to receiving OMA training; highly encouraged for other Council members
 - iv. Participation in Legislative Session
 - 1. Dana to get clarification on Council members participating during the legislative session (i.e., testifying, written testimony, etc.)
 - 2. Per Senator Kramer and Delegate Hill, can identify that you are participating in your individual capacity or on behalf of the Council
 - 3. DLS (Erin Hopwood) concurs Delegate Hill
 - v. Contact Dana Moncrief or Council Chair to add items to the meeting agenda
- c. State Public Health Actions
 - i. MDH Efforts
 - 1. Expanding infrastructure
 - 2. Media communications and outreach materials
 - 3. Establishing a technical assistance center
 - 4. Determining resources needed for local support
 - 5. Enforce the Clean Indoor Air Act
 - 6. Provide guidance and treatment support
 - ii. Publicly available fact sheets and other materials from the Maryland Cannabis Administration
 - 1. Public awareness campaign
 - 2. Responsible Use Toolkit
 - 3. Point-Of-Sale Toolkit

 - iii. Maryland Cannabis Administration also tests and approves products
