What is I-Smile? Why I-Smile?




I-Smile coordinators are located within 23 public or private non-profit organizations around the state

Coordinators are responsible for:

- Developing referral networks with local dentists
- Developing community partnerships
- Participating in community health planning and needs assessments
- Linking with local boards of health
- Providing trainings to health care providers
- Ensuring dental care coordination services are provided
- Ensuring screenings, risk assessments and gapfilling preventive services are provided to children


I-Smile Dental Home Program

- Target Population: Iowans age 60 and older who are
 - Residents of nursing facilities,
 - Clients of the Medicaid Elderly Waiver Program,
 - Receiving home and community-based services (including nursing visits and assistance with activities of daily living), and
 - Living in Scott and Lee Counties (and eventually Van Buren County)
 - AND: Direct caregivers, families, nursing facility staff, Medicaid Elderly Waiver case managers, the public

Develop community-based systems that improve the ability of Iowans ≥ age 6o to prevent dental disease, access oral health care,

and maintain overall health

How





Strategies

- Assess community needs, assets, and oral health status of older lowans
- Build partnerships: Area Agency on Aging, dentists, nursing facilities, home health organizations, medical providers, community organizations, and businesses that serve older lowans
- Develop dental referral network(s) and provide care coordination to facilitate access to treatment



Strategies

- Provide training and education opportunities for dental and medical professionals and direct care workforce
- Promote oral health (and educate the public)
- Assure provision of preventive dental services within nursing facilities





What Are the I-Smile Silver Coordinators Doing?

Participating in community meetings and workgroups (Dentist Recruitment Task Force, Senior Advocacy Voices and Issues, Quad City Health Alliance, UnityPoint Health Partners: Senior Services Administration, Southeast Iowa Longterm Care Consortium)

Developing relationships with Nursing Facility staff

Coordinating with the Area Agency on Aging on referrals, staff education, and developing action plans

Presenting for community groups and organizations (Local Boards of Health, Lions Club, Chamber of Commerce, parish nurses, UnityPoint Health management, Foster Grandparents)

Participating in community events (Health fairs, Senior Day at the county fair, Salute to Seniors, Senior Olympics, Senior Health Expo)

Oral Health Promotion

- Newspaper articles
- Newspaper advertisements
- Congregate Meals displays
- Tray covers at local restaurants
- Education materials with pharmacy prescriptions
- Billboards
- Radio shows
- ID Badge holders for direct care workers
- Bingo daubers



What Are the I-Smile Silver Coordinators Doing?

Providing care coordination services to facilitate older lowans' access to dental care

- Identifying payment sources
- Working with dental offices to take referrals
- Linking with Donated Dental Services and SHIIP coordinators
- ✓ Area Agency on Aging Most frequent source of referrals
- ✓ Lack of payment most frequently reported barrier to care
- ✓ On average, 24 minutes spent on care coordination per person assisted



What Are the I-Smile Silver Coordinators Doing?

Self Report Surveillance

- 33% feel the condition of his/her mouth is fair or poor
- Just 48% have seen a dentist in the past year
- 1 in 5 report needing dental care in the past year but not getting it due to an inability to pay for it

Open Mouth Surveillance

- 26% are edentulous
- 30% have untreated decay
- 42% had some type of treatment need




November 2014-2016

- DDIAF funding received by the Iowa Department of Public Health
- Funding contracted to Lee and Scott County Health Departments

November 2016-2018

- DDIAF funding received by the Iowa Department of Public Health to continue pilot project for two years – contracts with Lee (Van Buren, Des Moines) and Scott County Health Departments
- HRSA funding received by IDPH to expand pilot project to NW lowa – contract with Webster (Calhoun, Hamilton, Humboldt, Pocahontas, Webster, Wright) County Health Department
- HRSA funding to pay for preventive services provided by dental hygienists to residents in nursing facilities in the pilot project sites

I-Smile™ Silver - 2017-2018





Future

- Provide preventive services within nursing facilities
- Use silver diamine fluoride
- Increase focus on oral health link to medical/hospital costs
- Incorporate oral health within ACO structures
- Consider expansion and sustainability
