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Maryland Department of Health - Tap Water Consumption Survey

Survey Methodology*

A total of 1,004 residents were surveyed using an online survey panel. A survey of this size yields a margin of error of +/-3%, with a confidence level of 95%. Surveys were offered in English (99%) and Spanish (1%) languages. Security measures precluded individuals from completing the survey more than once.

The sample was recruited and balanced to match the demographic characteristics of Maryland residents.

Literature Review

Recent pushes towards reduction in child and adult obesity rates have led to an increase in consumption of plain water over alternatives such as sugar-sweetened beverages (SSBs). Plain water includes tap water, water from fountains and water coolers, and bottled water (An & McCaffrey, 2016). However, while plain water consumption, in general, has been increasing, the growth in tap water consumption has not been equivalent. From 2011-2016, results from the National Health Nutrition and Examination Survey (NHNES) indicate a 20.65% increase in bottled water consumption, but only an 8.86% growth in tap water consumption over the same period (Vieux, 2020). Data suggests that adults who avoid tap water drink less plain water in general, but significantly more bottled water and SSBs (Rosinger, 2022). While Americans are turning to water as a healthier alternative, consumption of other beverages such as coffee (57%), soft drinks (56%), juices (50%), and energy drinks (27%) are still prevalent (Buchholz, 2023).

Plain water consumption varies depending on the nature of the sample; the average water consumption is about 44 ounces of plain water per day (CDC, 2022), and about two-thirds of consumption occurs at home (Sebastian et al., 2011). There are, however, strong demographic influences on water consumption. Black and Hispanic adults typically consume less plain water than non-Hispanic White adults (Vieux et al., 2020). Plain water consumption is also lower in older adults, lower income, and lower education individuals (CDC, 2022).

Plain water consumption varies between tap water and bottled water. The American Water Works Association (2023) reported that 32% of adults never drink water from their faucet as opposed to only 7% who never drink bottled water. Daily tap water consumption is approximately 40% among adults and 47% for daily bottled water consumption. Tap water consumption over bottled water is typically higher among NH White adults, higher income, and higher educated individuals (Brooks et al., 2017; Vieux et al., 2020).

The difference in tap versus bottled water consumption seems to be driven largely by trust rather than economic factors. Those who perceive bottled water as safer are less likely to consume tap water (Colburn & Kavouras, 2021). Public trust in tap water safety continually gets challenged by studies and water crises across the nation. Tap water avoidance was declining before the catastrophic Flint Water Crisis, but started to increase again, particularly for children, in the years to follow. Compared to before the Flint crisis, avoidance of tap water among adults increased by 40% and 63% among children (Rosinger, 2021). The Environmental Working Group Tap Water Database, a resource for individuals to search for their water quality, conducted a survey among visitors to the site and found that 40% of visitors won't or can't drink water from the tap (Stoiber, 2022). Further, those who do not trust the safety of their tap water in one study were more than 4.8 times more likely to use bottled water as their primary source of plain water (Hu, Morton, & Mahler, 2011).

It is not surprising that there is concern over tap water safety given the crises and regular releases to the public about water quality studies nationally and locally. For example, a recent publicly released study by the United States Geological Survey (2023) indicated that nearly half of the tap water in the country may contain at least one type of monitored PFA (per and poly-fluoroalkyl substances). PFAs are long-lasting chemicals in the environment that are associated with harmful health effects in humans and animals (Environmental Protection Agency, 2023). One study found that public awareness of violations of the Safe Water Health Act is associated with a 14% increase on average in bottled water sales, and these sales remain elevated after the violation occurred (Allaire et al., 2019). It, therefore, <u>appears to be a challenge to maintain public trust both during and following a water crisis, even a minor water boiling advisory for a local municipality.</u>

There is, however, variation among groups in trust in tap water. A sponsored study by the American Water Works Association (2023), found that 71% of adults with a public water supply rated their water as safe. Safety evaluations vary by sample and demographic characteristics. <u>Non-Hispanic White adults tend to feel</u> <u>safer drinking tap water than Hispanic and Black adults</u> (AWWA, 2023; Javidi & Pierce, 2018). These findings are consistent across multiple studies and may reflect a general distrust of public health and government or negative experiences with water sources in the past among these populations (Colburn &

Kavouras, 2021; Patel et al., 2020). There is some evidence that men are more trusting of tap water as well, though not as consistent and pervasive as racial and ethnic differences (AWWA, 2023).

Much like plain water consumption in general, evaluations of the safety of tap water have a positive relationship with income (AWWA, 2023) and education, but foreign-born individuals' distrust of tap water is higher (Patel et al., 2020).

<u>Some of the variations in tap water trust may be explained by geographic location</u>. As water quality, taste, smell, and appearance can vary significantly by municipality it is not surprising that tap water safety has significant variations. <u>One nationwide study found that adults in southern regions reported lower perceptions of tap water safety than those in the northeast</u> (AWWA, 2023). <u>Probolsky Research through multiple studies on tap water evaluations has found that qualities such as taste, smell, color, or residue can significantly impact perceptions of safety and willingness to drink tap water.</u> Taste specifically has been found to be correlated with perceptions of tap water safety (Colburn & Kavouras, 2021). However, the prevalence and popularity of water filtration, which has steadily climbed to 77% (73% in 2020) may be a way to combat this (Carollo, 2022). The water purifier market size was \$5.39 billion and is projected to reach \$9.10 billion by 2029 (Fortune Business Insights, 2022).

Interestingly, there may be a relationship between perceptions of tap water safety and communication with water utilities as an AWWA (2023) found that those who had received communication from their water utility were more than three times as likely to evaluate the safety of their water as better over a five-year period. There appears to be a relationship between utilities communicating about water testing and safety and the public's overall perception. An informed public may be more trusting when they understand the rigorous testing that public water sources are subject to. Probolsky Research found in one study that 36% of respondents were less likely to drink bottled water in the future knowing that it is often rebottled tap water and 48% were less likely to buy bottled water knowing it is less regulated than tap water. When informed about rigorous testing that public water sources undergo for tap water, 58% were more confident in the water quality. Households who receive more communication from their water companies about their water quality are more likely to be satisfied with their home's water quality (US Department of Housing and Urban Development, 2022). In general, the public seems to be unaware of the safety procedures and processes of public water systems. One study found that nearly 50% of adults were not able to identify what entity (Environmental Protection Agency) was responsible for protecting and regulating tap water (Stoiber, 2022).

Resistance to tap water may also stem in part from the convenience factor of bottled water because it is readily portable and available for purchase in many locations. For Latinx populations, there is a strong preference for bottled water convenience, regardless of the economic burden (Colburn & Kavouras, 2021). The significant cost of bottled water does not seem to be a significant deterrent to consumption as there is an inverse relationship between tap water consumption and income. Reusable water bottles are growing in popularity as US consumers are becoming more environmentally focused in their everyday behaviors. Data shows that approximately 60% of US adults own a reusable water bottle and the industry of reusable water bottles is expected to grow to a 12.61-billion-dollar industry by 2030 (Ruiz, 2023). We must interpret this with caution as bottled water consumption has massively grown over time (Ridder, 2023). The presence of a reusable water bottle does not necessarily equate to tap water consumption as consumers may be refilling their bottles from purchased water from larger gallon(s) containers. The environmental factors associated with bottled water may be an opportunity to increase tap water consumption.

When it comes to concerns about fluoridation, specifically in public water systems, there is a long history of controversy and debate (Schwarcz, 2017). Organizations like the Fluoride Action Network (Connett, 2012) exist for the purpose of discounting the necessity and safety of water fluoridation. Concerns about risk of cancer (Jones, 2022), lower intelligence (Weeks, 2019), and government conspiracies to dispose of toxic materials (Schwarcz, 2017) have been longstanding and pervasive throughout the history of public water fluoridation in the United States. Perceived harms of water fluoridation include general concerns about chemicals in the body, dangerous effects on the body, side effects, dental fluorosis, behavioral and cognitive disorder development such as ADHD or autism, skeletal fluorosis and arthritis, cancer, and damage to the neurological, immune, digestive, circulatory, or respiratory system (Podgorny & McLaren, 2015). While these negative opinions may not be pervasive, data suggests that 32% of the population is

<u>unsure if community water fluoridation is safe</u> (Mork & Griffin, 2015). Interestingly, however, many of the studies pertaining to fluoride perceptions among the public have been conducted on samples outside of the United States such as Canada, Australia, and South Korea. When searching for water fluoridation, users will find a plethora of conflicting and mixed findings on its safety making it a confusing public health concern to navigate for the average American as nearly 9 out of 10 adults struggle with health literacy (National Library of Medicine, 2023).

The concerns about chemicals in the water may stem beyond fluoride, but instead, there are larger concerns about lead, chlorine and chloramines, bacteria and viruses, and pesticides/herbicides (Carollo, 2022).

In consideration of gaining buy-in from the public on community water fluoridation, studies have been limited. One study demonstrated that messaging that focused on oral health benefits such as prevention of cavities and oral health cost savings was effective in supporting fluoridation, but personal beliefs and family/physician recommendations were also predictive of support (Kemp et al., 2021). Some evidence suggests that when provided evidence that fluoridated water is safe to drink, many will do so, provided that the taste, appearance, and smell are satisfactory (Scherzer et al., 2013). There is overall more evidence and research needed to assess how Americans today view fluoridated water and how that is affecting their tap water consumption.

From this literature review, we draw the following general conclusions that will inform our survey development:

- Consumption of tap water and bottled water consumption varies by race/ethnicity, income, and education, but more is needed to understand these differences in the state of Maryland specifically and what may be driving those differences.
- Tap water consumption appears to be largely driven by perceptions of safety and further testing on perceptions of water safety and what messages can overcome those concerns is needed.
- Perceptions of water fluoridation have been understudied in the United States and further research is needed to understand how pervasive distrust is and what messaging can overcome this distrust.
- Environmental and cost factors may be a way to reach audiences, particularly younger audiences who have less disposable income and are more environmentally conscious.
- The barrier to persuading the public that tap water is safe may not be in fluoride but in other substances such as lead, chlorine, and bacteria.

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Study Insights

Tap Water Consumption

The results of the survey largely support what was indicated in our literature review. Overall, water represents a significant portion of overall beverage consumption for most Maryland residents. This is reflective of a general societal trend towards reduced consumption of sugar-sweetened beverages. This presents an advantage to the Maryland Department of Health – Office of Oral Health (OOH) as most residents do not need to be convinced to switch from other beverages to water. Instead, the focus of future campaigns can center on tap water consumption specifically.

Tap water consumption among residents presents a challenge to overcome but does not present among our sample to be a massive public health crisis. Just over half of residents report drinking tap water from their home at least daily and 80% report using their tap water to regularly make other beverages such as coffee or juice. Relatively equal to the amount of daily tap water consumption is daily bottled water consumption. It may be the case that residents are using both bottled and tap water, though there is certainly evidence that some are exclusively bottled water drinkers. Bottled water consumption may be high among tap water drinkers for its convenience and accessibility outside of the home.

Concern over the safety of tap water remains the most significant barrier for OOH to address to increase tap water consumption. Among those who drank tap water less than weekly, lack of trust was the top reason (54%). Among those who prefer bottled water, 71% cited that it was because of a personal perception that bottled water is safer than tap water. While it is generally true that tap water has more restrictions and accountability on regulations and safety testing than bottled water, only 20% of residents correctly identified this. A majority (53%) also believed that bottled water is safer than their home's tap water.

In general, a majority of residents are satisfied with the quality of their tap water. This satisfaction is higher among residents who are older, male, Asian/Pacific Islander, and White. We also see that as household income increases so does satisfaction with water quality. We see a similar trend as education increases. Most residents do not believe their tap water is unsafe to drink, with 25% agreeing that their water is unsafe. As with most questions across the survey, this trend was more pronounced among younger, Black/Hispanic, lower-income, and less educated residents. There is, however, a level of concern about tap water safety as well as uncertainty surrounding what tap water may contain and if it is truly safe for consumption.

In an open-ended question asking what would make respondents more confident and likely to drink tap water most of the responses tie into safety. Residents want to see testing and safety reports for their water, they want assurances from health organizations, safety guarantees, increased transparency, and regulations. Most of these responses can be boiled down to informing and persuading residents that tap water is indeed safe for consumption.

Demographic Trends

There were several groups where tap water consumption was lower and concerns surrounding tap water were stronger. These groups align with the findings of the literature review.

In general, tap water consumption, mistrust in tap water, and trust in community water fluoridation are lower among Black, Hispanic/Latino, and Multiracial residents. We see these same trends occurring in lower-income households, less educated residents, and residents who are younger. To some extent, we also see this with individuals who are foreign-born as well. This may be due to beliefs about water stemming from their native country.

Community Water Fluoridation

Community water fluoridation is the central focus of OOH's initiative to increase tap water consumption. Many residents (73%) were aware of community water fluoridation; this awareness was higher among residents who were older, White, of higher household income, and homeowners. There is larger support or uncertainty about community water fluoridation than dissent. Only 19% of residents disagreed that fluoridated tap water is safe to drink and only 20% agreed that they would not drink fluoridated tap water. Fluoride was infrequently mentioned in open-ended responses as a major concern of contaminant. There is, however, a little more concern about whether water fluoridation is unhealthy as 34% agreed that they were afraid that it might be unhealthy (32% neither agreed nor disagreed). There seems to be some distinction made for some residents between *safety* and *health* when it comes to community water fluoridation. It will be important to not just communicate about the safety of water fluoridation but also that

there are no adverse health effects as the public has been faced with conflicting information about fluoride and its effects.

What remains an additional opportunity for education about water fluoridation is the oral health benefits. When asked if they agreed that drinking fluoridated water prevents cavities, only 43% agreed with another 36% who neither agreed nor disagreed. Interestingly, cavity prevention benefits did not vary by dental insurance coverage or frequency of dental cleanings. This suggests that dental professionals or dental insurance companies may not be discussing the oral health benefits of water fluoridation with patients. Further, most fluoride education messaging is focused on children as they benefit the most from fluoride exposure. However, residents with children in the home were less likely to agree with these statements. Fluoride treatments are typically recommended only for children; dental insurance companies often only cover fluoride treatments for children and cutoff coverage sometime between the ages of 12-18. This may suggest to residents that fluoride does not have oral health benefits for adults, and this is an important piece of messaging for encouraging regular tap water consumption.

Message Testing

Several messages were tested to determine their influence on residents' likelihood of drinking tap water over bottled water. Among the full sample, the top three performing messages were:

Message 1: "Maryland water systems meet all federal and state standards for water quality. This includes the testing for harmful contaminants including lead, copper, fecal coliform bacteria, e. coli bacteria, and many others."

Message 2: "Some studies have found that bottled water can cost an average household about 2,000 times more than tap water."

Message 3: "Drinking fluoridated tap water is recommended by nearly all public health, medical, and dental health organizations because it keeps teeth strong and reduces cavities by about 25% in both children and adults with no adverse health effects."

The most effective message (57%) overall was Message 1, informing residents that Maryland water meets water quality standards and tests for harmful contaminants. This message was the strongest of the messages tested for the groups where an increase in tap water consumption has the greatest need as well including residents who are younger, Black, Latino, less educated, and have lower household income. Given the high concerns about the safety of tap water, particularly among these groups, it is unsurprising that assurances of testing and safety standards were of high resonance.

The second most effective message, Message 2 (54%), pertained to the cost differential between bottled and tap water. Our literature review revealed that among low-income households bottled water consumption is higher despite the increased cost. The mistrust in tap water felt by these residents is more powerful than the cost savings associated with drinking tap water over bottled water. This message did have a strong resonance with low-income households, however, perhaps because pointing out the significant cost difference was enough to put into more concrete terms how much bottled water increased their costs. This message did resonate with Black, Latino, and young individuals as well, though not as strongly as some of the other messages. For example, for young (18-29) or Black residents, message 3 pertaining to health benefits was more powerful (by a small margin).

The third most effective message, Message 3 (51%) resonated across most audiences. The assurances of both safety because of recommendations by health organizations coupled with the oral health benefits resonated strongly across the different groups, including those who are more hesitant about drinking tap water. This aligns with other questions in the survey that assurances by health organizations are important to residents.

Opportunities

The top priority for OOH to increase tap water consumption among residents is to primarily educate and convince residents that tap water is safe to drink. This will come with increased transparency and communication from health organizations, such as the Maryland Department of Health, and frequent information about testing and safety from water providers. Residents need the assurance of safety on a consistent and regular basis. Given the low readership of Annual Water Quality reports, this is not enough to persuade residents that their tap water is safe.

Home water filters are an opportunity for OOH to address many concerns of residents with their tap water quality. Currently, about half of residents use some kind of filter for their tap water, most commonly through a pitcher or as part of their refrigerator. In an open-ended question about what would make residents more confident in and likely to drink their tap water, 8% said that having a filter would increase their likelihood. While a small percentage, for most residents, safety is the driving force behind skepticism of tap water consumption. Filters are an opportunity to increase tap water consumption because 69% agreed that using a filter for their tap water would make it safer (an additional 23% neither agreed nor disagreed). This is a large proportion of the population that may be convinced with messaging educating on the efficacy of filters in improving the safety and cleanliness of tap water. Additionally, taste is a significant reason why some residents will not drink their tap water. Among open-ended responses, 9% indicated that an improvement in their tap water taste would increase their likelihood of drinking it. Additionally, among those who were unsatisfied with their home's water quality, 67% indicated that taste was one of the reasons. Filters are an opportunity to address this concern as 58% agreed that using a filter for their tap water would make it taste better, with an additional 31% who neither agreed nor disagreed. As a low-cost option, particularly when compared to the cost of exclusive bottled water consumption, promoting the safety and taste benefits of water filters for households is a potential avenue for tap water consumption increases.

Given the lack of knowledge of the oral health benefits of community water fluoridation, even among those who regularly visit the dentist, OOH messaging should focus on getting this message out. This may include campaigns directly from OOH, but also by engaging oral health professionals such as dentists and dental hygienists to encourage discussion with patients about the benefits of fluoridated tap water.

The data suggest that this three-pronged strategy may be effective in increasing tap water consumption among Maryland residents. Future communications strategies should accomplish the following goals:

- Educating and assuring the public of tap water safety through frequent communication and health expert endorsements
- Informing residents of the benefits of tap water consumption through education campaigns and engagement with oral health professionals
- Providing solutions for concerns beyond assurances such as the use of filters for ensuring safety and improved water quality/taste

Questions Raised from the Research

- Is mistrust in tap water and concerns over safety stronger in Maryland because of the proximity and salience of recent public water safety events? How would these results compare nationwide or to a state such as Michigan where water safety is top-of-mind?
- What information would be persuasive for overcoming fluoride skepticism, particularly for those who are not strongly for or against community water fluoridation? What is the distinction between fluoride safety and fluoride healthiness and what messages would be effective in combating misinformation for both?
- Are dentists/hygienists sharing information about the benefits of fluoride with patients? What are dental professionals' opinions of tap water, its safety, and community water fluoridation? Do they

have any reservations about discussing fluoride benefits with patients given the controversy for some individuals?

• Will water quality reports from agencies help or hurt trust? Do residents, in general, have the knowledge to appropriately evaluate these reports for safety? Overcoming low-education residents' skepticism of tap water safety is a key challenge that the data suggests, but will providing them with this information only confuse or push them further towards distrust because of an inability to understand the complex relationship between chemicals and water and safety?


KEY FINDINGS

- Maryland residents are consuming water, reflective of societal trends of reduced sugar-sweetened beverage consumption. More than half report drinking tap water at least daily and 80% report using it to make other beverages such as coffee or juice.
- Among those not consistently drinking tap water, an overall lack of trust in its safety was a consistent theme along with perceptions of (or uncertainty of) bottled water as safer than tap water. One in four residents believed that their home's tap water was unsafe to drink. Among those concerned about tap water safety, bacteria/viruses (65%), chlorine/chloramines (54%), and lead (52%) were the top contaminant concerns.
- 3. A strong majority of residents are aware of community water fluoridation (73%) and about half think that fluoridated water is safe to drink, another one-third are unsure of its safety. Only 43% agreed that community water fluoridation provided oral health benefits.
- 4. The most effective messaging strategies overall were Maryland's compliance with water quality regulations (57%), cost comparisons to bottled water (54%), and oral health benefits (51%), though there are differences by demographics on messaging effectiveness.
- 5. Residents **crave more information about their water's safety** and would most trust information from state, local, or public health agencies through website postings and mailed fact sheets.
- 6. Overall distrust in tap water and unwillingness to drink it is consistently higher among residents who are Black, Latino/Hispanic, or multiracial, low-income, and less-educated.










Q10: Approximately what percentage of your water consumption is tap water?


































% who are concerned about chemicals in tap water







































Community water fluoridation awareness is lower among residents who are younger, Black, Latino/Hispanic, or lower-income




































State, local, or public health agencies are the most trusted sources for tap water safety information

State, local, or public health agencies are the most trusted sources for household tap water benefits information



Demographics: Household Income, Home Type, Likely HPSA








