

# **Community Health Worker Program**

## Office of Population Health Improvement

### **Community Health Worker Background:**

A community health worker (CHW) is a frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of, or has an unusually close understanding of the community served. This trusting relationship enables a CHW to serve as a liaison to, link to, or intermediary between health and social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery.

The <u>Community Health Worker Act</u> (Health-General Article §§ 13-3701-3709) and supporting regulations, <u>COMAR 10.68.01</u> and <u>COMAR 10.68.02</u>, guide the processes to certify individual CHWs and accredit CHW certification training programs, respectively. The <u>CHW Program</u> manages these voluntary processes which are based on the nine <u>Maryland CHW core</u> competencies:

- 1. Advocacy and community capacity building skills
- 2. Effective oral and written communication skills
- 3. Cultural competency
- 4. Understanding of ethics and confidentiality issues
- 5. Knowledge of local resources and system navigation
- 6. Care coordination support skills
- 7. Teaching skills to promote health behavior change
- 8. Outreach methods and strategies
- 9. Understanding of public health concepts and health literacy

#### **Community Health Worker Certification:**

Individuals may apply at any time for CHW certification which is based on the completion of an <u>accredited CHW certification training program</u>. A CHW certificate is effective for two years. Twenty hours of professional development are required to renew a CHW certificate. More information on CHW certificate renewal can be found <u>here</u>. ### **Community Health Worker Training Program Accreditation:**

CHW training programs may apply for accreditation at any time. Accreditation includes the provision of a minimum of 100 hours of instruction which employ a curriculum framework based on the Maryland nine CHW core competencies and an additional 40 hour supervised practicum. #### **State Community Health Worker Advisory Committee:**

The State CHW Advisory Committee includes 18 members appointed by the Governor. Nine of the Committee members (50%) are CHWs. The Committee meets quarterly to advise the Department on the CHW certification and training program accreditation processes and implementation.
