

How to Code for Depo Provera Services

Effective January 1, 2013, injection administration of medroxyprogesterone acetate (Depo-Provera) should be reported using HCPCS code **J1050** (Injection, medroxyprogesterone acetate, 1 mg).

Due to the change in dosage from the discontinued codes, when reporting code **J1050**, the appropriate dosage (measured in units) should be reported based on the specific needs of the patient.

- Report the injection administration in addition to CPT code **96372** (Therapeutic, prophylactic, or diagnostic injection (specify substance or drug); subcutaneous or intramuscular).
- However, per CPT, it is not appropriate to report injection administration code **96372** without direct physician or other qualified health care professional supervision, unless administered in a hospital setting. In that case, report instead, code **99211** (Office or other outpatient visit for the evaluation and management of an established patient, that may not require the presence of a physician or other qualified health care professional), if applicable.
