

The **Maryland Department of Health** (MDH) proposal for CMS' Rural Health Transformation Program will enable our state to strengthen and improve the health and well-being of our rural residents. The submission reflects significant feedback from rural Marylanders and State partners, provided through numerous community listening sessions and an open request for information.

Maryland's proposal details three areas of transformation to significantly impact rural health. Each area requests funding for two categories: immediate impact funds - meant for shovel-ready activities - and transformation funds - which involve competitive opportunities for funding and require longer-term planning. The budget assumes CMS awards maximum funds, a total of \$1 billion dollars over five years. All projects and programs are subject to CMS approval. If awarded, MDH will closely partner with other state agencies and rural stakeholders to shape, implement and evaluate program strategies.
