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1 Minimum Qualifications

The Bidder must provide proof with its Bid that the following Minimum Qualifications have been met:

- 1.1.1 Experience: The Bidder shall have a minimum of one (1) year of experience providing Data Entry Services with 100% key verification of a minimum average of 10,000 records per week. The Bidder shall provide at least one reference that can attest to this minimum qualification as described in Section 5.5.4 and 5.5.7
- 1.1.2 Staffing: The Bidder shall provide proof of qualified Data Entry staff adequate to process the typical volume of work within the timelines required under this solicitation as noted in the Scope of Work (at least 20 qualified staff). Bidders shall identify the number and type of staff in the Bid Submission Requirements section.
- 1.1.3 Location: The Bidder place of work shall be no greater than 250 road miles from MHD Headquarters in Baltimore to allow staff to meet the pick-up, delivery, and data processing schedule required under this solicitation.

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2 Contractor Requirements: Scope of Work

2.1 Summary Statement

- 2.1.1 The Maryland Department of Health (MDH or the "Department") is issuing this Multi-Step Invitation for Bids (MS-IFB) in order to procure the services defined in this Section 2, as specified in this MS-IFB, from a contract between the successful bidder(s) and the Maryland Department of Health: MDH is issuing this solicitation to obtain Data encoding and 100% key verification services. MDH-generated 60,000 Documents per month on average. The documents being data entered are federal forms for medical claims. The Contractor will provide these services for Breast and Cervical Cancer Diagnosis and Treatment (BCCDT), Kidney Disease (KDP), Children’s Medical Services, Preadmission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR), and Medicaid Programs. See Section 2.2 for a breakdown of average monthly forms.
- 2.1.2 It is the State’s intention to obtain goods and services, as specified in this MS-IFB, from a Contract between the selected Bidder and the State.
- 2.1.3 The Department intends to make a single award for the work under this MS-IFB. See MS-IFB **Section 4.9 Award Basis** for more Contract award information.
- 2.1.4 A Bidder, either directly or through its subcontractor(s), must be able to provide all goods and services and meet all of the requirements requested in this solicitation and the successful Bidder (the Contractor) shall remain responsible for Contract performance regardless of subcontractor participation in the work.

2.2 Background and Purpose

MDH is issuing this solicitation to obtain Data encoding and 100% key verification services for the types of Documents listed below. The documents that the Contractor is performing services for are utilized by MDH to provide payment for services rendered. The final transmitted and verified files are uploaded to MDH’s Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) via Secure File Transfer Protocol (SFTP) and adjudicated for payment. As the table below illustrates, MDH generated approximately 60,000 Documents per month on average in 2018.

These data are provided to assist potential Bidders to assess their ability to meet the requirements of this solicitation. **These numbers are provided for information purposes only.** They do NOT represent a guaranteed minimum or maximum number of Documents to be entered by the Contractor. Payment will be based solely upon the unit price set forth by the Bidder on the Bid Page and the actual quantity of work performed.)

The Department seeks to retain a Contractor to provide the following services:

- a. Pick-up batched Documents from MDH three times per week;
- b. Key-stroke required information from the Documents;
- c. Verify all keyed data;
- d. Save the key-stroked and verified data files; and
- e. Transmit the verified data files via SFTP and deliver the original Documents to the MDH three times per week. Each returned batch of Documents shall contain a batch cover form specifying the Document type and number of Documents and records key-stroked in that batch.

2.3 Responsibilities and Tasks

The Contractor shall:

- 2.3.1 Create electronic versions of the source Documents according to the specifications provided by the Department in this solicitation. Sample copies of the relevant MDH forms and specifications for

the information to be encoded and verified from each Document are attached to this IFB as Appendices 3, Document Samples and 4, Data Entry Specifications.

- 2.3.2 Update electronic source Documents at the direction of the Department according to specifications provided by the Contract Monitor.
- 2.3.3 Pick-up and Delivery: Pick-up source Documents from MDH Headquarters at 201 W. Preston Street, Room SS-4, Baltimore, Maryland 21201 and return Documents to the same location according to the following schedule:

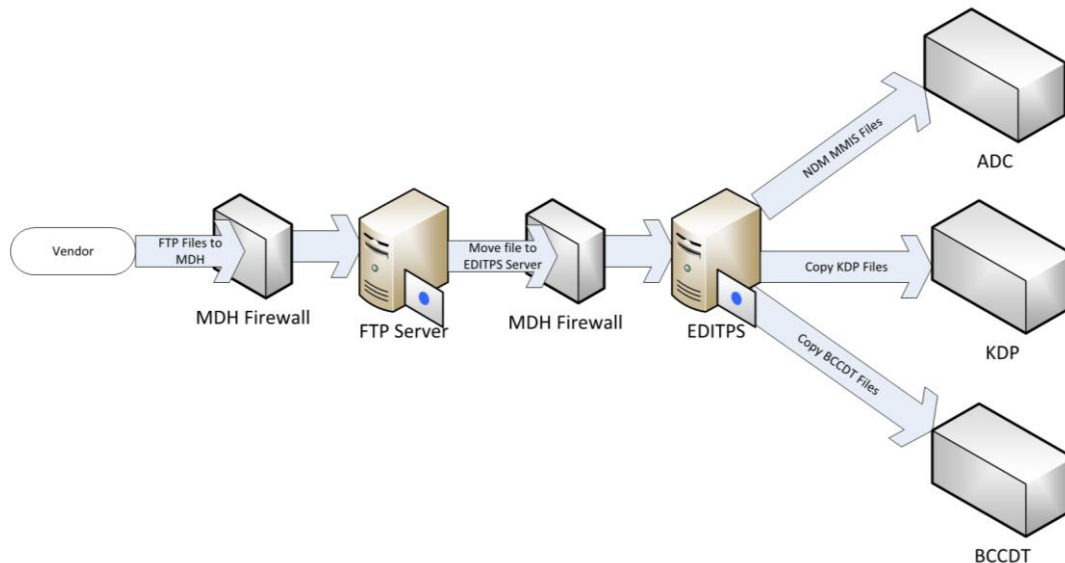
Pickup and delivery times shall be between 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Local Time, on each Monday, Wednesday, and Friday which are regularly scheduled normal state business workdays. In the event pick-up/delivery falls on a Maryland State Holiday, or on a day when pickup/delivery is not possible, e.g., snow days, the pickup/delivery is to be deferred to no later than the next normal state business workday which falls on a Monday, Wednesday, or Friday.

Any deviation from or extension to this schedule requires the approval in advance of the Contract Monitor.

- 2.3.4 Adhere to the following safety and security standards during transportation of source Documents:
Source Documents: Source Documents shall be stored in sealed, fire-proof, and locked containers while being transported between the Department and Contractor's site. Containers for transporting source Documents shall be provided by the Contractor.
Vehicles: Vehicles used for transporting source Documents shall have an enclosed cargo area and be equipped with a portable fire extinguisher. Vehicle(s) used under this Contract are subject to the Department's approval at MDH discretion.
- 2.3.5 Perform all Data Entry work on the Contractor's or named subcontractor's premises from paper source Documents furnished by the Department.
- 2.3.6 Input data from MDH source Documents to .txt file format files and transmit files to MDH in accordance with requirement 2.3.21.
- 2.3.7 Encode and provide 100% verification of all source Documents
- 2.3.8 Employ quality control procedures to ensure that the Error Rate does not exceed .1% as specified in the Scope of Work. An Error Rate greater than .1% for any Document type during any consecutive three-month period of the Contract shall be considered a material breach of Contract, which may result in termination of the Contract for default. Termination of the Contract is in addition to, not in lieu of, any other right provided to MDH under this Contract or which are available at law or in equity.
- 2.3.9 Enter records for each type of Document on separate files following file naming conventions specified by MDH during the Kick-Off meeting.
- 2.3.10 Provide a separate report via e-mail to the MDH Contract Monitor with each file delivered, identifying the Document type and Document list. The Document list shall include the batch number in numerical order, batch date if applicable, and number of Documents and records in each

- batch. The report shall also include the total number of batches, total number of Documents, and total number of records. (See Appendix 4, Data Entry Specifications.)
- 2.3.11 Provide a dated shipment report with each shipment listing each Document type included in the shipment, the Batch date if applicable, the batch numbers in order, the number of batches, number of Documents and number of records for each Document type. (See Appendix 4)
- 2.3.12 For all Documents in a batch not processed, indicate the total number of records returned to the Department without Document processing and the reason that the records were not processed. The number of records provided in each transmittal will be verified by the Department's Contract Monitor and be utilized for invoice verification and payment.
- 2.3.13 Maintain, on Contractor's premises, a duplicate of all files containing encoded data for a minimum 4-week period from the date Documents/records are processed. The Contractor shall not retain any copies, whether in hard copy or electronic format, of source Documents or the Documents created pursuant to this Contract, except as specifically allowed in this solicitation.
- 2.3.14 Maintain all Documents and records obtained or created during the Contract performance period in accordance with confidentiality requirements set forth in Maryland and federal laws, regulations, or policies and the terms of this Contract.
- 2.3.15 In compliance with Department record retention schedules, preserve and make available, at the request of the Department's Contract Monitor, records relating to the administration of the contract pursuant to the terms set forth in Attachment M – Contract, § 24. These records may include but are not limited to Documentation relating to the Contract with the Department, shipment reports as described in Section 2.3.11 above, invoices, etc. These records do not include the source Documents which are submitted for data key entry and which shall be returned to the Department according to the schedule in Section 2.3.3 above.
- 2.3.16 Ensure that any record pertaining to work performed under the Contract resulting from this solicitation be available for inspection during Normal State Business Hours to designated State and/or federal officials.
- 2.3.17 Not publish any record of work produced under the Contract that results from this solicitation without the written approval of the Department. Upon the expiration or termination of the Contract, all source data and computer output media developed by the Contractor shall be delivered to, and become the property of, the Department.
- 2.3.18 Ensure that its personnel are fully trained in security and confidentiality issues relative to handling, processing, and transporting source Documents and forms. In addition, the Contractor shall keep on file a copy of a statement signed by each employee verifying that the employee has received and will comply with the required training.
- 2.3.19 Ensure that all subcontractor personnel are subject to and meet all of the requirements described above including criminal background checks, training, security and confidentiality. The Contractor shall keep copies of Documentation verifying that these requirements have been met.
- 2.3.20 Submit a draft narrative to the Contract Monitor within ten (10) days after receipt of Notice to Proceed (NTP) regarding the quality control requirement, which includes a description of the sampling, validating, and reporting processes to be used for this project. A final copy of the narrative will be due to the Contract Monitor within thirty (30) days after receipt of NTP. The final copy must address all of the Department's comments from the draft narrative. Contractor's quality control procedures, as described in this narrative, must be acceptable to, and approved by the Department.

2.3.21 Utilize a Secure FTP Client to deliver data entered files via MDH's Secure File Transfer Protocol (SFTP) server. During the Kick-Off meeting the Contractor shall receive instruction from MDH technical staff on file transmittal procedures. Data entered files shall be sent by the Contractor within 24 hours of delivery of data entered paper claims to MDH (see Requirement 2.3.3 for delivery schedules). The Contractor shall be responsible for configuring their own Secure FTP Client, MDH will not provide a Secure FTP Client for the Contractor nor mandate a particular Secure FTP Client to use. The following figure details an overview of the SFTP process.



2.3.22 The Contractor shall within thirty (30) days of NTP perform the following:

- a. Meet with MDH staff during the Kick-Off meeting to receive all necessary information to perform the activities that are in scope for this solicitation, to include file transmittal instructions.
- b. Complete delivery of test files via secure transmittal
- c. Ensure that data entry files are correctly formatted based on specifications found in Appendix 4

2.3.23 The Contractor shall deliver a Transition Status Report within thirty (30) days of Notice to Proceed. The Transition Status Report shall provide at a minimum:

- a. The Contractor's methodology for providing 100% verified data entry forms as required in Requirement 2.3.20
- b. Information on the Contractor's secured FTP client as required by MDH
- c. Results of test files and delivery of test files via secured transmittal
- d. Contractor's schedule for pick-up and delivery of physical forms and the Contractor's plan for meeting all security and transportation requirements found in the scope of work of this solicitation.
- e. Any other information as required by the Contract Monitor during the Kick-Off meeting.

2.3.24 Reporting

2.3.24.1 Data Entry Activity Report (DEA)

- 2.3.24.1.1 The Contractor shall produce and submit detailed Data Entry Activity reports outlining all the Data Entry activity performed by the Contractor categorized by program and Document type.

- 2.3.24.1.2 The Contractor shall produce the DEA report weekly, monthly, quarterly, and annually to the Contract Monitor.
- 2.3.24.1.3 The DEA shall be broken down by program and Document type.
- 2.3.24.1.4 The DEA report shall have a summary page identifying all Data Entry Activity by program.

2.3.24.2 Quality Assurance Report (QA)

- 2.3.24.2.1 The Contractor shall produce and submit a Quality Assurance report identifying all the quality assurance activities performed by the Contractor during the reporting period, including statistics on findings and any remediation taken to address quality concerns.
- 2.3.24.2.2 The Contractor shall produce the QA report monthly, quarterly, and annually.
- 2.3.24.2.3 The QA report shall identify the activities performed by the Contractor to achieve 100% verification of all source Documents as specified in Section 2.3.7.
- 2.3.24.2.4 The QA report shall identify the audit activities performed by the Contractor to ensure Error Rates is not greater than .1% as specified in Section 2.3.8.
- 2.3.24.2.5 The QA report shall identify the number of audits conducted, the percentage/number of Documents audited, and the results of each audit.
- 2.3.24.2.6 The QA report shall describe any corrective action taken as a result of any audit findings.
- 2.3.24.2.7 The Contractor shall develop a Corrective Action Plan for any audit that identifies an Error Rate greater than .1%.

2.3.24.3 Report Frequency and Delivery

DEA Report	Weekly	The Tuesday of every week reflecting the previous week's activity.
DEA Report	Monthly	The 5 th of every month reflecting the previous month's activity. The monthly report shall reconcile with the associated 4 weekly reports. Any discrepancies between the weekly and monthly reports shall be identified and explained in the monthly report.
DEA Report	Quarterly	The 15 th of the month reflecting the previous 3 months' activity. The quarterly report shall reconcile with the associated 3 monthly reports. Any discrepancies between the monthly and quarterly reports shall be identified and explained in the quarterly report.

DEA Report	Annually	The 20 th of the month reflecting the previous year’s activity. The annual report shall reconcile with the associated 4 quarterly reports. Any discrepancies between the quarterly and annual reports shall be identified and explained in the annual report.

* For report submission, if the Due Date falls on a weekend or holiday, the report shall be due the next Business Day.

2.3.25 Staffing

- 2.3.25.1 The Contractor shall provide one supervisory personnel who will serve as the accounts point of contact for all issues.
- 2.3.25.2 The supervisory personnel shall be knowledgeable on all operational aspects of the Contract and address any concerns expressed by the State.
- 2.3.25.3 The supervisory personnel shall be available to the Department during regular State Business Hours and may be required to attend meetings with advanced notice from the Contract Monitor.

2.4 Service Level Agreements (SLA)

2.4.1 Definitions

- a) A “Problem” is defined as any situation or issue reported via a help desk ticket that is related to the system operation that is not an enhancement request.
- b) “Problem resolution time” is defined as the period of time from when the help desk ticket is opened to when it is resolved.
- c) Monthly Invoice Charges: for purposes of SLA credit calculation, Monthly Invoice Charges are defined as the charges set forth in **Attachment B, Bid Instructions and Form**, invoiced during the month of the breach for the monthly fixed services.

2.4.2 SLA Requirements

The Contractor shall:

- A. Be responsible for complying with all performance measurements, and shall also ensure compliance by all subcontractors.
- B. Provide a monthly report to monitor and detail response times and resolution times.
- C. Respond to and update all Problems, including recording when a Problem is resolved and its resolution. Appropriate Department personnel shall be notified when a Problem is resolved.
- D. The Department shall make the final determination regarding Problem severity.
- E. Contractor shall review any Problem with Department to establish the remediation plan and relevant target dates.

2.4.3 SLA Service Credits

Time is an essential element of the Contract. For work that is not completed within the time(s) specified in the service level metrics in Section 2.4.8, the Contractor shall be liable for service credits in the amount(s) provided for in the Contract.

Service credits will be cumulative for each missed service requirement. The State, at its option for amount due the State as service credits, may deduct such from any money payable to the Contractor or may bill the Contractor as a separate item. In the event of a catastrophic failure affecting all services, all affected SLAs shall be credited to the State.

The parties agree that any assessment of service credits shall be construed and treated by the parties not as imposing a penalty upon the Contractor, but as compensation to the State for the Contractor's failure to timely complete Contract work.

2.4.4 SLA Effective Date (SLA Activation Date)

SLAs set forth herein shall be in effect beginning with the commencement of monthly services and the first delivery of data entered documents as described in Section 2.

Beginning on the SLA Activation Date, for any performance measurement not met during the monthly reporting period, the SLA credit for that individual measurement shall be applied to the Monthly Invoice Charges.

2.4.5 Service Level Reporting

- a) Contractor performance will be monitored by the Department.
- b) The Contractor shall provide detailed monthly reports evidencing the attained level for each SLA.
- c) The Contractor shall provide a monthly summary report for SLA performance.
- d) Monthly reports shall be delivered via e-mail to the Contract Monitor by the 5th of the following month.
- e) If any of the performance measurements are not met during the monthly reporting period, the Contractor will be notified of the standard that is not in compliance.

2.4.6 Credit for Failure to Meet SLA

Contractor's failure to meet an SLA will result in a credit, as service credits and not as a penalty, to the Monthly Invoice Charges payable by the State during the month of the breach. The credits will be cumulative for each missed service requirement. The State, at its option for amount due the State as service credits, may deduct such from any money payable to the Contractor or may bill the Contractor as a separate item. In the event of a catastrophic failure affecting all services, all affected SLAs shall be

credited to the State. In no event shall the aggregate of all SLA credits paid to the State in any calendar month exceed 25% of the Monthly Invoice Charges.

Example: If the Monthly Invoice Charges were \$100,000 and one SLA were missed, with an applicable 4% credit, the credit to the monthly invoice would be \$4,000, and the State would pay a net Monthly Charge of \$96,000.

2.4.7 Root Cause Analysis

If the same SLA measurement yields an SLA credit more than once, the Contractor shall conduct a root cause analysis. Such root cause analysis shall be provided within 30 days of the second breach, and every breach thereafter.

In addition, for each “Emergency” or “High” priority Problem, the affected parties will perform a root cause analysis and institute a process of problem management to prevent recurrence of the issue.

2.4.8 Service Level Measurements Table

The Contractor shall comply with the service level measurements in the following table:

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3 Contractor Requirements: General

3.1 Contract Initiation Requirements

The Contractor shall schedule and hold a kick off meeting at 201 W Preston St. no later than five (5) Business Days after Notice to Proceed to review any possible changes to the document specifications and review with state personnel the plan for performing all services as required in this solicitation.

3.2 End of Contract Transition

- 3.2.1 The Contractor shall provide transition assistance as requested by the State to facilitate the orderly transfer of services to the State or a follow-on Contractor, for a period up to 60 days prior to Contract end date, or the termination thereof. Such transition efforts shall consist, not by way of limitation, of:
- a) Provide additional services and support as requested to successfully complete the transition;
 - b) Maintain the services called for by the Contract at the required level of proficiency;
 - c) Provide updated System Documentation, as appropriate; and
 - d) Provide current operating procedures (as appropriate).
- 3.2.2 The Contractor shall work toward a prompt and timely transition, proceeding in accordance with the directions of the Contract Monitor. The Contract Monitor may provide the Contractor with additional instructions to meet specific transition requirements prior to the end of the Contract.
- 3.2.3 The Contractor shall ensure that all necessary knowledge and materials for the tasks completed are transferred to the custody of State personnel or a third party, as directed by the Contract Monitor.
- 3.2.4 The Contractor shall support end-of-Contract transition efforts with technical and project support to include but not be limited to:
- a) The Contractor shall provide a draft Transition-Out Plan 120 Business Days in advance of Contract end date.

The Transition-Out Plan shall address at a minimum the following areas:

- 1) Any staffing concerns/issues related to the closeout of the Contract;
- 2) Communications and reporting process between the Contractor, the Department and the Contract Monitor;
- 3) Security and system access review and closeout;
- 4) Any hardware/software inventory or licensing including transfer of any point of contact for required software licenses to the Department or a designee;
- 5) Any final training/orientation of Department staff;
- 6) Connectivity services provided, activities and approximate timelines required for Transition-Out;
- 7) Knowledge transfer, to include:
 - a) A working knowledge of the current system environments;
 - b) Review with the Department the procedures and practices that support the business process and current system environments;

- c) Working knowledge of all technical and functional matters associated with the solution, its architecture, data file structure, interfaces, any batch programs, and any hardware or software tools utilized in the performance of the Contract;
 - d) Documentation that lists and describes all hardware and software tools utilized in the performance of the Contract;
- 8) Plans to complete tasks and any unfinished work items (including open change requests, and known bug/issues); and
- 9) Any risk factors with the timing and the Transition-Out schedule and transition process. The Contractor shall document any risk factors and suggested solutions.

The Contractor shall ensure all documentation and data including, but not limited to, System Documentation and current operating procedures, is current and complete with a hard and soft copy in a format prescribed by the Contract Monitor.

The Contractor shall provide copies of any current daily and weekly back-ups to the Department or a third party as directed by the Contract Monitor as of the final date of transition, but no later than the final date of the Contract.

Access to any data or configurations of the furnished product and services shall be available after the expiration of the Contract as described in **Section 3.2.5**.

3.2.5 Return and Maintenance of State Data

- a) Upon termination or the expiration of the Contract Term, the Contractor shall: (a) return to the State all State data in either the form it was provided to the Contractor or in a mutually agreed format along with the schema necessary to read such data; (b) preserve, maintain, and protect all State data until the earlier of a direction by the State to delete such data or the expiration of 90 days (“the retention period”) from the date of termination or expiration of the Contract term; (c) after the retention period, the Contractor shall securely dispose of and permanently delete all State data in all of its forms, such as backup tape and paper such that it is not recoverable, according to National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST)-approved methods with certificates of destruction to be provided to the State; and (d) prepare an accurate accounting from which the State may reconcile all outstanding accounts. The final monthly invoice for the services provided hereunder shall include all charges for the 90-day data retention period.
- b) During any period of service suspension, the Contractor shall maintain all State data in its then existing form, unless otherwise directed in writing by the Contract Monitor.
- c) In addition to the foregoing, the State shall be entitled to any post-termination/expiration assistance generally made available by Contractor with respect to the services.

3.3 Invoicing

3.3.1 General

- a) The Contractor shall e-mail the original of each invoice and signed authorization to invoice to the Contract Monitor and Adrian Basey at e-mail address: Adriane.basey@maryland.gov.
- b) All invoices for services shall be verified by the Contractor as accurate at the time of submission.
- c) An invoice not satisfying the requirements of a Proper Invoice (as defined in COMAR 21.06.09) cannot be processed for payment. To be considered a Proper Invoice, invoices must include the following information, without error:

- 1) Contractor name and address;
 - 2) Remittance address;
 - 3) Federal taxpayer identification (FEIN) number, social security number, as appropriate;
 - 4) Invoice period (i.e. time period during which services covered by invoice were performed);
 - 5) Invoice date;
 - 6) Invoice number;
 - 7) State assigned Contract number;
 - 8) State assigned (Blanket) Purchase Order number(s);
 - 9) Goods or services provided;
 - 10) Amount due; and
 - 11) Any additional documentation required by regulation or the Contract.
- d) Invoices that contain both fixed price and time and material items shall clearly identify each item as either fixed price or time and material billing.
- e) The Department reserves the right to reduce or withhold Contract payment in the event the Contractor does not provide the Department with all required deliverables within the time frame specified in the Contract or otherwise breaches the terms and conditions of the Contract until such time as the Contractor brings itself into full compliance with the Contract.
- f) Any action on the part of the Department, or dispute of action by the Contractor, shall be in accordance with the provisions of Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article §§ 15-215 through 15-223 and with COMAR 21.10.04.
- g) The State is generally exempt from federal excise taxes, Maryland sales and use taxes, District of Columbia sales taxes and transportation taxes. The Contractor, however, is not exempt from such sales and use taxes and may be liable for the same.
- h) Invoices for final payment shall be clearly marked as “FINAL” and submitted when all work requirements have been completed and no further charges are to be incurred under the Contract. In no event shall any invoice be submitted later than 60 calendar days from the Contract termination date.

3.3.2 Invoice Submission Schedule

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3.3.3 For the purposes of the Contract an amount will not be deemed due and payable if:

- a) The amount invoiced is inconsistent with the Contract;
- b) The proper invoice has not been received by the party or office specified in the Contract;
- c) The invoice or performance is in dispute or the Contractor has failed to otherwise comply with the provisions of the Contract;
- d) The item or services have not been accepted;
- e) The quantity of items delivered is less than the quantity ordered;
- f) The items or services do not meet the quality requirements of the Contract;
- g) If the Contract provides for progress payments, the proper invoice for the progress payment has not been submitted pursuant to the schedule;
- h) If the Contract provides for withholding a retainage and the invoice is for the retainage, all stipulated conditions for release of the retainage have not been met; or
- i) The Contractor has not submitted satisfactory documentation or other evidence reasonably required by the Procurement Officer or by the Contract concerning performance under the Contract and compliance with its provisions.

3.3.4 Travel Reimbursement

Travel will not be reimbursed under this MS-IFB.

3.4 Liquidated Damages

3.4.2 Liquidated Damages other than MBE

3.5 Disaster Recovery and Data

The following requirements apply to the Contract:

3.5.1 Redundancy, Data Backup and Disaster Recovery

- a) Unless specified otherwise in the MS-IFB, Contractor shall maintain or cause to be maintained disaster avoidance procedures designed to safeguard State data and other confidential information, Contractor's processing capability and the availability of hosted services, in each case throughout the Contract term. Any force majeure provisions of the Contract do not limit the Contractor's obligations under this provision.
- b) The Contractor shall have robust contingency and disaster recovery (DR) plans in place to ensure that the services provided under the Contract will be maintained in the event of disruption to the Contractor/subcontractor's operations (including, but not limited to, disruption to information technology systems), however caused.
 - 1) The Contractor shall furnish a DR site.

- 2) The DR site shall be at least 100 miles from the primary operations site, and have the capacity to take over complete production volume in case the primary site becomes unresponsive.
- c) The contingency and DR plans must be designed to ensure that services under the Contract are restored after a disruption within twenty-four (24) hours from notification and a recovery point objective of one (1) hour or less prior to the outage in order to avoid unacceptable consequences due to the unavailability of services.
- d) The Contractor shall test the contingency/DR plans at least twice annually to identify any changes that need to be made to the plan(s) to ensure a minimum interruption of service. Coordination shall be made with the State to ensure limited system downtime when testing is conducted. At least one (1) annual test shall include backup media restoration and failover/fallback operations at the DR location. The Contractor shall send the Contract Monitor a notice of completion following completion of DR testing.
- e) Such contingency and DR plans shall be available for the Department to inspect and practically test at any reasonable time, and subject to regular updating, revising, and testing throughout the term of the Contract.

3.5.2 Data Export/Import

- a) The Contractor shall, at no additional cost or charge to the State, in an industry standard/non-proprietary format:
 - 1) perform a full or partial import/export of State data within 24 hours of a request; or
 - 2) provide to the State the ability to import/export data at will and provide the State with any access and instructions which are needed for the State to import or export data.
- b) Any import or export shall be in a secure format per the Security Requirements.

3.5.3 Data Ownership and Access

- a) Data, databases and derived data products created, collected, manipulated, or directly purchased as part of a MS-IFB are the property of the State. The purchasing State agency is considered the custodian of the data and shall determine the use, access, distribution and other conditions based on appropriate State statutes and regulations.
- b) Public jurisdiction user accounts and public jurisdiction data shall not be accessed, except (1) in the course of data center operations, (2) in response to service or technical issues, (3) as required by the express terms of the Contract, including as necessary to perform the services hereunder or (4) at the State's written request.
- c) The Contractor shall limit access to and possession of State data to only Contractor Personnel whose responsibilities reasonably require such access or possession and shall train such Contractor Personnel on the confidentiality obligations set forth herein.
- d) At no time shall any data or processes – that either belong to or are intended for the use of the State or its officers, agents or employees – be copied, disclosed or retained by the Contractor or any party related to the Contractor for subsequent use in any transaction that does not include the State.
- e) The Contractor shall not use any information collected in connection with the services furnished under the Contract for any purpose other than fulfilling such services.

- 3.5.4 Provisions in Sections 3.5.1 – 3.5.3 shall survive expiration or termination of the Contract. Additionally, the Contractor shall flow down the provisions of Sections 3.5.1-3.5.3 (or the substance thereof) in all subcontracts.

3.6 Insurance Requirements

The Contractor shall maintain, at a minimum, the insurance coverages outlined below, or any minimum requirements established by law if higher, for the duration of the Contract, including option periods, if exercised:

- 3.6.1 The following type(s) of insurance and minimum amount(s) of coverage are required:
- a) Commercial General Liability - of \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, property damage, and personal and advertising injury and \$3,000,000 annual aggregate. The minimum limits required herein may be satisfied through any combination of primary and umbrella/excess liability policies.
 - b) Errors and Omissions/Professional Liability - \$1,000,000 per combined single limit per claim and \$3,000,000 annual aggregate.
 - c) Crime Insurance/Employee Theft Insurance - to cover employee theft with a minimum single loss limit of \$1,000,000 per loss, and a minimum single loss retention not to exceed \$10,000. The State of Maryland and the Department should be added as a “loss payee.”
 - d) The Contractor shall possess and maintain throughout the term of the awarded Agreement and for three (3) years thereafter, Cyber Risk/ Data Breach insurance (either separately or as part of a broad Professional Liability or Errors and Omissions Insurance) with limits of at least US \$5 million (\$5,000,000) per claim. Any “insured vs. insured” exclusions will be modified accordingly to allow the State additional insured status without prejudicing the State’s rights under the policy(ies). Coverage shall be sufficiently broad to respond to the Contractor’s duties and obligations under the Agreement and shall include, but not be limited to, claims involving privacy violations, information theft, damage to or destruction of electronic information, release of Sensitive Data, and alteration of electronic information, extortion and network security. The policy shall provide coverage for, not by way of limitation, breach response costs as well as regulatory fines and penalties as well as credit monitoring expenses with limits sufficient to respond to these obligations.
 - e) Worker’s Compensation - The Contractor shall maintain such insurance as necessary or as required under Workers’ Compensation Acts, the Longshore and Harbor Workers’ Compensation Act, and the Federal Employers’ Liability Act, to not be less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence (unless a state’s law requires a greater amount of coverage). Coverage must be valid in all states where work is performed.
 - f) Automobile or Commercial Truck Insurance - The Contractor shall maintain Automobile or Commercial Truck Insurance (including owned, leased, hired, and non-owned vehicles) as appropriate with Liability, Collision, and PIP limits no less than those required by the State where the vehicle(s) is registered, but in no case less than those required by the State of Maryland.
- 3.6.2 The State shall be listed as an additional insured on the faces of the certificates associated with the coverages listed above, including umbrella policies, excluding Workers’ Compensation Insurance and professional liability.
- 3.6.3 All insurance policies shall be endorsed to include a clause requiring the insurance carrier provide the Procurement Officer, by certified mail, not less than 30 days’ advance notice of any non-renewal, cancellation, or expiration. The Contractor shall notify the Procurement Officer in writing, if policies are cancelled or not renewed within five (5) days of learning of such cancellation or nonrenewal. The Contractor shall provide evidence of replacement insurance coverage to the Procurement Officer at least 15 days prior to the expiration of the insurance policy then in effect.

- 3.6.4 Any insurance furnished as a condition of the Contract shall be issued by a company authorized to do business in the State.
- 3.6.5 The recommended awardee must provide current certificate(s) of insurance with the prescribed coverages, limits and requirements set forth in this section within five (5) Business Days from notice of recommended award. During the period of performance for multi-year contracts, the Contractor shall provide certificates of insurance annually, or as otherwise directed by the Contract Monitor.
- 3.6.6 The Contractor shall require any subcontractors to obtain and maintain comparable levels of coverage and shall provide the Contract Monitor with the same documentation as is required of the Contractor.

3.7 Security Requirements

The following requirements are applicable to the Contract:

3.7.1 Employee Identification

- a) Contractor Personnel shall display his or her company ID badge in a visible location at all times while on State premises. Upon request of authorized State personnel, each Contractor Personnel shall provide additional photo identification.
- b) Contractor Personnel shall cooperate with State site requirements, including but not limited to, being prepared to be escorted at all times, and providing information for State badge issuance.
- c) Contractor shall remove any Contractor Personnel from working on the Contract where the State determines, in its sole discretion that Contractor Personnel has not adhered to the Security requirements specified herein.
- d) The State reserves the right to request that the Contractor submit proof of employment authorization of non-United States Citizens, prior to commencement of work under the Contract.

3.7.2 Security Clearance / Criminal Background Check

- a) A criminal background check for each Contractor Personnel providing any services under this contract shall be completed prior to each Contractor Personnel providing any services under the Contract.
- b) The Contractor shall obtain at its own expense a Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) State and federal criminal background check, including fingerprinting, for all Contractor Personnel listed in sub-paragraph A. This check may be performed by a public or private entity.
- c) Persons with a criminal record may not perform services under the Contract unless prior written approval is obtained from the Contract Monitor. The Contract Monitor reserves the right to reject any individual based upon the results of the background check. Decisions of the Contract Monitor as to acceptability of a candidate are final. The State reserves the right to refuse any individual Contractor Personnel to work on State premises, based upon certain specified criminal convictions, as specified by the State.

3.7.3 On-Site Security Requirement(s)

- a) For the conditions noted below, Contractor Personnel may be barred from entrance or leaving any site until such time that the State's conditions and queries are satisfied.

- 1) Contractor Personnel may be subject to random security checks when entering and leaving State secured areas. The State reserves the right to require Contractor Personnel to be accompanied while in secured premises.
 - 2) Some State sites, especially those premises of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, require each person entering the premises to document and inventory items (such as tools and equipment) brought onto the site, and to submit to a physical search of his or her person. Therefore, Contractor Personnel shall always have available an inventory list of tools being brought onto a site and be prepared to present the inventory list to the State staff or an officer upon arrival for review, as well as present the tools or equipment for inspection. Before leaving the site, the Contractor Personnel will again present the inventory list and the tools or equipment for inspection. Upon both entering the site and leaving the site, State staff or a correctional or police officer may search Contractor Personnel. Depending upon facility rules, specific tools or personal items may be prohibited from being brought into the facility.
- b) Any Contractor Personnel who enters the premises of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Department may be searched, fingerprinted (for the purpose of a criminal history background check), photographed and required to wear an identification card issued by the Department.
 - c) Further, Contractor Personnel shall not violate Md. Code Ann., Criminal Law Art. Section 9-410 through 9-417 and such other security policies of the agency that control the facility to which the Contractor Personnel seeks access. The failure of any of the Contractor Personnel to comply with any provision of the Contract is sufficient grounds for the State to immediately terminate the Contract for default.

3.7.4 Information Technology

- (a) Contractors shall comply with and adhere to the State IT Security Policy and Standards. These policies may be revised from time to time and the Contractor shall comply with all such revisions. Updated and revised versions of the State IT Policy and Standards are available online at: www.doit.maryland.gov – keyword: Security Policy.
- (b) The Contractor shall not connect any of its own equipment to a State LAN/WAN without prior written approval by the State. The Contractor shall complete any necessary paperwork as directed and coordinated with the Contract Monitor to obtain approval by the State to connect Contractor-owned equipment to a State LAN/WAN.

The Contractor shall:

- 1) Implement administrative, physical, and technical safeguards to protect State data that are no less rigorous than accepted industry best practices for information security such as those listed below (see **Section 3.7.5**);
- 2) Ensure that all such safeguards, including the manner in which State data is collected, accessed, used, stored, processed, disposed of and disclosed, comply with applicable data protection and privacy laws as well as the terms and conditions of the Contract; and
- 3) The Contractor, and Contractor Personnel, shall (i) abide by all applicable federal, State and local laws, rules and regulations concerning security of Information Systems and Information Technology and (ii) comply with and adhere to the State IT Security Policy and Standards as each may be amended or revised from time to time. Updated and revised versions of the State IT Policy and Standards are available online at: www.doit.maryland.gov – keyword: Security Policy.

3.7.5 Data Protection and Controls

- A. Contractor shall ensure a secure environment for all State data and any hardware and software (including but not limited to servers, network and data components) provided or used in connection with the performance of the Contract and shall apply or cause application of appropriate controls so as to maintain such a secure environment (“Security Best Practices”). Such Security Best Practices shall comply with an accepted industry standard, such as the NIST cybersecurity framework.
- B. To ensure appropriate data protection safeguards are in place, the Contractor shall implement and maintain the following controls at all times throughout the Term of the Contract (the Contractor may augment this list with additional controls):
- 1) Establish separate production, test, and training environments for systems supporting the services provided under the Contract and ensure that production data is not replicated in test or training environment(s) unless it has been previously anonymized or otherwise modified to protect the confidentiality of Sensitive Data elements. The Contractor shall ensure the appropriate separation of production and non-production environments by applying the data protection and control requirements listed in **Section 3.7.5**.
 - 2) Apply hardware and software hardening procedures as recommended by Center for Internet Security (CIS) guides <https://www.cisecurity.org/>, Security Technical Implementation Guides (STIG) <http://iase.disa.mil/Pages/index.aspx>, or similar industry best practices to reduce the systems’ surface of vulnerability, eliminating as many security risks as possible and documenting what is not feasible or not performed according to best practices. Any hardening practices not implemented shall be documented with a plan of action and milestones including any compensating control. These procedures may include but are not limited to removal of unnecessary software, disabling or removing unnecessary services, removal of unnecessary usernames or logins, and the deactivation of unneeded features in the Contractor’s system configuration files.
 - 3) Ensure that State data is not comingled with non-State data through the proper application of compartmentalization Security Measures.
 - 4) Apply data encryption to protect Sensitive Data at all times, including in transit, at rest, and also when archived for backup purposes. Unless otherwise directed, the Contractor is responsible for the encryption of all Sensitive Data.
 - 5) For all State data the Contractor manages or controls, data encryption shall be applied to such data in transit over untrusted networks.
 - 6) Encryption algorithms which are utilized for encrypting data shall comply with current Federal Information Processing Standards (FIPS), “Security Requirements for Cryptographic Modules”, FIPS PUB 140-2:
<http://csrc.nist.gov/publications/fips/fips140-2/fips1402.pdf>
<http://csrc.nist.gov/groups/STM/cmvp/documents/140-1/1401vend.htm>
 - 7) Enable appropriate logging parameters to monitor user access activities, authorized and failed access attempts, system exceptions, and critical information security events as recommended by the operating system and application manufacturers and information security standards, including Maryland Department of Information Technology’s Information Security Policy.

- 8) Retain the aforementioned logs and review them at least daily to identify suspicious or questionable activity for investigation and documentation as to their cause and remediation, if required. The Department shall have the right to inspect these policies and procedures and the Contractor or subcontractor's performance to confirm the effectiveness of these measures for the services being provided under the Contract.
- 9) Ensure system and network environments are separated by properly configured and updated firewalls.
- 10) Restrict network connections between trusted and untrusted networks by physically or logically isolating systems from unsolicited and unauthenticated network traffic.
- 11) By default "deny all" and only allow access by exception.
- 12) Review, at least annually, the aforementioned network connections, documenting and confirming the business justification for the use of all service, protocols, and ports allowed, including the rationale or compensating controls implemented for those protocols considered insecure but necessary.
- 13) Perform regular vulnerability testing of operating system, application, and network devices. Such testing is expected to identify outdated software versions; missing software patches; device or software misconfigurations; and to validate compliance with or deviations from the security policies applicable to the Contract. Contractor shall evaluate all identified vulnerabilities for potential adverse effect on security and integrity and remediate the vulnerability no later than 30 days following the earlier of vulnerability's identification or public disclosure, or document why remediation action is unnecessary or unsuitable. The Department shall have the right to inspect the Contractor's policies and procedures and the results of vulnerability testing to confirm the effectiveness of these measures for the services being provided under the Contract.
- 14) Enforce strong user authentication and password control measures to minimize the opportunity for unauthorized access through compromise of the user access controls. At a minimum, the implemented measures should be consistent with the most current Maryland Department of Information Technology's Information Security Policy (<http://doit.maryland.gov/support/Pages/SecurityPolicies.aspx>), including specific requirements for password length, complexity, history, and account lockout.
- 15) Ensure State data is not processed, transferred, or stored outside of the United States ("U.S."). The Contractor shall provide its services to the State and the State's end users solely from data centers in the U.S. Unless granted an exception in writing by the State, the Contractor shall not allow Contractor Personnel to store State data on portable devices, including personal computers, except for devices that are used and kept only at its U.S. data centers. The Contractor shall permit its Contractor Personnel to access State data remotely only as required to provide technical support.
- 16) Ensure Contractor's Personnel shall not connect any of its own equipment to a State LAN/WAN without prior written approval by the State, which may be revoked at any time for any reason. The Contractor shall complete any necessary paperwork as directed and coordinated with the Contract Monitor to obtain approval by the State to connect Contractor -owned equipment to a State LAN/WAN.
- 17) Ensure that anti-virus and anti-malware software is installed and maintained on all systems supporting the services provided under the Contract; that the anti-virus and anti-malware software is automatically updated; and that the software is configured

to actively scan and detect threats to the system for remediation. The Contractor shall perform routine vulnerability scans and take corrective actions for any findings.

- 18) Conduct regular external vulnerability testing designed to examine the service provider's security profile from the Internet without benefit of access to internal systems and networks behind the external security perimeter. Evaluate all identified vulnerabilities on Internet-facing devices for potential adverse effect on the service's security and integrity and remediate the vulnerability promptly or document why remediation action is unnecessary or unsuitable. The Department shall have the right to inspect these policies and procedures and the performance of vulnerability testing to confirm the effectiveness of these measures for the services being provided under the Contract.

3.7.6 Security Logs and Reports Access

- a) For a SaaS or non-State hosted solution, the Contractor shall provide reports to the State in a mutually agreeable format.
- b) Reports shall include latency statistics, user access, user access IP address, user access history and security logs for all State files related to the Contract.

3.7.7 Security Plan

- a) The Contractor shall protect State data according to a written security policy ("Security Plan") no less rigorous than that of the State, and shall supply a copy of such policy to the State for validation, with any appropriate updates, on an annual basis.

The Security Plan shall detail the steps and processes employed by the Contractor as well as the features and characteristics which will ensure compliance with the security requirements of the Contract.

3.7.8 Security Incident Response

- A. The Contractor shall notify the Department in accordance with **Section 3.7.8 A-D** when any Contractor system that may access, process, or store State data or State systems experiences a Security Incident or a Data Breach as follows:
 - 1) notify the Department within twenty-four (24) hours of the discovery of a Security Incident by providing notice via written or electronic correspondence to the Contract Monitor, Department chief information officer and Department chief information security officer;
 - 2) notify the Department within two (2) hours if there is a threat to Contractor's solution as it pertains to the use, disclosure, and security of State data; and
 - 3) provide written notice to the Department within one (1) Business Day after Contractor's discovery of unauthorized use or disclosure of State data and thereafter all information the State (or Department) requests concerning such unauthorized use or disclosure.
- B. Contractor's notice shall identify:
 - 1) the nature of the unauthorized use or disclosure;
 - 2) the State data used or disclosed,
 - 3) who made the unauthorized use or received the unauthorized disclosure;
 - 4) what the Contractor has done or shall do to mitigate any deleterious effect of the unauthorized use or disclosure; and

- 5) what corrective action the Contractor has taken or shall take to prevent future similar unauthorized use or disclosure.
 - 6) The Contractor shall provide such other information, including a written report, as reasonably requested by the State.
- C. The Contractor may need to communicate with outside parties regarding a Security Incident, which may include contacting law enforcement, fielding media inquiries and seeking external expertise as mutually agreed upon, defined by law or contained in the Contract. Discussing Security Incidents with the State should be handled on an urgent as-needed basis, as part of Contractor communication and mitigation processes as mutually agreed upon, defined by law or contained in the Contract.
- D. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable laws that require the notification of individuals in the event of unauthorized release of State data or other event requiring notification, and, where notification is required, assume responsibility for informing all such individuals in accordance with applicable law and to indemnify and hold harmless the State (or Department) and its officials and employees from and against any claims, damages, and actions related to the event requiring notification.

3.7.9 Data Breach Responsibilities

- A. If the Contractor reasonably believes or has actual knowledge of a Data Breach, the Contractor shall, unless otherwise directed:
- 1) Notify the appropriate State-identified contact within 24 hours by telephone in accordance with the agreed upon security plan or security procedures unless a shorter time is required by applicable law;
 - 2) Cooperate with the State to investigate and resolve the data breach;
 - 3) Promptly implement commercially reasonable remedial measures to remedy the Data Breach; and
 - 4) Document responsive actions taken related to the Data Breach, including any post-incident review of events and actions taken to make changes in business practices in providing the services.
- B. If a Data Breach is a direct result of the Contractor's breach of its Contract obligation to encrypt State data or otherwise prevent its release, the Contractor shall bear the costs associated with (1) the investigation and resolution of the data breach; (2) notifications to individuals, regulators or others required by State law; (3) a credit monitoring service required by State or federal law; (4) a website or a toll-free number and call center for affected individuals required by State law; and (5) complete all corrective actions as reasonably determined by Contractor based on root cause; all [(1) through (5)] subject to the Contract's limitation of liability.
- 3.7.10 The State shall, at its discretion, have the right to review and assess the Contractor's compliance to the security requirements and standards defined in the Contract.
- 3.7.11 Provisions in **Sections 3.7.1 – 3.7.8** shall survive expiration or termination of the Contract. Additionally, the Contractor shall flow down the provisions of **Sections 3.7.4-3.7.8** (or the substance thereof) in all subcontracts.

3.8 Problem Escalation Procedure

- 3.8.1 The Contractor must provide and maintain a Problem Escalation Procedure (PEP) for both routine and emergency situations. The PEP must state how the Contractor will address problem situations

as they occur during the performance of the Contract, especially problems that are not resolved to the satisfaction of the State within appropriate timeframes.

- 3.8.2 The Contractor shall provide contact information to the Contract Monitor, as well as to other State personnel as directed should the Contract Monitor not be available.
- 3.8.3 The Contractor shall provide the PEP no later than ten (10) Business Days after notice of recommended award or after the date of the Notice to Proceed, whichever is earlier. The PEP, including any revisions thereto, must also be provided within ten (10) Business Days after the start of each Contract year and within ten (10) Business Days after any change in circumstance which changes the PEP. The PEP shall detail how problems with work under the Contract will be escalated in order to resolve any issues in a timely manner. The PEP shall include:
- a) The process for establishing the existence of a problem;
 - b) Names, titles, and contact information for progressively higher levels of personnel in the Contractor's organization who would become involved in resolving a problem;
 - c) For each individual listed in the Contractor's PEP, the maximum amount of time a problem will remain unresolved with that individual before the problem escalates to the next contact person listed in the Contractor's PEP;
 - d) Expedited escalation procedures and any circumstances that would trigger expediting them;
 - e) The method of providing feedback on resolution progress, including the frequency of feedback to be provided to the State;
 - f) Contact information for persons responsible for resolving issues after normal business hours (e.g., evenings, weekends, holidays) and on an emergency basis; and
 - g) A process for updating and notifying the Contract Monitor of any changes to the PEP.
- 3.8.4 Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit any rights of the Contract Monitor or the State which may be allowed by the Contract or applicable law.

3.9 SOC 2 Type 2 Audit Report

- 3.9.1 A SOC 2 Type 2 Audit applies to the Contract. The applicable trust criteria are: Security and Confidentiality.
- 3.9.2 In the event the Contractor provides services for identified critical functions, handles Sensitive Data, or hosts any related implemented system for the State under the Contract, the Contractor shall have an annual audit performed by an independent audit firm of the Contractor's handling of Sensitive Data or the Department's critical functions. Critical functions are identified as all aspects and functionality of the Solution including any add-on modules and shall address all areas relating to Information Technology security and operational processes. These services provided by the Contractor that shall be covered by the audit will collectively be referred to as the "Information Functions and Processes." Such audits shall be performed in accordance with audit guidance: SOC 2 Reporting on an Evaluation of Controls at a Service Organization Relevant to Security, Availability, Processing Integrity, Confidentiality, or Privacy (SOC 2) as published by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) and as updated from time to time, or according to the most current audit guidance promulgated by the AICPA or similarly-recognized professional organization, as agreed to by the Department, to assess the security of outsourced client functions or data (collectively, the "Guidance") as follows:
- a) The type of audit to be performed in accordance with the Guidance is a SOC 2 Type 2 Audit (referred to as the "SOC 2 Audit" or "SOC 2 Report"). All SOC2 Audit Reports shall be

submitted to the Contract Monitor as specified in Section F below. The initial SOC 2 Audit shall be completed within a timeframe to be specified by the State. The audit period covered by the initial SOC 2 Audit shall start with the Contract Effective Date unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Contract Monitor. All subsequent SOC 2 Audits after this initial audit shall be performed at a minimum on an annual basis throughout the Term of the Contract, and shall cover a 12-month audit period or such portion of the year that the Contractor furnished services.

- b) The SOC 2 Audit shall report on the suitability of the design and operating effectiveness of controls over the Information Functions and Processes to meet the requirements of the Contract, including the Security Requirements identified in **Section 3.7**, relevant to the trust criteria identified in 3.9.1: as defined in the aforementioned Guidance.
- c) The audit scope of each year's SOC 2 Report may need to be adjusted (including the inclusion or omission of the relevant trust services criteria of Security, Availability, Processing Integrity, Confidentiality, and Privacy) to accommodate any changes to the environment since the last SOC 2 Report. Such changes may include but are not limited to the addition of Information Functions and Processes through modifications to the Contract or due to changes in Information Technology or the operational infrastructure. The Contractor shall ensure that the audit scope of each year's SOC 2 Report engagement shall accommodate these changes by including in the SOC 2 Report all appropriate controls related to the current environment supporting the Information Functions and/or Processes, including those controls required by the Contract.
- d) The scope of the SOC 2 Report shall include work performed by any subcontractors that provide essential support to the TO Contractor or essential support to the Information Functions and Processes provided to the Department under the Contract. The Contractor shall ensure the audit includes all such subcontractors operating in performance of the Contract.
- e) All SOC 2 Audits, including those of the Contractor, shall be performed at no additional expense to the Department.
- f) The Contractor shall provide to the Contract Monitor, within 30 calendar days of the issuance of each SOC 2 Report, a complete copy of the final SOC 2 Report(s) and a documented corrective action plan addressing each audit finding or exception contained in the SOC 2 Report. The corrective action plan shall identify in detail the remedial action to be taken by the Contractor along with the date(s) when each remedial action is to be implemented.
- g) If the Contractor currently has an annual, independent information security assessment performed that includes the operations, systems, and repositories of the Information Functions and Processes being provided to the Department under the Contract, and if that assessment generally conforms to the content and objective of the Guidance, the Department will determine in consultation with appropriate State government technology and audit authorities whether the Contractor's current information security assessments are acceptable in lieu of the SOC 2 Report(s).
- h) If the Contractor fails during the Contract term to obtain an annual SOC 2 Report by the date specified in **Section 3.9.2.A**, the Department shall have the right to retain an independent audit firm to perform an audit engagement of a SOC 2 Report of the Information Functions and Processes utilized or provided by the Contractor and under the Contract. The Contractor agrees to allow the independent audit firm to access its facility/ies for purposes of conducting this audit engagement(s), and will provide the necessary support and cooperation to the independent audit firm that is required to perform the audit engagement of the SOC 2 Report.

The Department will invoice the Contractor for the expense of the SOC 2 Report(s), or deduct the cost from future payments to the Contractor.

- i) Provisions in Section 3.9.1-2 shall survive expiration or termination of the Contract. Additionally, the Contractor shall flow down the provisions of Section 3.9.1-2 (or the substance thereof) in all subcontracts.

3.10 Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Reports

If this solicitation includes an MBE Goal (see **Section 4.26**), the Contractor shall:

- a) Submit the following reports by the 10th of each month to the Contract Monitor and the Department's MBE Liaison Officer:
 - 1) A Prime Contractor Paid/Unpaid MBE Invoice Report (Attachment D-4A) listing any unpaid invoices, over 45 days old, received from any certified MBE subcontractor, the amount of each invoice and the reason payment has not been made; and
 - 2) (If Applicable) An MBE Prime Contractor Report (Attachment D-4B) identifying an MBE prime's self-performing work to be counted towards the MBE participation goals.
- b) Include in its agreements with its certified MBE subcontractors a requirement that those subcontractors submit an MBE Subcontractor Paid/Unpaid Invoice Report (**Attachment D-5**) by the 10th of each month to the Contract Monitor and the Department's MBE Liaison Officer that identifies the Contract and lists all payments to the MBE subcontractor received from the Contractor in the preceding reporting period month, as well as any outstanding invoices, and the amounts of those invoices.
- c) Maintain such records as are necessary to confirm compliance with its MBE participation obligations. These records must indicate the identity of certified minority and non-minority subcontractors employed on the Contract, type of work performed by each, and actual dollar value of work performed. Subcontract agreements documenting the work performed by all MBE participants must be retained by the Contractor and furnished to the Procurement Officer on request.
- d) Consent to provide such documentation as reasonably requested and to provide right-of-entry at reasonable times for purposes of the State's representatives verifying compliance with the MBE participation obligations. Contractor must retain all records concerning MBE participation and make them available for State inspection for three years after final completion of the Contract.
- e) Upon completion of the Contract and before final payment and release of retainage, submit a final report in affidavit form and under penalty of perjury, of all payments made to, or withheld from MBE subcontractors.

3.11 Veteran Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) Reports

If this solicitation includes a VSBE Goal (see **Section 4.27**), the Contractor shall:

- a) Submit the following reports by the 10th of the month following the reporting period to the Contract Monitor and the Department VSBE representative:
 - 1) VSBE Participation Prime Contractor Paid/Unpaid VSBE Invoice Report (Attachment E-3) listing any unpaid invoices, over 45 days old, received from any

- VSBE subcontractor, the amount of each invoice and the reason payment has not been made; and
- 2) **Attachment E-4**, the VSBE Participation Subcontractor Paid/Unpaid VSBE Invoice Report by the 10th of the month following the reporting period to the Contract Monitor and the VSBE Liaison Officer.
- b) Include in its agreements with its VSBE subcontractors a requirement that those subcontractors submit monthly by the 10th of the month following the reporting period to the Contract Monitor and Department VSBE representative a report that identifies the prime contract and lists all payments received from Contractor in the preceding reporting period month, as well as any outstanding invoices, and the amount of those invoices (**Attachment E-4**).
 - c) Maintain such records as are necessary to confirm compliance with its VSBE participation obligations. These records must indicate the identity of VSBE and non-VSBE subcontractors employed on the contract, the type of work performed by each, and the actual dollar value of work performed. The subcontract agreement documenting the work performed by all VSBE participants must be retained by the Contractor and furnished to the Procurement Officer on request.
 - d) Consent to provide such documentation as reasonably requested and to provide right-of-entry at reasonable times for purposes of the State's representatives verifying compliance with the VSBE participation obligations. The Contractor must retain all records concerning VSBE participation and make them available for State inspection for three years after final completion of the Contract.
 - e) At the option of the Department, upon completion of the Contract and before final payment and release of retainage, submit a final report in affidavit form and under penalty of perjury, of all payments made to, or withheld from VSBE subcontractors.

3.12 Work Orders

THIS SECTION IS INAPPLICABLE TO THIS MS-IFB.

3.13 Additional Clauses

3.13.1 No-Cost Extensions

In accordance with BPW Advisory 1995-1 item 7.b, in the event there are unspent funds remaining on the Contract, prior to the Contract's expiration date the Procurement Officer may modify the Contract to extend the Contract beyond its expiration date for a period up to, but not exceeding, one-third of the base term of the Contract (e.g., eight-month extension on a two-year contract) for the performance of work within the Contract's scope of work. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, no funds may be added to the Contract in connection with any such extension.

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4 Procurement Instructions

4.1 Pre-Bid Conference

- 4.1.1 A pre-Bid conference (Conference) will be held at the date, time, and location indicated on the Key Information Summary Sheet.
- 4.1.2 Attendance at the Conference is not mandatory, but all interested parties are encouraged to attend in order to facilitate better preparation of their Bids. If the solicitation includes an MBE goal, failure to attend the Conference will be taken into consideration as part of the evaluation of a bidder's good faith efforts if there is a waiver request.
- 4.1.3 It is highly recommended that ALL Prime Contractors bring their intended subcontractors to the Conference/Site Visit to ensure that all parties understand the requirements of the contract and the MBE Goal.
- 4.1.4 MBE subcontractors are encouraged to attend the Conference to market their participation to potential prime Contractors.
- 4.1.5 Following the Conference, the attendance record and summary of the Conference will be distributed via the same mechanism described for amendments and questions (see Section 4.2.1 eMMA).
- 4.1.6 Attendees should bring a copy of the solicitation and a business card to help facilitate the sign-in process.
- 4.1.7 In order to assure adequate seating and other accommodations at the Conference, please e-mail the Pre-Bid Conference Response Form (**Attachment A**) no later than the time and date indicated on the form. In addition, if there is a need for sign language interpretation or other special accommodations due to a disability, please notify the Procurement Officer at least five (5) Business Days prior to the Conference date. The Department will make a reasonable effort to provide such special accommodation.
- 4.1.8 Seating at the Conference will be limited to two (2) attendees per vendor.

4.2 eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA)

- 4.2.1 eMMA is the electronic commerce system for the State of Maryland. The MS-IFB, Conference summary and attendance sheet, Bidders' questions and the Procurement Officer's responses, addenda, and other solicitation-related information will be made available via eMMA.
- 4.2.2 In order to receive a contract award, a vendor must be registered on eMMA. Registration is free. Go to <https://procurement.maryland.gov>, click on "Register" to begin the process, and then follow the prompts.

4.3 Questions

- 4.3.1 All questions, including concerns regarding any applicable MBE or VSBE participation goals, shall identify in the subject line the Solicitation Number and Title and shall be submitted in writing via e-mail to the Procurement Officer at least five (5) days prior to the Bid due date. The Procurement Officer, based on the availability of time to research and communicate an answer, shall decide whether an answer can be given before the Bid due date.
- 4.3.2 Answers to all questions that are not clearly specific only to the requestor will be distributed via the same mechanism as for MS-IFB amendments, and posted on eMMA.

- 4.3.3 The statements and interpretations contained in responses to any questions, whether responded to verbally or in writing, are not binding on the Department unless it issues an amendment in writing.

4.4 Procurement Method

A Contract will be awarded in accordance with the Competitive Multi-Step Sealed Bidding method under COMAR 21.05.02.17.

4.5 Bid Due (Closing) Date and Time

- 4.5.1 Bids, in the number and form set forth in **Section 5 Bid Format**, must be received by the Procurement Officer no later than the Bid due date and time indicated on the Key Information Summary Sheet in order to be considered.
- 4.5.2 Requests for extension of this date or time shall not be granted.
- 4.5.3 Bidders submitting Bids should allow sufficient delivery time to ensure timely receipt by the Procurement Officer. Except as provided in COMAR 21.05.02.10, Bids received after the due date and time listed in the Key Information Summary Sheet will not be considered.
- 4.5.4 The date and time of an e-mail submission is determined by the date and time of arrival in the e-mail address indicated on the Key Information Summary Sheet.
- 4.5.5 Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received by the Procurement Officer before the time and date set forth in the Key Information Summary Sheet for receipt of Bids.
- 4.5.6 Bids may not be submitted by email or facsimile. Bids will be opened publicly at the date and time indicated on the Key Information Summary Sheet.
- 4.5.7 Potential Bidders not responding to this solicitation are requested to submit the “No Bid Notice/Vendor Feedback” form, which includes company information and the reason for not responding (e.g., too busy, cannot meet mandatory requirements).

4.6 Multiple or Alternate Bids

Multiple or alternate Bids will not be accepted.

4.7 Receipt, Opening and Recording of Bids

- 4.7.1.1 Upon receipt, each Bid and any timely modification(s) to a Bid shall be stored in a secure place until the time and date set for bid opening. Before Bid opening, the State may not disclose the identity of any Bidder.
- 4.7.1.2 Bids shall be opened publicly, at the time, date and place designated in the MS-IFB Key Information Summary Sheet (near the beginning of the solicitation, after the Title Page and Notice to Vendors). The name of each Bidder, the Total Bid Price, and such other information as is deemed appropriate shall be read aloud or otherwise made available and recorded at the time of bid opening.

4.8 Confidentiality of Bids / Public Information Act Notice

- 4.8.1 The Bidder should give specific attention to the clear identification of those portions of its Bid that it considers confidential and/or proprietary commercial information or trade secrets, and provide justification why such materials, upon request, should not be disclosed by the State under

the Public Information Act, Md. Code Ann., General Provisions Article, Title 4. This information should be identified by page number and placed in the Transmittal Letter with the Bid.

- 4.8.2 The Bids shall be tabulated or a Bid abstract made. The opened Bids shall be available for public inspection at a reasonable time after Bid opening, but in any case before contract award, except to the extent the Bidder designates trade secrets or other proprietary data to be confidential as set forth in this solicitation. Material so designated as confidential shall accompany the Bid and shall be readily separable from the Bid in order to facilitate public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the Bid, including the Total Bid Price.
- 4.8.3 For requests for information made under the PIA, the Procurement Officer shall examine the Bids to determine the validity of any requests for nondisclosure of trade secrets and other proprietary data identified in writing. Nondisclosure is permissible only if approved by the Office of the Attorney General.

4.9 Award Basis

- 4.9.1 A Contract shall be awarded to the responsible Bidder(s) submitting a responsive Bid with the most favorable bid price or most favorable evaluated bid price (as referenced in COMAR 21.05.02.13), after that Bidder's Technical Offer has been found to be acceptable (see COMAR 21.05.02.17), for providing the goods and services as specified in this MS-IFB. Bidders must bid all line items. Partial or incomplete bids will be rejected unless otherwise stated in the solicitation. See MS-IFB Section 6 for Bid evaluation and award information.
- 4.9.2 Award of this contract will not be final and complete until after: (1) the Contractor submits complete and satisfactory documentation required under the Contract and/or documentation required by the Procurement Officer; and (2) the Contract is signed by the Department following any required approvals of the Contract, including approval by the Board of Public Works, if such approval is required.

4.10 Tie Bids

Tie Bids will be decided pursuant to COMAR 21.05.02.14.

4.11 Duration of Bids

Bids submitted in response to this MS-IFB are irrevocable for the latest of the following: 120 days following the Bid due date and time or the date any protest concerning this MS-IFB is finally resolved. This period may be extended at the Procurement Officer's request only with the Bidder's written agreement.

4.12 Revisions to the MS-IFB

- 4.12.1 If the MS-IFB is revised before the due date for Bids, the Department shall post any addenda to the MS-IFB on eMMA and shall endeavor to provide such addenda to all prospective Bidders that were sent this MS-IFB or are otherwise known by the Procurement Officer to have obtained this MS-IFB. It remains the responsibility of all prospective Bidders to check eMMA for any addenda issued prior to the submission of Bids.
- 4.12.2 Bidders shall acknowledge the receipt of all addenda to this MS-IFB issued before the Bid due date.
- 4.12.3 Failure to acknowledge receipt of an addendum does not relieve the Bidder from complying with the terms, additions, deletions, or corrections set forth in the addendum, and may cause the Bid to be deemed not responsive.

4.13 Cancellations

- 4.13.1 The State reserves the right to cancel this MS-IFB, accept or reject any and all Bids, in whole or in part, received in response to this MS-IFB and to waive or permit the cure of minor irregularities.
- 4.13.2 In the event a government entity proposes and receives the recommendation for award, the procurement may be cancelled and the award processed in accordance with COMAR 21.01.03.01.A(4).
- 4.13.3 If the services that are the subject of the MS-IFB are currently being provided under an interagency agreement with a public institution of higher education and the State determines that the services can be provided more cost effectively by the public institution of higher education, then the MS-IFB may be cancelled in accordance with Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Art., § 3-207(b)(2).

4.14 Incurred Expenses

The State will not be responsible for any costs incurred by any Bidder in preparing and submitting a Bid or performing any other activities related to submitting a Bid in response to this solicitation.

4.15 Protest/Disputes

Any protest or dispute related to this solicitation or the Contract award shall be subject to the provisions of COMAR 21.10 (Administrative and Civil Remedies).

4.16 Bidder Responsibilities

- 4.16.1 Bidders must be able to provide all goods and services and meet all of the requirements requested in this solicitation and the successful Bidder shall be responsible for Contract performance including any subcontractor participation.
- 4.16.2 If applicable, subcontractors utilized in meeting the established MBE or VSBE participation goal(s) for this solicitation shall be identified as provided in the appropriate Attachment(s) to this MS-IFB (see **Section 4.26** “MBE Participation Goal” and **Section 4.27** “VSBE Goal”).
- 4.16.3 If the Bidder is the subsidiary of another entity, all information submitted by the Bidder, including but not limited to references, financial reports, or experience and documentation (e.g. insurance policies, bonds, letters of credit) used to meet minimum qualifications, if any, shall pertain exclusively to the Bidder, unless the parent organization will guarantee the performance of the subsidiary. If applicable, the Bidder’s Bid shall contain an explicit statement, signed by an authorized representative of the parent organization, stating that the parent organization will guarantee the performance of the subsidiary.
- 4.16.4 A parental guarantee of the performance of the Bidder under this Section will not automatically result in crediting the Bidder with the experience or qualifications of the parent under any evaluation criteria pertaining to the actual Bidder’s experience and qualifications. Instead, the Bidder’s responsibility will be assessed to the extent to which the State determines that the experience and qualifications of the parent are applicable to and shared with the Bidder, any stated intent by the parent to be directly involved in the performance of the Contract, and the value of the parent’s participation as determined by the State.

4.17 Acceptance of Terms and Conditions

By submitting a Bid in response to this MS-IFB, the Bidder, if selected for award, shall be deemed to have accepted the terms and conditions of this MS-IFB and the Contract, attached hereto as Attachment M. Any exceptions to this MS-IFB or the Contract must be raised prior to Bid submission. Changes to the solicitation, including the Bid Form or Contract, made by the Bidder may result in Bid rejection.

4.18 Bid/Proposal Affidavit

A Bid submitted by the Bidder must be accompanied by a completed Bid/Proposal Affidavit. A copy of this Affidavit is included as **Attachment C** of this MS-IFB.

4.19 Contract Affidavit

All Bidders are advised that if a Contract is awarded as a result of this solicitation, the successful Bidder will be required to complete a Contract Affidavit. A copy of this Affidavit is included for informational purposes as **Attachment N** of this MS-IFB. This Affidavit must be provided within five (5) Business Days of notification of recommended award. For purposes of completing Section “B” of this Affidavit (Certification of Registration or Qualification with the State Department of Assessments and Taxation), a business entity that is organized outside of the State of Maryland is considered a “foreign” business.

4.20 Compliance with Laws/Arrearages

By submitting a Bid in response to this MS-IFB, the Bidder, if selected for award, agrees that it will comply with all federal, State, and local laws applicable to its activities and obligations under the Contract.

By submitting a response to this solicitation, each Bidder represents that it is not in arrears in the payment of any obligations due and owing the State, including the payment of taxes and employee benefits, and shall not become so in arrears during the term of the Contract if selected for Contract award.

4.21 Verification of Registration and Tax Payment

Before a business entity can do business in the State, it must be registered with the State Department of Assessments and Taxation (SDAT). It is strongly recommended that any potential Bidder complete registration prior to the Bid due date and time. The Bidder’s failure to complete registration with SDAT may disqualify an otherwise successful Bidder from final consideration and recommendation for Contract award.

4.22 False Statements

Bidders are advised that Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, § 11-205.1 provides as follows:

4.22.1 In connection with a procurement contract a person may not willfully:

- a) Falsify, conceal, or suppress a material fact by any scheme or device.
- b) Make a false or fraudulent statement or representation of a material fact.
- c) Use a false writing or document that contains a false or fraudulent statement or entry of a material fact.

- 4.22.2 A person may not aid or conspire with another person to commit an act under **Section 4.22.1**.
- 4.22.3 A person who violates any provision of this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$20,000 or imprisonment not exceeding five (5) years or both.

4.23 Payments by Electronic Funds Transfer

By submitting a Bid in response to this solicitation, the Bidder, if selected for award:

- 4.23.1 Agrees to accept payments by electronic funds transfer (EFT) unless the State Comptroller's Office grants an exemption. Payment by EFT is mandatory for contracts exceeding \$200,000. The successful Bidder shall register using the COT/GAD X-10 Vendor Electronic Funds (EFT) Registration Request Form.
- 4.23.2 Any request for exemption must be submitted to the State Comptroller's Office for approval at the address specified on the COT/GAD X-10 form, must include the business identification information as stated on the form, and must include the reason for the exemption. 4.24 Prompt Payment Policy

This procurement and the Contract(s) to be awarded pursuant to this solicitation are subject to the Prompt Payment Policy Directive issued by the Governor's Office of Small, Minority & Women Business Affairs (GOSBA) and dated August 1, 2008. Promulgated pursuant to Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, §§ 11-201, 13-205(a), and Title 14, Subtitle 3, and COMAR 21.01.01.03 and 21.11.03.01, the Directive seeks to ensure the prompt payment of all subcontractors on non-construction procurement contracts. The Contractor shall comply with the prompt payment requirements outlined in the Contract, Section 31 "Prompt Pay Requirements" (see **Attachment M**). 4.25 Electronic Procurements Authorized

- 4.25.1 Under COMAR 21.03.05, unless otherwise prohibited by law, the Department may conduct procurement transactions by electronic means, including the solicitation, proposing, award, execution, and administration of a contract, as provided in Md. Code Ann., Maryland Uniform Electronic Transactions Act, Commercial Law Article, Title 21.
- 4.25.2 Participation in the solicitation process on a procurement contract for which electronic means has been authorized shall constitute consent by the Bidder to conduct by electronic means all elements of the procurement of that Contract which are specifically authorized under the solicitation or Contract. In the case of electronic transactions authorized by this MS-IFB, electronic records and signatures by an authorized representative satisfy a requirement for written submission and signatures.
- 4.25.3 "Electronic means" refers to exchanges or communications using electronic, digital, magnetic, wireless, optical, electromagnetic, or other means of electronically conducting transactions. Electronic means includes e-mail, internet-based communications, electronic funds transfer, specific electronic bidding platforms (e.g., <https://procurement.maryland.gov>), and electronic data interchange.
- 4.25.4 In addition to specific electronic transactions specifically authorized in other sections of this solicitation (e.g., MS-IFB § 4.23 describing payments by Electronic Funds Transfer), the

following transactions are authorized to be conducted by electronic means on the terms as authorized in COMAR 21.03.05:

4.25.6 Any e-mail transmission is only authorized to the e-mail addresses for the identified person as provided in the solicitation, the Contract, or in the direction from the Procurement Officer or Contract Monitor.

4.26 MBE Participation Goal

4.26.1 Establishment of Goal and Subgoals

An overall MBE subcontractor participation goal as identified in the Key Information Summary Sheet has been established for this procurement, representing a percentage of the total Contract dollar value, including all renewal option terms, if any, has been established for this procurement.

Notwithstanding any subgoals established for this MS-IFB, the Contractor is encouraged to use a diverse group of subcontractors and suppliers from any/all of the various MBE classifications to meet the remainder of the overall MBE participation goal.

By submitting a response to this solicitation, the Bidder acknowledges the overall MBE subcontractor participation goal and subgoals, and commits to achieving the overall goal and subgoals by utilizing certified minority business enterprises, or requests a full or partial waiver of the overall goal and subgoals.

A Bidder that does not commit to meeting the entire MBE participation goal outlined in this Section 4.26 must submit a request for waiver with its bid submission that is supported by good faith efforts documentation to meet the MBE goal made prior to submission of its Bid as outlined in Attachment D-1B, Waiver Guidance. Failure of a Bidder to properly complete, sign, and submit Attachment D-1A at the time it submits its Bid(s) to the MS-IFB will result in the State's rejection of the Bidder's Bid for the applicable Service Category. This failure is not curable.

The Bidder shall include with its Bid a completed MBE Utilization and Fair Solicitation Affidavit (**Attachment D-1A**) whereby:

1. The Bidder acknowledges the certified MBE participation goal and commits to make a good faith effort to achieve the goal and any applicable subgoals, or requests a waiver, and affirms that MBE subcontractors were treated fairly in the solicitation process; and
2. The Bidder responds to the expected degree of MBE participation, as stated in the solicitation, by identifying the specific commitment of certified MBEs at the time of Bid submission. The Bidder shall specify the percentage of total contract value associated with each MBE subcontractor identified on the MBE participation schedule, including any work performed by the MBE prime (including a prime participating as a joint venture) to be counted towards meeting the MBE participation goals.

3. The Bidder requesting a waiver should review **Attachment D-1B** (Waiver Guidance) and **D-1C** (Good Faith Efforts Documentation to Support Waiver Request) prior to submitting its request.

- 4.26.6 The Bidder that requested a waiver of the goal or any of the applicable subgoals will be responsible for submitting the Good Faith Efforts Documentation to Support Waiver Request (**Attachment D-1C**) and all documentation within ten (10) Business Days from notification that it is the recommended awardee or from the date of the actual award, whichever is earlier, as required in COMAR 21.11.03.11.
- 4.26.7 All documents, including the MBE Utilization and Fair Solicitation Affidavit & MBE Participation Schedule (**Attachment D-1A**), completed and submitted by the Bidder in connection with its certified MBE participation commitment shall be considered a part of the Contract and are hereby expressly incorporated into the Contract by reference thereto. All of the referenced documents will be considered a part of the Bid for order of precedence purposes (see Contract – **Attachment M, Section 2.1**).
- 4.26.8 The Bidder is advised that liquidated damages will apply in the event the Contractor fails to comply in good faith with the requirements of the MBE program and pertinent Contract provisions. (See Contract – **Attachment M, Liquidated Damages for MBE, section 39**).

4.26.9 As set forth in COMAR 21.11.03.12-1(D), when a certified MBE firm participates on a contract as a prime contractor (including a joint-venture where the MBE firm is a partner), a procurement agency may count the distinct, clearly defined portion of the work of the contract that the certified MBE firm performs with its own work force towards fulfilling up to fifty-percent (50%) of the MBE participation goal (overall) and up to one hundred percent (100%) of not more than one of the MBE participation subgoals, if any, established for the contract.

4.27.2 VSBE Goal

- a) A VSBE participation goal of the total Contract dollar amount has been established for this procurement as identified in the Key Information Summary Sheet.
- b) By submitting a response to this solicitation, the Bidder agrees that this percentage of the total dollar amount of the Contract will be performed by verified veteran-owned small business enterprises.

4.27.3 Solicitation and Contract Formation

- d) In accordance with COMAR 21.11.13.05 C (1), this solicitation requires Bidders to:
 - 1) Identify specific work categories within the scope of the procurement appropriate for subcontracting;
 - 2) Solicit VSBEs before Bids are due, describing the identified work categories and providing instructions on how to bid on the subcontracts;
 - 3) Attempt to make personal contact with the VSBEs solicited and to document these attempts;
 - 4) Assist VSBEs to fulfill, or to seek waiver of, bonding requirements; and

- 5) Attempt to attend pre-Bid or other meetings the procurement agency schedules to publicize contracting opportunities to VSBEs.

The Bidder must include with its Bid a completed VSBE Utilization Affidavit and Prime/Subcontractor Participation Schedule (**Attachment E-1**) whereby the Bidder:

- 6) Acknowledges it: a) intends to meet the VSBE participation goal; or b) requests a full or partial waiver of the VSBE participation goal. If the Bidder commits to the full VSBE goal or requests a partial waiver, it shall commit to making a good faith effort to achieve the stated goal; and
- 7) Responds to the expected degree of VSBE participation as stated in the solicitation, by identifying the specific commitment of VSBEs at the time of Bid submission. The Bidder shall specify the percentage of contract value associated with each VSBE prime/subcontractor identified on the VSBE Participation Schedule.

A Bidder must properly complete and submit a separate Attachment E-1, VSBE Utilization Affidavit and Prime/Subcontractor Participation Schedule, for EACH Service Category (I) for which it is submitting a Bid. If a Bidder is submitting a Bid for each of Service Categories I.

As set forth in COMAR 21.11.13.05.B(2), when a verified VSBE firm participates on a Contract as a Prime Contractor, a procurement agency may count the distinct, clearly defined portion of the work of the contract that the VSBE Prime Contractor performs with its own work force towards meeting up to one hundred percent (100%) of the VSBE goal.

In order to receive credit for self-performance, a VSBE Prime must list its firm in the VSBE Prime/Subcontractor Participation Schedule (**Attachment E-1**) and include information regarding the work it will self-perform. For any remaining portion of the VSBE goal that is not to be performed by the VSBE Prime, the VSBE Prime must also identify verified VSBE subcontractors used to meet the remainder of the goal.

Within 10 Business Days from notification that it is the apparent awardee, the awardee must provide the following documentation to the Procurement Officer:

- 8) VSBE Project Participation Statement (**Attachment E-2**);
- 9) If the apparent awardee believes a full or partial waiver of the overall VSBE goal is necessary, it must submit a fully-documented waiver request that complies with COMAR 21.11.13.07; and
- 10) Any other documentation required by the Procurement Officer to ascertain Bidder responsibility in connection with the VSBE participation goal.

If the apparent awardee fails to return each completed document within the required time, the Procurement Officer may determine that the apparent awardee is not responsible.

4.28 Living Wage Requirements

- A. Maryland law requires that contractors meeting certain conditions pay a living wage to covered employees on State service contracts over \$100,000. Maryland Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, § 18-101 et al. The Commissioner of Labor and Industry at the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation requires that a contractor subject to the Living Wage law submit payroll records for covered employees and a signed statement indicating that it paid a living wage to covered employees; or receive a waiver from Living Wage reporting requirements. See COMAR 21.11.10.05.

- B. If subject to the Living Wage law, Contractor agrees that it will abide by all Living Wage law requirements, including but not limited to reporting requirements in COMAR 21.11.10.05. Contractor understands that failure of Contractor to provide such documents is a material breach of the terms and conditions and may result in Contract termination, disqualification by the State from participating in State contracts, and other sanctions. Information pertaining to reporting obligations may be found by going to the Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (DLLR) website <http://www.dllr.state.md.us/labor/prev/livingwage.shtml>.
- C. Additional information regarding the State's living wage requirement is contained in **Attachment F**. Bidders must complete and submit the Maryland Living Wage Requirements Affidavit of Agreement (**Attachment F-1**) with their Bids. If the Bidder fails to complete and submit the required documentation, the State may determine the Bidder to not be responsible under State law.
- D. Contractors and subcontractors subject to the Living Wage Law shall pay each covered employee at least the minimum amount set by law for the applicable Tier area. The specific living wage rate is determined by whether a majority of services take place in a Tier 1 Area or a Tier 2 Area of the State. The specific Living Wage rate is determined by whether a majority of services take place in a Tier 1 Area or Tier 2 Area of the State.
- 1) The Tier 1 Area includes Montgomery, Prince George's, Howard, Anne Arundel and Baltimore Counties, and Baltimore City. The Tier 2 Area includes any county in the State not included in the Tier 1 Area. In the event that the employees who perform the services are not located in the State, the head of the unit responsible for a State Contract pursuant to §18-102(d) of the State Finance and Procurement Article shall assign the tier based upon where the recipients of the services are located. If the Contractor provides more than 50% of the services from an out-of-State location, the State agency determines the wage tier based on where the majority of the service recipients are located. In this circumstance, the Contract will be determined to be a Tier (enter "1" or "2," depending on where the majority of the service recipients are located) Contract.
 - 2) The Contract will be determined to be a Tier 1 Contract or a Tier 2 Contract depending on the location(s) from which the Contractor provides 50% or more of the services. The Bidder must identify in its Bid the location(s) from which services will be provided, including the location(s) from which 50% or more of the Contract services will be provided.
 - 3) If the Contractor provides 50% or more of the services from a location(s) in a Tier 1 jurisdiction(s) the Contract will be a Tier 1 Contract.
 - 4) If the Contractor provides 50% or more of the services from a location(s) in a Tier 2 jurisdiction(s), the Contract will be a Tier 2 Contract.
- E. Additional information regarding the State's living wage requirement is contained in **Attachment F**. Bidders must complete and submit the Maryland Living Wage Requirements Affidavit of Agreement (**Attachment F-1**) with their Bids. If the Bidder fails to complete and submit the required documentation, the State may determine the Bidder to not be responsible under State law.
- F. Contractors and subcontractors subject to the Living Wage Law shall pay each covered employee at least the minimum amount set by law for the If the Contractor provides more than 50% of the services from an out-of-State location, the State agency determines the wage

tier based on where the majority of the service recipients are located. See COMAR 21.11.10.07.

G. The Bidder shall identify in the Bid the location from which services will be provided.

NOTE: Whereas the Living Wage may change annually, the Contract price will not change because of a Living Wage change. The Contractor shall be responsible for any wage/rate increase during the term of the Contract and such increase may not be passed on to the State.

4.29 Federal Funding Acknowledgement

- 4.29.1 There are programmatic conditions that apply to this Contract due to federal funding (see Attachment G).
- 4.29.2 The total amount of federal funds allocated for the Office of Systems, Operations & Pharmacy is \$6,611,250 in Maryland State fiscal year 2020. This represents 75% of all funds budgeted for the unit in that fiscal year. This does not necessarily represent the amount of funding available for any particular grant, contract, or solicitation.
- 4.29.3 This Contract contains federal funds. The source of these federal funds is: Medicaid Title XIX. The CFDA number is 93-778. The conditions that apply to all federal funds awarded by the Department are contained in Federal Funds **Attachment G**. Any additional conditions that apply to this particular federally-funded contract are contained as supplements to Federal Funds **Attachment G** and Bidders are to complete and submit these Attachments with their Bids as instructed in the Attachments. Acceptance of this agreement indicates the Bidder's intent to comply with all conditions which are part of this Contract.

4.30 Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure

- 4.30.1 The Bidder shall complete and sign the Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure (**Attachment H**) and submit it with its Bid.
- 4.30.2 By submitting a Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure, the Contractor shall be construed as certifying all Contractor Personnel and subcontractors are also without a conflict of interest as defined in COMAR 21.05.08.08A.
- 4.30.3 Additionally, a Contractor has an ongoing obligation to ensure that all Contractor Personnel are without conflicts of interest prior to providing services under the Contract. For policies and procedures applying specifically to Conflict of Interests, the Contract is governed by COMAR 21.05.08.08.
- 4.30.4 Participation in Drafting of Specifications: Disqualifying Event: Bidders are advised that Md. Code Ann. State Finance and Procurement Article §13-212.1(a) provides generally that "an individual who assists an executive unit in the drafting of specifications, an invitation for bids, a request for proposals for a procurement, or the selection or award made in response to an invitation for bids or a request for proposals, or a person that employs the individual, may not: (1) submit a bid or proposal for that procurement; or (2) assist or represent another person, directly or indirectly, who is submitting a bid or proposal for that procurement." Any Bidder submitting a Bid in violation of this provision shall be classified as "not responsible."

4.31 Non-Disclosure Agreement

4.31.1 Non-Disclosure Agreement (Bidder)

A Non-Disclosure Agreement (Bidder) is not required for this procurement.

4.31.2 Non-Disclosure Agreement (Contractor)

All Bidders are advised that this solicitation and any Contract(s) are subject to the terms of the Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) contained in this solicitation as **Attachment I**. This Agreement must be provided within five (5) Business Days of notification of recommended award; however, to expedite processing, it is suggested that this document be completed and submitted with the Bid.

4.32 HIPAA - Business Associate Agreement

Based on the determination by the Department that the functions to be performed in accordance with this solicitation constitute Business Associate functions as defined in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), the recommended awardee shall execute a Business Associate Agreement as required by HIPAA regulations at 45 C.F.R. §164.500 *et seq.* and set forth in **Attachment J**. This Agreement must be provided within five (5) Business Days of notification of proposed Contract award. However, to expedite processing, it is suggested that this document be completed and submitted with the Bid. Should the Business Associate Agreement not be submitted upon expiration of the five (5) Business Day period as required by this solicitation, the Procurement Officer, upon review of the Office of the Attorney General and approval of the Secretary, may withdraw the recommendation for award and make the award to the responsible Bidder with the next highest overall-ranked Bid.

4.33 Nonvisual Access

This solicitation does not contain Information Technology (IT) provisions requiring Nonvisual Access.

4.34 Mercury and Products That Contain Mercury

This solicitation does not include the procurement of products known to likely include mercury as a component.

4.35 Location of the Performance of Services Disclosure

The Bidder is required to complete the Location of the Performance of Services Disclosure. A copy of this Disclosure is included as **Attachment L**. The Disclosure must be provided with the Bid.

4.36 Department of Human Services (DHS) Hiring Agreement

All Bidders are advised that if a Contract is awarded as a result of this solicitation, the successful Bidder will be required to complete a DHS Hiring Agreement. A copy of this Agreement is included as **Attachment O**. This Agreement must be provided within five (5) Business Days of notification of recommended award.

4.37 Small Business Reserve (SBR) Procurement

This solicitation is not designated as a Small Business Reserve (SBR) Procurement.

4.38 Maryland Healthy Working Families Act Requirements

On February 11, 2018, the Maryland Healthy Working Families Act went into effect. All offerors should be aware of how this Act could affect your potential contract award with the State of Maryland. 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5 Bid Format

5.1 Three Part Submission

Bids shall be submitted in the following manner:

- a. A Technical Offer, including any sample(s) if appropriate, but not including any Bid pricing/cost information (see Section 5.2),
- b. A Technical Offer Test File including all test files documentation (see Section 5.2); and
- c. A Bid Price Form including all Bid pricing/cost information (see Section 5.4)

5.2 Technical Offer

5.2.1 Bidders shall include the following technical description or samples of their services, equipment, staffing or products.

- a) Minimum of one (1) year **of current continuous experience** providing Data Entry services with at least the most recent year of service comparable to that required in this solicitation.
- b) Demonstration of **minimum qualified Data Entry staff (at least 20)** to process estimated volume of work within required time frames.
- c) Work location no greater than **250 road miles** from MDH Headquarters in Baltimore.
- d) Acceptable Test File: Bidders shall create an acceptable Document test file from data on Document Samples, as provided by the Department. To be deemed acceptable, a minimum of eight test files by Document type must conform 100% to the Document specifications and produce a valid output file for the Document batch. Test files must be submitted with Bids by the Bid submission deadline. The procedure for completing the test file shall be:
 - i. MDH will provide potential Bidders with specifications for the Document types to be tested and one test batch of forms for each Document type. Data Entry Specifications for each Document type are included as Appendix 4 to this solicitation.
 - ii. Specifications detail exact requirements for record layouts including but not limited to: Total Record Length; Field Names and Sizes; Output Positions; Alpha/Numeric requirements; and, as necessary, Justification, Fill Character and No Data instructions.
 - iii. Bidders shall create electronic templates of Documents based on the specifications provided. The templates will be used by Bidders to input data from test Documents.
 - iv. Bidders shall download the test Documents from https://emma.maryland.gov/page.aspx/en/rfp/request_browse_public
 - v. Bidders shall key enter data from test Documents to templates, perform 100% verification and save Document batches to 16Gb USB Flash Drives. Each Document batch can be saved to the same 16Gb USB Flash Drive. Each file must be named using the following conventions *vendor name-document type.txt*, example is *Vendor-KDP CMS 1500.txt*. Document batches must be saved as .txt files as noted in the Definitions section – Output Format.
 - vi. For the purposes of this solicitation, the individual performing Data Entry cannot be the same individual responsible for performing verification. No individual

may verify their own Data Entry as part of meeting the 100% verification requirement.

- vii. Bidders shall submit the test Documents and 16Gb USB Flash Drives containing key-entered Documents separately from Technical Offer and Bid Price Form to the Department's designee.
- viii. MDH will conduct a two-part review of the test files submitted by each Bidder:
 - ix. Document Layout/Output Format: The first review will be a verification of the Output Format of each Document test file. Output formats of the test files will be checked by uploading/inputting each file into the appropriate application and running the application to produce an output file. If a test file fails to run after three (3) attempts, the test for that Document will be terminated and that Document file will be considered unacceptable. If a test file runs successfully, the output file will be compared against a control file and/or report for conformity to the specifications. Output files that conform 100% to the specifications will be considered passing. A minimum of eight Document output files must conform 100% to the specification in order to pass the Output Format test. In the event of award, the Contractor must have 100% conformance of all Document types to the specifications and layouts prior to the Contract start date.
 - x. Data Entry: The second review will be a check of the keyed Data Entry for accuracy and completeness. All data must be keyed exactly as it appears on the test Documents provided by the Department. The test file shall be deemed as passing if no more than one tenth of a percent (.1%) of the records in the test file contain Data Entry errors as defined in the Definitions section of this solicitation. Data entry errors may not be corrected after submission.

5.2.2 Technical Offer Requirements:

- a. The Bidder shall address each Scope of Work requirement (Section 2) in its Technical Offer and describe how its proposed services will meet or exceed the requirement(s). If the State is seeking Bidder agreement to any requirement(s), the Bidder shall state its agreement or disagreement. Any paragraph in the Technical Offer that responds to a Scope of Work (Section 2) requirement shall include an explanation of how the work will be done. Any exception to a requirement, term, or condition may result in having the Bid classified as not responsive or the Bidder deemed not responsible, and the Technical Offer determined not acceptable.
- b) Responses in the Bidder's Technical Offer should reference the organization and numbering of Sections in the IFB (ex. "Section 2.3.1 Response . . ."; "Section 2.3.2 Response . . ."; etc.) This Technical Offer organization will allow State officials to "map" Bidder responses directly to IFB requirements by Section number and will aid in the review process.
- c) The Bidder shall give a definitive description of the proposed plan to meet the requirements of the IFB, i.e., a Work Plan. It shall include the specific methodology and techniques to be used by the Bidder in providing the required services as outlined in IFB Section 2, Scope of Work. The description shall include an outline of the overall management concepts employed by the Bidder and a project management plan, including project control mechanisms and overall timelines. Project deadlines considered contract deliverables must be recognized in the Work Plan.
- d) The Bidder must provide a draft Problem Escalation Procedure (PEP) that includes, at a minimum, titles of individuals to be contacted by the Department's Contract Monitor should

problems arise under the Contract and explain how problems with work under the Contract will be escalated in order to resolve any issues in a timely manner. Final procedures must be submitted.

- e) The Bidder shall identify the location(s) in which it proposes to provide the services, including, if applicable, any current facilities that it operates, and any required construction to satisfy the State's requirements as outlined in this MS-IFB.

5.2.3 Technical Offers will not be opened publicly, but will be opened in the presence of at least two (2) State employees. Technical Offers will then be reviewed. Prior to the Bid Price Form opening, Technical Offers will be shown only to State employees and members of the review committee with a legitimate interest in them.

5.2.4 Technical Criteria. The following criteria shall determine the acceptability of each item listed or provided under Section 5.4.3 "Technical Offer Requirements." All criteria are pass/fail. Technical Offers not passing but meeting all of the following criteria shall be deemed not acceptable.

- i. Proof of one (1) year current continuous Data Entry experience.
 - ii. Qualified Data Entry staff (at least 20) adequate to process the typical volume of work within the timelines required under this solicitation as noted in the Scope of Work
 - iii. Location within 250 road miles of MDH Headquarters.
 - iv. Test files for a minimum of eight (8) Document types must conform 100% with the Document specifications and produce a valid output file in .txt file format for each Document batch.
 - v. Data key entry with Error Rate no greater than .1% of the records in the test file.
- b. After Technical Offers have been reviewed, Bidders whose Technical Offers are determined not to be acceptable, based upon the technical criteria as set forth in Section 5.2.4 , will be notified in writing that their Bids are not acceptable and being rejected. Included with the rejection notice, the unopened Bid Form will also be returned. Bid Forms from only those Bidders whose Technical Offers have been found acceptable shall be opened at the date, time, and place specified in the Key Information Summary Sheet.

5.3 Labeling

Each Bidder is required to label the sealed Bid with the MS-IFB title and number (and either "Technical", "Technical Test File" or "Bid Price Form") as appropriate. Affix the following to the outside of the sealed Technical Test File label bearing:

- o MS-IFB title and MDH OPASS number,
- o Name and address of Bidder,
- o Closing date and time of receipt of Bids
- o Include name, email address and telephone number of a contact person

5.4 Bid Price Form

The Bid shall contain all price information in the format specified on the Bid Form. The Bidder shall complete the Bid Form only as provided in the Bid Pricing Instructions and the Bid Form. Do not amend,

alter, or leave blank any items on the Bid Form or include additional clarifying or contingent language on or attached to the Bid Form. Failure to adhere to any of these instructions may result in the Bid being determined to be non-responsive and rejected by the Department.

5.5 Required Bid Submission

A Bidder shall include the following with its Bid:

- 5.5.1 **Bidder Information Sheet** (see **Appendix 2**).
- 5.5.2 **Acknowledgement** of all addenda to this MS-IFB.
- 5.5.3 **Technical Offer** (see Section 5.2).
- 5.5.4 **Minimum Qualification Documentation.** The Bidder shall submit any Minimum Qualifications documentation that may be required, as set forth in MS-IFB **Section 1**. If references are required in MS-IFB **Section 1**, those references shall be submitted in this section and shall contain the information described in **Section 1**.
- 5.5.5 **Completed Required Attachments.** Submit three (3) copies of each with original signatures:
 - 1) Completed Bid Form (**Attachment B**).
 - 2) Completed Bid Affidavit (**Attachment C**).
 - 3) Completed Maryland Living Wage Requirements Affidavit of Agreement (**Attachment F-1**).
- 5.5.6 **Additional Document *If Required.** Submit three (3) copies of each with original signatures, if required. *See appropriate MS-IFB section to determine whether the document is required for this procurement.
 - 1) A Signed Statement from the Bidder's Parent Organization Guaranteeing Performance of the Bidder. *see MS-IFB section 4.16
 - 2) Completed MDOT Certified MBE Utilization and Fair Solicitation Affidavit (**Attachment D-1A**) *see MS-IFB section 4.26
 - 3) Completed Federal Funds Attachment (**Attachment G**) *see MS-IFB section 4.29
 - 4) Completed Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure (**Attachment H**) *see MS-IFB section 4.30
 - 5) Completed Mercury Affidavit (**Attachment K**) *see MS-IFB section 4.34
 - 6) Completed Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) Utilization Affidavit and Prime/Subcontractor Participation Schedule (**Attachment E-1**) *see MS-IFB section 4.27
 - 7) Completed Location of the Performance of Services Disclosure (**Attachment L**) *see MS-IFB section 4.35.
- 5.5.7 **References.** At least three (3) references are requested from customers who are capable of documenting the Bidder's ability to provide the goods and services specified in this MS-IFB. References used to meet any Minimum Qualifications (see MS-IFB **Section 1**) may be used to meet this request. Each reference shall be from a client for whom the Bidder has provided goods and services within the past five (5) years and shall include the following information:
 - 1) Name of client organization;
 - 2) Name, title, telephone number, and e-mail address, if available, of point of contact for client organization; and

- 3) Value, type, duration, and description of goods and services provided.

The Department reserves the right to request additional references or utilize references not provided by the Bidder. Points of contact must be accessible and knowledgeable regarding Bidder performance.

- 5.5.8 **List of Current or Prior State Contracts.** Provide a list of all contracts with any entity of the State of Maryland for which the Bidder is currently performing goods and services or for which services have been completed within the last five (5) years. For each identified contract, the Bidder is to provide:

- 1) The State contracting entity;
- 2) A brief description of the goods and services provided;
- 3) The dollar value of the contract;
- 4) The term of the contract;
- 5) The State employee contact person (name, title, telephone number, and, if possible, e-mail address); and
- 6) Whether the contract was terminated before the end of the term specified in the original contract, including whether any available renewal option was not exercised.

Information obtained regarding the Bidder's level of performance on State contracts will be used by the Procurement Officer to determine the responsibility of the Bidder and considered as part of the experience and past performance evaluation criteria of the MS-IFB.

- 5.5.9 **Financial Capability.** The Bidder must include in its Bid a commonly-accepted method to prove its fiscal integrity. If available, the Bidder shall include Financial Statements, preferably a Profit and Loss (P&L) statement and a Balance Sheet, for the last two (2) years (independently audited preferred).

In addition, the Bidder may supplement its response to this Section by including one or more of the following with its response:

- 1) Dun & Bradstreet Rating;
- 2) Standard and Poor's Rating;
- 3) Lines of credit;
- 4) Evidence of a successful financial track record; and
- 5) Evidence of adequate working capital.

- 5.5.10 **Certificate of Insurance.** The Bidder shall provide a copy of its current certificate of insurance showing the types and limits of insurance in effect as of the Bid submission date. The current insurance types and limits do not have to be the same as described in **Section 3.6**. See **Section 3.6** for the required insurance certificate submission for the apparent awardee.

- 5.5.11 **Subcontractors.** The Bidder shall provide a complete list of all subcontractors that will work on the Contract if the Bidder receives an award, including those utilized in meeting the MBE and VSBE subcontracting goal(s), if applicable. This list shall include a full description of the duties each subcontractor will perform and why/how each subcontractor was deemed the most qualified for this project. If applicable, subcontractors utilized in meeting the established MBE or VSBE participation goal(s) for this solicitation shall be identified as provided in the appropriate attachment(s) of this MS-IFB.

- 5.5.12 **Legal Action Summary.** This summary shall include:

- 1) A statement as to whether there are any outstanding legal actions or potential claims against the Bidder and a brief description of any action;
- 2) A brief description of any settled or closed legal actions or claims against the Bidder over the past five (5) years;
- 3) A description of any judgments against the Bidder within the past five (5) years, including the court, case name, complaint number, and a brief description of the final ruling or determination; and
- 4) In instances where litigation is ongoing and the Bidder has been directed not to disclose information by the court, provide the name of the judge and location of the court.

5.5 Reciprocal Preference

Although Maryland law does not generally authorize procuring units to favor resident Bidders in awarding procurement contracts, many other states do grant their resident businesses preferences over Maryland contractors. Therefore, COMAR 21.05.01.04 permits procuring units to apply a reciprocal preference in favor of a Maryland resident business under the following conditions:

- The Maryland resident business is a responsible Bidder;
- The most advantageous Bid is from a responsible Bidder whose principal office or principal operations through which it would provide the services required under this IFB is in another state;
- The other state gives a preference to its resident businesses through law, policy, or practice; and
- The Maryland resident preference does not conflict with a federal law or grant affecting the procurement Contract.

The preference given shall be identical to the preference that the other state, through law, policy, or practice gives to its resident businesses.

5.6 Delivery

5.6.1 Bids delivered by facsimile shall not be considered.

5.6.2 Provide no pricing information in the Technical Offer. Provide no pricing information on the media submitted in the Technical Offer.

5.6.3 Bidders may submit Bids by electronic means as described.

A. Electronic means includes e-mail to the Procurement Officer address listed on the Key Information Summary Sheet.

B. Any Bidder wishing to deliver a hard copy (paper) Bid shall contact the Procurement Officer for instructions.

5.6.4 E-mail submissions

A. All Bid e-mails shall be sent with password protection.

B. The Procurement Officer will not accept submissions after the date and exact time stated in the Key Information Summary Sheet. The date and time of submission is determined by the date and time of arrival in the Procurement Officer's e-mail box. Time stamps on outgoing

email from Contractors shall not be accepted. Requests for extension of this date or time will not be granted. Except as provided in COMAR 21.05.02.10, Bids received by the Procurement Officer after the due date will not be considered.

- C. The State has established the following procedure to restrict access to Bids received electronically: all Bid documents must be password protected, and the password for the Technical Offer must be different from the password for the Bid Price Form. Bidders will provide these two passwords to MDH upon request or their Bid will be deemed not susceptible for award. Subsequent submissions of Bid content will not be allowed.
- D. The Procurement Officer will only contact those Bidders with Technical Offers that are reasonably susceptible for award.
- E. Bids submitted via e-mail must not exceed 25 Mb. If a submission exceeds this size, split the submission into two or more parts and include the appropriate part number in the subject (e.g., part 1 of 2) after the subject line information below.
- F. The e-mail submission subject line shall state the MS-IFB Title and MDH OPASS Number (and either "Technical Offer" or "Bid Price Form").

5.6.5 Three Part Submission:

A. Technical Offer consisting of:

- 1. Technical Offer and all supporting material in Microsoft Word format, version 2007 or greater,
- 2. Technical Offer in searchable Adobe PDF format,
- 3. a second searchable Adobe PDF copy of the Technical Offer with confidential and proprietary information redacted (see Section 4.8), and

B. Bid Price Form consisting of:

- 1. Bid Price Form and all supporting material in Excel format,
- 2. Bid Price Form in searchable Adobe PDF format,
- 3. a second searchable Adobe PDF copy of the Bid Price Form, with confidential and proprietary information removed (see Section 4.8).

C. Technical Offer Test File consisting of:

- 1. Technical Offer Test File shall be submitted separately from their bids Technical Offer and Bid Price Form to the Department designee,
- 2. Technical Offer Test File shall be submitted by hand or by mail to the address provided in the Key Information Summary Sheet.
 - a) Any Bids received at the appropriate mailroom, or typical place of mail receipt, for the respective procuring unit by the time and date listed in the MS-IFB will be deemed to be timely. The State recommends a delivery method for which both the date and time of receipt can be verified.

b) For hand-delivery, Offerors are advised to secure a dated, signed, and time-stamped (or otherwise indicated) receipt of delivery. Hand-delivery includes delivery by commercial carrier acting as agent for the Offeror.

3. Technical Offer Test File that include all supporting material saved on a 16Gb USB Flash Drive containing key-entered Documents shall be placed in a separate, sealed envelope or other appropriate packaging, with labels indicating “Technical Offer Test File

” as appropriate (see Section 5.3).

5.7 Documents Required upon Notice of Recommendation for Contract Award

Upon receipt of a notification of recommendation for contract award, the following documents shall be completed and submitted by the recommended awardee within five (5) business days, unless noted otherwise. Submit three (3) copies of each of the following documents:

- A. Signed contract (Attachment M),
- B. Completed Contract Affidavit (Attachment N),
- C. Completed MBE Attachments D-2 and D-3A and B, within ten (10) Business days, if applicable; see MS-IFB Section 4.26,
- D. MBE waiver justification within ten (10) Business days (see MBE Waiver Guidance and forms in Attachments D-1B and D-1C), if a waiver has been requested (if applicable; see MS-IFB Section 4.26),
- E. Completed VSBE Attachment E-2, if applicable see MS-IFB Section 4.27,
- F. Signed Non-Disclosure Agreement (Attachment I), if applicable; see MS-IFB Section 4.31,
- G. Signed HIPAA Business Associate Agreement (Attachment J), if applicable; see MS-IFB Section 4.32,
- H. Completed DHR Hiring Agreement, Attachment O, if applicable see MS-IFB Section 4.36, and
- I. Copy of a current certificate of insurance with the prescribed limits set forth in MS-IFB Section 3.6 “Insurance Requirements,” listing the State as an Additional Insured, if applicable; see MS-IFB Section 3.6.

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6 Bid Evaluation and Award

6.1 Bid Evaluation Criteria

The Bids will be evaluated based on the Total Bid Price after review of applicable Bidders that submit and complete all requirements found in Section 5.4.3 Technical Offer, as per COMAR 21.02.13. All responsible Bidders will be ranked from the lowest (most advantageous) to the highest (least advantageous) price based on the Total Bid Price as submitted on the **Attachment B** - Bid Form.

6.2 Reciprocal Preference

- 6.2.1 Although Maryland law does not authorize procuring agencies to favor resident Bidders in awarding procurement contracts, many other states do grant their resident businesses preferences over Maryland contractors. COMAR 21.05.01.04 permits procuring agencies to apply a reciprocal preference under the following conditions:
- a) The Maryland resident business is a responsible Bidder;
 - b) The lowest responsive Bid is from a responsible Bidder whose principal office, or principal base of operations is in another state;
 - c) The other state gives a preference to its resident businesses through law, policy, or practice; and
 - d) The preference does not conflict with a federal law or grant affecting the procurement Contract.
- 6.2.2 The preference given shall be identical to the preference that the other state, through law, policy, or practice gives to its + businesses.

6.3 Award Determination

Award will be made to the responsible Bidder who submits to the State the responsive Bid that meets the requirements in Section 5.4.3 and that has the lowest Total Bid Price.

6.4 Documents Required upon Notice of Recommendation for Contract Award

Upon receipt of a Notification of Recommendation for Contract award, the apparent awardee shall complete and furnish the documents and attestations as directed in Table 1 of **Section 7 – MS-IFB Attachments and Appendices**.

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7 IFB ATTACHMENTS AND APPENDICES

A Bid submitted by the Bidder must be accompanied by the completed forms and/or affidavits identified as “with Bid” in the “When to Submit” column in Table 1 below. - A. This contract is subject to the Living Wage requirements under Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, Title 18, and the regulations proposed by the Commissioner of Labor and Industry (Commissioner). The Living Wage generally applies to a Contractor or subcontractor who performs work on a State contract for services that is valued at \$100,000 or more. An employee is subject to the Living Wage if he/she is at least 18 years old or will turn 18 during the duration of the contract; works at least 13 consecutive weeks on the State Contract and spends at least one-half of the employee's time during any work week on the State Contract.

 - (d) Services between a Unit and a County or Baltimore City.
- C. If the Unit responsible for the State contract for services determines that application of the Living Wage would conflict with any applicable Federal program, the Living Wage does not apply to the contract or program.
- D. A Contractor must not split or subdivide a State contract for services, pay an employee through a third party, or treat an employee as an independent Contractor or assign work to employees to avoid the imposition of any of the requirements of Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, Title 18.

The Commissioner shall publish any adjustments to the wage rates on the Division of Labor and Industry's website. An employer subject to the Living Wage Law must comply with the rate requirements during the initial term of the contract and all subsequent renewal periods, including any increases in the wage rate, required by the Commissioner, automatically upon the effective date of the revised wage rate.
- G. A Contractor/subcontractor who reduces the wages paid to an employee based on the employer's share of the health insurance premium, as provided in Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, §18-103(c), shall not lower an employee's wage rate below the minimum wage as set in Md. Code Ann., Labor and Employment Article, §3-413. A Contractor/subcontractor who reduces the wages paid to an employee based on the employer's share of health insurance premium shall comply with any record reporting requirements established by the Commissioner.
- H. A Contractor/subcontractor may reduce the wage rates paid under Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, §18-103(a), by no more than 50 cents of the hourly cost of the employer's contribution to an employee's deferred compensation plan. A Contractor/subcontractor who reduces the wages paid to an employee based on the employer's contribution to an employee's deferred compensation plan shall not lower the employee's wage rate below the minimum wage as set in Md. Code Ann., Labor and Employment Article, §3-413.
- I. Under Md. THIS CONTRACT (the “Contract”) is made this ____ day of _____, 20____ by and between _____ (the “Contractor”) and the STATE OF MARYLAND, acting through the Maryland Department of Health “MDH” or the “Department”

In consideration of the promises and the covenants herein contained, the adequacy and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, the parties agree as follows:

1. Definitions

In this Contract, the following words have the meanings indicated:

- 1.1 “Bid” means the Contractor’s Bid dated _____ (Bid date).
- 1.2 “COMAR” means Code of Maryland Regulations.
- 1.3 “Contractor” means the entity first named above whose principal business address is (Contractor’s primary address) and whose principal office in Maryland is (Contractor’s local address), whose Federal Employer Identification Number or Social Security Number is (Contractor’s FEIN), and whose eMaryland Marketplace Advantage vendor ID number is (eMMA Number).
- 1.4 “IFB” means the Invitation for Bids for Coding and Data Entry Services, Solicitation MDH OPASS# 20-18697 and any amendments, addenda, and attachments thereto issued in writing by the State.
- 1.5 Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) – Any legal entity certified as defined at COMAR 21.01.02.01B (54) which is certified by the Maryland Department of Transportation under COMAR 21.11.03.
- 1.6 “State” means the State of Maryland.
- 1.7 “Veteran-owned Small Business Enterprise” (VSBE) means A business that is verified by the Center for Verification and Evaluation (CVE) of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as a veteran-owned small business. See Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.11.13.
- 1.8 Capitalized terms not defined herein shall be ascribed the meaning given to them in the IFB.

2. Scope of Contract

- 2.1 The Contractor shall perform in accordance with this Contract and Exhibits A-D, which are listed below and incorporated herein by reference. If there is any conflict between this Contract and the Exhibits, the terms of the Contract shall control. If there is any conflict among the Exhibits, the following order of precedence shall determine the prevailing provision:

Exhibit A – The IFB

Exhibit B – The Contract Affidavit, executed by the Contractor and dated (date of Attachment C)

Exhibit C – The Bid

- 2.2 The Procurement Officer may, at any time, by written order, make unilateral changes in the work within the general scope of the Contract. No other order, statement, or conduct of the Procurement Officer or any other person shall be treated as a change or entitle the Contractor to an equitable

adjustment under this section. Except as otherwise provided in this Contract, if any change under this section causes an increase or decrease in the Contractor's cost of, or the time required for, the performance of any part of the work, whether or not changed by the order, an equitable adjustment in the Contract price shall be made and the Contract modified in writing accordingly. The Contractor must assert in writing its right to an adjustment under this section within thirty (30) days of receipt of written change order and shall include a written statement setting forth the nature and cost of such claim. No claim by the Contractor shall be allowed if asserted after final payment under this Contract. Failure to agree to an adjustment under this section shall be a dispute under the Disputes clause. Nothing in this section shall excuse the Contractor from proceeding with the Contract as changed.

- 2.3 Without limiting the rights of the Procurement Officer under Section 2.2 above, the Contract may be modified by mutual agreement of the parties, provided: (a) the modification is made in writing; (b) all parties sign the modification; and (c) all approvals by the required agencies as described in COMAR Title 21, are obtained.

3. Period of Performance

- 3.1 The term of this Contract begins on the date the Contract is signed by the Department following any required prior approvals, including approval by the Board of Public Works, if such approval is required (the "Effective Date") and shall continue until _____ ("Initial Term").
- 3.2 In its sole discretion, the Department shall have the unilateral right to extend the Contract for three successive one-year renewal options (each a "Renewal Term") at the prices established in the Contract. "Term" means the Initial Term and any Renewal Term(s).
- 3.3. The Contractor's performance under the Contract shall commence as of the date provided in a written NTP.
- 3.4 The Contractor's obligation to pay invoices to subcontractors providing products/services in connection with this Contract, as well as the audit; confidentiality; document retention; patents, copyrights & intellectual property; warranty; indemnification obligations; and limitations of liability under this Contract; and any other obligations specifically identified, shall survive expiration or termination of the Contract.

4. Consideration and Payment

- 4.1 In consideration of the satisfactory performance of the work set forth in this Contract, the Department shall pay the Contractor in accordance with the terms of this Contract and at the prices quoted in the Bid. Unless properly modified (see above Section 2), payment to the Contractor pursuant to this Contract, including the Initial Term and any Renewal Term, shall not exceed the Contracted amount.

The total payment under a fixed price Contract or the fixed price element of a combined fixed price – time and materials Contract shall be the firm fixed price submitted by the Contractor in its Bid.

For time and materials Contracts, IDIQ Contracts, or Contracts which include either or both a time and materials or IDIQ element(s), total payments to the Contractor pursuant to this Contract for the time and materials and IDIQ portion(s) may not exceed \$ _____ (the "NTE Amount"), which includes \$ _____ for the Initial Term and \$ _____ for the Renewal Term(s).

Contractor shall notify the Contract Monitor, in writing, at least sixty (60) days before payments reach the NTE Amount. After notification by the Contractor, if the State fails to increase the Contract amount, the Contractor shall have no obligation to perform under this Contract after payments reach the stated amount; provided, however, that, prior to the stated amount being

reached, the Contractor shall: (a) promptly consult and work in good faith with the Department to establish a plan of action to assure that every reasonable effort is undertaken by the Contractor to complete State-defined critical work in progress prior to the date the NTE Amount will be reached; and (b) when applicable secure databases, systems, platforms, and applications on which the Contractor is working in an industry standard manner so as to prevent damage or vulnerabilities to any of the same due to the existence of any such unfinished work.

- 4.2 Unless a payment is unauthorized, deferred, delayed, or set-off under COMAR 21.02.07, payments to the Contractor pursuant to this Contract shall be made no later than 30 days after the Department's receipt of a proper invoice from the Contractor as required by IFB section 3.3.

The Contractor may be eligible to receive late payment interest at the rate of 9% per annum if:

- (1) The Contractor submits an invoice for the late payment interest within thirty days after the date of the State's payment of the amount on which the interest accrued; and
- (2) A contract claim has not been filed under State Finance and Procurement Article, Title 15, Subtitle 2, Annotated Code of Maryland.

The State is not liable for interest:

- (1) Accruing more than one year after the 31st day after the agency receives the proper invoice; or
- (2) On any amount representing unpaid interest. Charges for late payment of invoices are authorized only as prescribed by Title 15, Subtitle 1, of the State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, or by the Public Service Commission of Maryland with respect to regulated public utilities, as applicable.

Final payment under this Contract will not be made until after certification is received from the Comptroller of the State that all taxes have been paid.

Electronic funds transfer shall be used by the State to pay Contractor pursuant to this Contract and any other State payments due Contractor unless the State Comptroller's Office grants Contractor an exemption.

- 4.3 In addition to any other available remedies, if, in the opinion of the Procurement Officer, the Contractor fails to perform in a satisfactory and timely manner, the Procurement Officer may refuse or limit approval of any invoice for payment, and may cause payments to the Contractor to be reduced or withheld until such time as the Contractor meets performance standards as established by the Procurement Officer.
- 4.4 Payment of an invoice by the Department is not evidence that services were rendered as required under this Contract.

5. Rights to Records

- 5.1 The Contractor agrees that all documents and materials including, but not limited to, software, reports, drawings, studies, specifications, estimates, tests, maps, photographs, designs, graphics, mechanical, artwork, computations, and data prepared by the Contractor for purposes of this Contract shall be the sole property of the State and shall be available to the State at any time. The State shall have the right to use the same without restriction and without compensation to the Contractor other than that specifically provided by this Contract.

- 5.2 The Contractor agrees that at all times during the term of this Contract and thereafter, works created as a Deliverable under this Contract (as defined in **Section 7.2**), and services performed under this Contract shall be “works made for hire” as that term is interpreted under U.S. copyright law. To the extent that any products created as a Deliverable under this Contract are not works made for hire for the State, the Contractor hereby relinquishes, transfers, and assigns to the State all of its rights, title, and interest (including all intellectual property rights) to all such products created under this Contract, and will cooperate reasonably with the State in effectuating and registering any necessary assignments.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall report to the Contract Monitor, promptly and in written detail, each notice or claim of copyright infringement received by the Contractor with respect to all data delivered under this Contract.
- 5.4 The Contractor shall not affix any restrictive markings upon any data, documentation, or other materials provided to the State hereunder and if such markings are affixed, the State shall have the right at any time to modify, remove, obliterate, or ignore such warnings.
- 5.5 Upon termination or expiration of the Contract, the Contractor, at its own expense, shall deliver any equipment, software or other property provided by the State to the place designated by the Procurement Officer.

6. Exclusive Use

- 6.1 The State shall have the exclusive right to use, duplicate, and disclose any data, information, documents, records, or results, in whole or in part, in any manner for any purpose whatsoever, that may be created or generated by the Contractor in connection with this Contract. If any material, including software, is capable of being copyrighted, the State shall be the copyright owner and Contractor may copyright material connected with this project only with the express written approval of the State.
- 6.2 Except as may otherwise be set forth in this Contract, Contractor shall not use, sell, sub-lease, assign, give, or otherwise transfer to any third party any other information or material provided to Contractor by the Department or developed by Contractor relating to the Contract, except as provided for in **Section 8. Confidential or Proprietary Information and Documentation**.

7. Patents, Copyrights, and Intellectual Property

- 7.1. All copyrights, patents, trademarks, trade secrets, and any other intellectual property rights existing prior to the Effective Date of this Contract shall belong to the party that owned such rights immediately prior to the Effective Date (“Pre-Existing Intellectual Property”). If any design, device, material, process, or other item provided by Contractor is covered by a patent or copyright or which is proprietary to or a trade secret of another, the Contractor shall obtain the necessary permission or license to permit the State to use such item or items pursuant to its rights granted under the Contract.
- 7.2 Except for (1) information created or otherwise owned by the Department or licensed by the Department from third parties, including all information provided by the Department to Contractor; (2) materials created by Contractor or its subcontractor(s) specifically for the State under the Contract (“Deliverables”), except for any Contractor Pre-Existing Intellectual Property included therein; and (3) the license rights granted to the State, all right, title, and interest in the intellectual property embodied in the solution, including the know-how and methods by which the solution is provided and the processes that make up the solution, will belong solely and exclusively to Contractor and its licensors, and the Department will have no rights to the same except as expressly granted in this Contract. Any SaaS Software developed by Contractor during the performance of the Contract will belong solely and exclusively to Contractor and its licensors. For all Software

- provided by the Contractor under the Contract, Contractor hereby grants to the State a nonexclusive, irrevocable, unlimited, perpetual, non-cancelable, and non-terminable right to use and make copies of the Software and any modifications to the Software. For all Contractor Pre-Existing Intellectual Property embedded in any Deliverables, Contractor grants to the State a license to use such Contractor Pre-Existing Intellectual Property in connection with its permitted use of such Deliverable. During the period between delivery of a Deliverable by Contractor and the date of payment therefor by the State in accordance with this Contract (including throughout the duration of any payment dispute discussions), subject to the terms and conditions contained herein, Contractor grants the State a royalty-free, non-exclusive, limited license to use such Deliverable and to use any Contractor Materials contained therein in accordance with this Contract.
- 7.3. Subject to the terms of **Section 10**, Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the State and its agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, costs, losses, damages, liabilities, judgments and expenses (including without limitation reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of or in connection with any third party claim that the Contractor-provided products/services infringe, misappropriate or otherwise violate any third party intellectual property rights. Contractor shall not enter into any settlement involving third party claims that contains any admission of or stipulation to any guilt, fault, liability or wrongdoing by the State or that adversely affects the State's rights or interests, without the State's prior written consent.
- 7.4. Without limiting Contractor's obligations under Section 5.3, if an infringement claim occurs, or if the State or the Contractor believes such a claim is likely to occur, Contractor (after consultation with the State and at no cost to the State): (a) shall procure for the State the right to continue using the allegedly infringing component or service in accordance with its rights under this Contract; or (b) replace or modify the allegedly infringing component or service so that it becomes non-infringing and remains compliant with all applicable specifications.
- 7.5. Except as otherwise provided herein, Contractor shall not acquire any right, title or interest (including any intellectual property rights subsisting therein) in or to any goods, Software, technical information, specifications, drawings, records, documentation, data or any other materials (including any derivative works thereof) provided by the State to the Contractor. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, the State may, in its sole and absolute discretion, grant the Contractor a license to such materials, subject to the terms of a separate writing executed by the Contractor and an authorized representative of the State as well as all required State approvals.
- 7.6. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, neither Contractor nor any of its subcontractors shall use any Software or technology in a manner that will cause any patents, copyrights or other intellectual property which are owned or controlled by the State or any of its affiliates (or for which the State or any of its subcontractors has received license rights) to become subject to any encumbrance or terms and conditions of any third party or open source license (including, without limitation, any open source license listed on <http://www.opensource.org/licenses/alphabetical>) (each an "Open Source License"). These restrictions, limitations, exclusions and conditions shall apply even if the State or any of its subcontractors becomes aware of or fails to act in a manner to address any violation or failure to comply therewith. No act by the State or any of its subcontractors that is undertaken under this Contract as to any Software or technology shall be construed as intending to cause any patents, copyrights or other intellectual property that are owned or controlled by the State (or for which the State has received license rights) to become subject to any encumbrance or terms and conditions of any open source license.
- 7.7. The Contractor shall report to the Department, promptly and in written detail, each notice or claim of copyright infringement received by the Contractor with respect to all Deliverables delivered under this Contract.

- 7.8 The Contractor shall not affix (or permit any third party to affix), without the Department's consent, any restrictive markings upon any Deliverables that are owned by the State, and if such markings are affixed, the Department shall have the right at any time to modify, remove, obliterate, or ignore such warnings.

8. Confidential or Proprietary Information and Documentation

- 8.1 Subject to the Maryland Public Information Act and any other applicable laws including, without limitation, HIPAA, the HI-TECH Act, and the Maryland Medical Records Act and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, all confidential or proprietary information and documentation relating to either party (including without limitation, any information or data stored within the Contractor's computer systems or cloud infrastructure, if applicable) shall be held in confidence by the other party. Each party shall, however, be permitted to disclose, as provided by and consistent with applicable law, relevant confidential information to its officers, agents, and Contractor Personnel to the extent that such disclosure is necessary for the performance of their duties under this Contract. Each officer, agent, and Contractor Personnel to whom any of the State's confidential information is to be disclosed shall be advised by Contractor provided that each officer, agent, and Contractor Personnel to whom any of the State's confidential information is to be disclosed shall be advised by Contractor of the obligations hereunder, and bound by, confidentiality at least as restrictive as those of set forth in this Contract..
- 8.2 The provisions of this section shall not apply to information that: (a) is lawfully in the public domain; (b) has been independently developed by the other party without violation of this Contract; (c) was already rightfully in the possession of such party; (d) was supplied to such party by a third party lawfully in possession thereof and legally permitted to further disclose the information; or (e) which such party is required to disclose by law.

9. Loss of Data

- 9.1 In the event of loss of any State data or records where such loss is due to the act or omission of the Contractor or any of its subcontractors or agents, the Contractor shall be responsible for restoring or recreating, as applicable, such lost data in the manner and on the schedule set by the Contract Monitor. The Contractor shall ensure that all data is backed up and recoverable by the Contractor. At no time shall any Contractor actions (or any failures to act when Contractor has a duty to act) damage or create any vulnerabilities in data bases, systems, platforms, and applications with which the Contractor is working hereunder.
- 9.2 In accordance with prevailing federal or state law or regulations, the Contractor shall report the loss of non-public data as directed in **IFB Section 3.7**.
- 9.3 Protection of data and personal privacy (as further described and defined in IFB Section 3.8) shall be an integral part of the business activities of the Contractor to ensure there is no inappropriate or unauthorized use of State information at any time. To this end, the Contractor shall safeguard the confidentiality, integrity and availability of State information and comply with the conditions identified in **IFB Section 3.7**.

10. Indemnification and Notification of Legal Requests

- 10.1. At its sole cost and expense, Contractor shall (i) indemnify and hold the State, its employees and agents harmless from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, suits, damages, liabilities, losses, settlements, judgments, costs and expenses (including but not limited to attorneys' fees and costs), whether or not involving a third party claim, which arise out of or relate to the Contractor's, or any of its subcontractors', performance of this Contract and (ii) cooperate, assist, and consult with the State in the defense or investigation of any such claim, demand, action or suit. Contractor shall not enter into any settlement involving third party claims that contains any admission of or

- stipulation to any guilt, fault, liability or wrongdoing by the State or that adversely affects the State's rights or interests, without the State's prior written consent.
- 10.2. The State has no obligation: (i) to provide legal counsel or defense to the Contractor or its subcontractors in the event that a suit, claim or action of any character is brought against the Contractor or its subcontractors as a result of or relating to the Contractor's obligations or performance under this Contract, or (ii) to pay any judgment or settlement of any such suit, claim or action. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Contractor shall promptly notify the Procurement Officer of any such claims, demands, actions, or suits.
- 10.3. Notification of Legal Requests. In the event the Contractor receives a subpoena or other validly issued administrative or judicial process, or any discovery request in connection with any litigation, requesting State Pre-Existing Intellectual Property, of other information considered to be the property of the State, including but not limited to State data stored with or otherwise accessible by the Contractor, the Contractor shall not respond to such subpoena, process or other legal request without first notifying the State, unless prohibited by law from providing such notice. The Contractor shall promptly notify the State of such receipt providing the State with a reasonable opportunity to intervene in the proceeding before the time that Contractor is required to comply with such subpoena, other process or discovery request. .

11. Non-Hiring of Employees

No official or employee of the State, as defined under Md. Code Ann., General Provisions Article, § 5-101, whose duties as such official or employee include matters relating to or affecting the subject matter of this Contract, shall, during the pendency and term of this Contract and while serving as an official or employee of the State, become or be an employee of the Contractor or any entity that is a subcontractor on this Contract.

12. Disputes

This Contract shall be subject to the provisions of Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, Title 15, Subtitle 2, and COMAR 21.10 (Administrative and Civil Remedies). Pending resolution of a claim, the Contractor shall proceed diligently with the performance of the Contract in accordance with the Procurement Officer's decision. Unless a lesser period is provided by applicable statute, regulation, or the Contract, the Contractor must file a written notice of claim with the Procurement Officer within thirty (30) days after the basis for the claim is known or should have been known, whichever is earlier. Contemporaneously with or within thirty (30) days of the filing of a notice of claim, but no later than the date of final payment under the Contract, the Contractor must submit to the Procurement Officer its written claim containing the information specified in COMAR 21.10.04.02.

13. Maryland Law Prevails

- 13.1 This Contract shall be construed, interpreted, and enforced according to the laws of the State of Maryland.
- 13.2 The Maryland Uniform Computer Information Transactions Act (Commercial Law Article, Title 22 of the Annotated Code of Maryland) does not apply to this Contract or any purchase order, task order, or Notice to Proceed issued thereunder, or any software, or any software license acquired hereunder.
- 13.3 Any and all references to the Maryland Code, annotated and contained in this Contract shall be construed to refer to such Code sections as are from time to time amended.

14. Nondiscrimination in Employment

The Contractor agrees: (a) not to discriminate in any manner against an employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, creed, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identification, marital status, national origin, ancestry, genetic information, or any otherwise unlawful use of characteristics, or disability of a qualified individual with a disability unrelated in nature and extent so as to reasonably preclude the performance of the employment, or the individual's refusal to submit to a genetic test or make available the results of a genetic test; (b) to include a provision similar to that contained in subsection (a), above, in any underlying subcontract except a subcontract for standard commercial supplies or raw materials; and (c) to post and to cause subcontractors to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the substance of this clause.

15. Contingent Fee Prohibition

The Contractor warrants that it has not employed or retained any person, partnership, corporation, or other entity, other than a bona fide employee or agent working for the Contractor to solicit or secure the Contract, and that the Contractor has not paid or agreed to pay any person, partnership, corporation, or other entity, other than a bona fide employee or agent, any fee or any other consideration contingent on the making of this Contract.

16. Non-Availability of Funding

If the General Assembly fails to appropriate funds or if funds are not otherwise made available for continued performance for any fiscal period of this Contract succeeding the first fiscal period, this Contract shall be canceled automatically as of the beginning of the fiscal year for which funds were not appropriated or otherwise made available; provided, however, that this will not affect either the State's or the Contractor's rights under any termination clause in this Contract. The effect of termination of the Contract hereunder will be to discharge both the Contractor and the State from future performance of the Contract, but not from their rights and obligations existing at the time of termination. The Contractor shall be reimbursed for the reasonable value of any nonrecurring costs incurred but not amortized in the price of the Contract. The State shall notify the Contractor as soon as it has knowledge that funds may not be available for the continuation of this Contract for each succeeding fiscal period beyond the first.

17. Termination for Default

If the Contractor fails to fulfill its obligations under this Contract properly and on time, or otherwise violates any provision of the Contract, the State may terminate the Contract by written notice to the Contractor. The notice shall specify the acts or omissions relied upon as cause for termination. All finished or unfinished work provided by the Contractor shall, at the State's option, become the State's property. The State shall pay the Contractor fair and equitable compensation for satisfactory performance prior to receipt of notice of termination, less the amount of damages caused by the Contractor's breach. If the damages are more than the compensation payable to the Contractor, the Contractor will remain liable after termination and the State can affirmatively collect damages. Termination hereunder, including the termination of the rights and obligations of the parties, shall be governed by the provisions of COMAR 21.07.01.11B.

18. Termination for Convenience

The performance of work under this Contract may be terminated by the State in accordance with this clause in whole, or from time to time in part, whenever the State shall determine that such termination is in the best interest of the State. The State will pay all reasonable costs associated with this Contract that the Contractor has incurred up to the date of termination, and all reasonable costs associated with termination of the Contract. However, the Contractor shall not be reimbursed for any anticipatory profits that have not been earned up to the date of termination. Termination

hereunder, including the determination of the rights and obligations of the parties, shall be governed by the provisions of COMAR 21.07.01.12A (2).

19. Delays and Extensions of Time

- 19.1 The Contractor agrees to prosecute the work continuously and diligently and no charges or claims for damages shall be made by it for any delays or hindrances from any cause whatsoever during the progress of any portion of the work specified in this Contract.
- 19.2 Time extensions will be granted only for excusable delays that arise from unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor, including but not restricted to, acts of God, acts of the public enemy, acts of the State in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, acts of another Contractor in the performance of a contract with the State, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, or delays of subcontractors or suppliers arising from unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of either the Contractor or the subcontractors or suppliers.

20. Suspension of Work

The State unilaterally may order the Contractor in writing to suspend, delay, or interrupt all or any part of its performance for such period of time as the Procurement Officer may determine to be appropriate for the convenience of the State.

21. Pre-Existing Regulations

In accordance with the provisions of Section 11-206 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, the regulations set forth in Title 21 of the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR 21) in effect on the date of execution of this Contract are applicable to this Contract.

22. Financial Disclosure

The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of Section 13-221 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, which requires that every business that enters into contracts, leases, or other agreements with the State or its agencies during a calendar year under which the business is to receive in the aggregate, \$100,000 or more, shall within 30 days of the time when the aggregate value of these contracts, leases or other agreements reaches \$100,000, file with the Secretary of State of Maryland certain specified information to include disclosure of beneficial ownership of the business.

23. Political Contribution Disclosure

The Contractor shall comply with Election Law Article, Title 14, Annotated Code of Maryland, which requires that every person that enters into a procurement contract with the State, a county, or a municipal corporation, or other political subdivision of the State, during a calendar year in which the person receives a contract with a governmental entity in the amount of \$200,000 or more, shall file with the State Board of Elections statements disclosing: (a) any contributions made during the reporting period to a candidate for elective office in any primary or general election; and (b) the name of each candidate to whom one or more contributions in a cumulative amount of \$500 or more were made during the reporting period. The statement shall be filed with the State Board of Elections: (a) before execution of a contract by the State, a county, a municipal corporation, or other political subdivision of the State, and shall cover the 24 months prior to when a contract was awarded; and (b) if the contribution is made after the execution of a contract, then twice a year, throughout the contract term, on or before: (i) May 31, to cover the six (6) month period ending April 30; and (ii) November 30, to cover the six (6) month period ending October 31. Additional

information is available on the State Board of Elections website:
http://www.elections.state.md.us/campaign_finance/index.html.

24. Retention of Records

The Contractor and subcontractors shall retain and maintain all records and documents in any way relating to this Contract for (i) three (3) years after final payment by the State hereunder, or (ii) any applicable federal or State retention requirements (such as HIPAA) or condition of award, , whichever is longer, and shall make them available for inspection and audit by authorized representatives of the State, as designated by the Procurement Officer, at all reasonable times. The Contractor shall provide copies of all documents requested by the State, including, but not limited to itemized billing documentation containing the dates, hours spent and work performed by the Contractor and its subcontractors under the Contract. All records related in any way to the Contract are to be retained for the entire time provided under this section.

25. Right to Audit

- 25.1 The State reserves the right, at its sole discretion and at any time, to perform an audit of the Contractor's performance under this Contract. An audit is defined as a planned and documented independent activity performed by qualified personnel, including but not limited to State and federal auditors, to determine by investigation, examination, or evaluation of objective evidence from data, statements, records, operations and performance practices (financial or otherwise) the Contractor's compliance with the Contract, including but not limited to adequacy and compliance with established procedures and internal controls over the services performed pursuant to the Contract.
- 25.2 Upon three (3) Business Days' notice, the State shall be provided reasonable access to Contractor's records to perform any such audits. The Department may conduct these audits with any or all of its own internal resources or by securing the services of a third party accounting or audit firm, solely at the Department's election. The Department may copy any record related to the services performed pursuant to the Contract. The Contractor agrees to fully cooperate and assist in any audit conducted by or on behalf of the State, including, by way of example only, making records and employees available as, where, and to the extent requested by the State and by assisting the auditors in reconciling any audit variances. Contractor shall not be compensated for providing any such cooperation and assistance.
- 25.3 The right to audit shall include any of the Contractor's subcontractors including but not limited to any lower tier subcontractor(s). The Contractor shall ensure the Department has the right to audit such subcontractor(s).

26. Compliance with Laws

The Contractor hereby represents and warrants that:

- a. It is qualified to do business in the State and that it will take such action as, from time to time hereafter, may be necessary to remain so qualified;
- b. It is not in arrears with respect to the payment of any monies due and owing the State, or any department or unit thereof, including but not limited to the payment of taxes and employee benefits, and that it shall not become so in arrears during the Term;
- c. It shall comply with all federal, State and local laws, regulations, and ordinances applicable to its activities and obligations under this Contract; and
- d. It shall obtain, at its expense, all licenses, permits, insurance, and governmental approvals, if any, necessary to the performance of its obligations under this Contract.

27. Cost and Price Certification

- 27.1 The Contractor, by submitting cost or price information certifies that, to the best of its knowledge, the information submitted is accurate, complete, and current as of the date of its Bid.
- 27.2 The price under this Contract and any change order or modification hereunder, including profit or fee, shall be adjusted to exclude any significant price increases occurring because the Contractor furnished cost or price information which, as of the date of its Bid, was inaccurate, incomplete, or not current.

28. Subcontracting; Assignment

The Contractor may not subcontract any of its obligations under this Contract without obtaining the prior written approval of the Procurement Officer, nor may the Contractor assign this Contract or any of its rights or obligations hereunder, without the prior written approval of the Procurement Officer, each at the State's sole and absolute discretion; provided, however, that a Contractor may assign monies receivable under a contract after written notice to the State. Any subcontracts shall include such language as may be required in various clauses contained within this Contract, exhibits, and attachments. The Contract shall not be assigned until all approvals, documents, and affidavits are completed and properly registered. The State shall not be responsible for fulfillment of the Contractor's obligations to its subcontractors.

29. Limitations of Liability

- 29.1 Contractor shall be liable for any loss or damage to the State occasioned by the acts or omissions of Contractor, its subcontractors, agents or employees as follows:
- (a) For infringement of patents, trademarks, trade secrets and copyrights as provided in **Section 7 "Patents, Copyrights, Intellectual Property"** of this Contract;
 - (b) Without limitation for damages for bodily injury (including death) and damage to real property and tangible personal property; and
 - (c) For all other claims, damages, loss, costs, expenses, suits or actions in any way related to this Contract and regardless of the basis on which the claim is made, Contractor's liability shall be unlimited.
- 29.2 Contractor's indemnification obligations for Third party claims arising under Section 6 ("Indemnification") of this Contract are included in this limitation of liability only if the State is immune from liability. Contractor's indemnification liability for third party claims arising under Section 6 of this Contract shall be unlimited if the State is not immune from liability for claims arising under Section 6.
- 29.3. In no event shall the existence of a subcontract operate to release or reduce the liability of Contractor hereunder. For purposes of this Contract, Contractor agrees that all subcontractors are agents of Contractor and Contractor is responsible for performance of the services and compliance with the relevant obligations hereunder by its subcontractors.

30. Commercial Nondiscrimination

- 30.1 As a condition of entering into this Contract, Contractor represents and warrants that it will comply with the State's Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy, as described under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. As part of such compliance, Contractor may not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, age, marital status, sexual orientation, sexual identity, genetic information or an individual's refusal to submit to a genetic test or make available the results of a genetic test or on the basis of disability, or otherwise unlawful forms of discrimination in the solicitation, selection, hiring, or commercial treatment of subcontractors, vendors, suppliers, or commercial customers, nor shall Contractor retaliate against any person for reporting instances of such discrimination. Contractor shall provide

equal opportunity for subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers to participate in all of its public sector and private sector subcontracting and supply opportunities, provided that this clause does not prohibit or limit lawful efforts to remedy the effects of marketplace discrimination that have occurred or are occurring in the marketplace. Contractor understands that a material violation of this clause shall be considered a material breach of this Contract and may result in termination of this Contract, disqualification of Contractor from participating in State contracts, or other sanctions. This clause is not enforceable by or for the benefit of, and creates no obligation to, any third party.

- 30.2 As a condition of entering into this Contract, upon the request of the Commission on Civil Rights, and only after the filing of a complaint against Contractor under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended from time to time, Contractor agrees to provide within 60 days after the request a complete list of the names of all subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers that Contractor has used in the past four (4) years on any of its contracts that were undertaken within the State of Maryland, including the total dollar amount paid by Contractor on each subcontract or supply contract. Contractor further agrees to cooperate in any investigation conducted by the State pursuant to the State Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy as set forth under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, and to provide any documents relevant to any investigation that are requested by the State. Contractor understands that violation of this clause is a material breach of this Contract and may result in Contract termination, disqualification by the State from participating in State contracts, and other sanctions.
- 30.3 The Contractor shall include the language from 30.1, or similar clause approved in writing by the Department, in all subcontracts.

31. Prompt Pay Requirements

- 31.1 If the Contractor withholds payment of an undisputed amount to its subcontractor, the Department, at its option and in its sole discretion, may take one or more of the following actions:
- (a) Not process further payments to the Contractor until payment to the subcontractor is verified;
 - (b) Suspend all or some of the Contract work without affecting the completion date(s) for the Contract work;
 - (c) Pay or cause payment of the undisputed amount to the subcontractor from monies otherwise due or that may become due to the Contractor;
 - (d) Place a payment for an undisputed amount in an interest-bearing escrow account; or
 - (e) Take other or further actions as appropriate to resolve the withheld payment.
- 31.2 An “undisputed amount” means an amount owed by the Contractor to a subcontractor for which there is no good faith dispute. Such “undisputed amounts” include, without limitation: (a) retainage which had been withheld and is, by the terms of the agreement between the Contractor and subcontractor, due to be distributed to the subcontractor; and (b) an amount withheld because of issues arising out of an agreement or occurrence unrelated to the agreement under which the amount is withheld.
- 31.3 An act, failure to act, or decision of a Procurement Officer or a representative of the Department concerning a withheld payment between the Contractor and a subcontractor under this **section 31**, may not:
- (a) Affect the rights of the contracting parties under any other provision of law;
 - (b) Be used as evidence on the merits of a dispute between the Department and the Contractor in any other proceeding; or

- (c) Result in liability against or prejudice the rights of the Department.
- 31.4 The remedies enumerated above are in addition to those provided under COMAR 21.11.03.13 with respect to subcontractors that have contracted pursuant to the MBE program.
- 31.5 To ensure compliance with certified MBE subcontract participation goals, the Department may, consistent with COMAR 21.11.03.13, take the following measures:
- (a) Verify that the certified MBEs listed in the MBE participation schedule actually are performing work and receiving compensation as set forth in the MBE participation schedule. This verification may include, as appropriate:
 - i. Inspecting any relevant records of the Contractor;
 - ii. Inspecting the jobsite; and
 - iii. Interviewing subcontractors and workers.Verification shall include a review of:
 - i. The Contractor's monthly report listing unpaid invoices over thirty (30) days old from certified MBE subcontractors and the reason for nonpayment; and
 - ii. The monthly report of each certified MBE subcontractor, which lists payments received from the Contractor in the preceding thirty (30) days and invoices for which the subcontractor has not been paid.
 - (b) If the Department determines that the Contractor is not in compliance with certified MBE participation goals, then the Department will notify the Contractor in writing of its findings, and will require the Contractor to take appropriate corrective action. Corrective action may include, but is not limited to, requiring the Contractor to compensate the MBE for work performed as set forth in the MBE participation schedule.
 - (c) If the Department determines that the Contractor is in material noncompliance with MBE Contract provisions and refuses or fails to take the corrective action that the Department requires, then the Department may:
 - i. Terminate the Contract;
 - ii. Refer the matter to the Office of the Attorney General for appropriate action; or
 - iii. Initiate any other specific remedy identified by the Contract, including the contractual remedies required by any applicable laws, regulations, and directives regarding the payment of undisputed amounts.
 - (d) Upon completion of the Contract, but before final payment or release of retainage or both, the Contractor shall submit a final report, in affidavit form under the penalty of perjury, of all payments made to, or withheld from, MBE subcontractors.

32. Living Wage

If a Contractor subject to the Living Wage law fails to submit all records required under COMAR 21.11.10.05 to the Commissioner of Labor and Industry at the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, the Department may withhold payment of any invoice or retainage. The Department may require certification from the Commissioner on a quarterly basis that such records were properly submitted.

33. Use of Estimated Quantities

Unless specifically indicated otherwise in the State's solicitation or other controlling documents related to the Scope of Work, any sample amounts provided are estimates only and the Department does not guarantee a minimum or maximum number of units or usage in the performance of this Contract.

34. Risk of Loss; Transfer of Title

Risk of loss for conforming supplies, equipment, materials and Deliverables furnished to the State hereunder shall remain with the Contractor until such supplies, equipment, materials and Deliverables are received and accepted by the State, following which, title shall pass to the State.

35. Effect of Contractor Bankruptcy

All rights and licenses granted by the Contractor under this Contract are and shall be deemed to be rights and licenses to "intellectual property," and the subject matter of this Contract, including services, is and shall be deemed to be "embodiments of intellectual property" for purposes of and as such terms are used and interpreted under § 365(n) of the United States Bankruptcy Code ("Code") (11 U.S.C. § 365(n) (2010)). The State has the right to exercise all rights and elections under the Code and all other applicable bankruptcy, insolvency and similar laws with respect to this Contract (including all executory statement of works). Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, if the Contractor or its estate becomes subject to any bankruptcy or similar proceeding: (a) subject to the State's rights of election, all rights and licenses granted to the State under this Contract shall continue subject to the respective terms and conditions of this Contract; and (b) the State shall be entitled to a complete duplicate of (or complete access to, as appropriate) all such intellectual property and embodiments of intellectual property, and the same, if not already in the State's possession, shall be promptly delivered to the State, unless the Contractor elects to and does in fact continue to perform all of its obligations under this Contract.

36. Miscellaneous

- 36.1 Any provision of this Contract which contemplates performance or observance subsequent to any termination or expiration of this Contract shall survive termination or expiration of this Contract and continue in full force and effect.
- 36.2 If any term contained in this Contract is held or finally determined to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, in whole or in part, such term shall be severed from this Contract, and the remaining terms contained herein shall continue in full force and effect, and shall in no way be affected, prejudiced, or disturbed thereby.
- 36.3 The headings of the sections contained in this Contract are for convenience only and shall not be deemed to control or affect the meaning or construction of any provision of this Contract.
- 36.4 This Contract may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Signatures provided by facsimile or other electronic means, e.g, and not by way of limitation, in Adobe .PDF sent by electronic mail, shall be deemed to be original signatures.

37. Contract Monitor and Procurement Officer

- 37.1 The State representative for this Contract who is primarily responsible for Contract administration functions, including issuing written direction, invoice approval, monitoring this Contract to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract, monitoring MBE and VSBE compliance, and achieving completion of the Contract on budget, on time, and within scope. The Contract Monitor may authorize in writing one or more State representatives to act on behalf of the Contract Monitor in the performance of the Contract Monitor's responsibilities. The Department may change the Contract Monitor at any time by written notice to the Contractor.

37.2 The Procurement Officer has responsibilities as detailed in the Contract, and is the only State representative who can authorize changes to the Contract. The Department may change the Procurement Officer at any time by written notice to the Contractor.

38. Notices

39. Liquidated Damages for MBE

39.1 The Contract requires the Contractor to comply in good faith with the MBE Program and Contract provisions. The State and the Contractor acknowledge and agree that the State will incur damages, including but not limited to loss of goodwill, detrimental impact on economic development, and diversion of internal staff resources, if the Contractor does not comply in good faith with the requirements of the MBE Program and MBE Contract provisions. The parties further acknowledge and agree that the damages the State might reasonably be anticipated to accrue as a result of such lack of compliance are difficult to ascertain with precision.

39.2 Therefore, upon issuance of a written determination by the State that the Contractor failed to comply in good faith with one or more of the specified MBE Program requirements or MBE Contract provisions, the Contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the State at the rates set forth below. The Contractor expressly agrees that the State may withhold payment on any invoices as a set-off against liquidated damages owed. The Contractor further agrees that for each specified violation, the agreed

upon liquidated damages are reasonably proximate to the loss the State is anticipated to incur as a result of such violation.

- (a) Failure to submit each monthly payment report in full compliance with COMAR 21.11.03.13B (3): \$ 33.00 per day until the monthly report is submitted as required.
- (b) Failure to include in its agreements with MBE subcontractors a provision requiring submission of payment reports in full compliance with COMAR 21.11.03.13B (4): \$ 84.00 per MBE subcontractor.
- (c) Failure to comply with COMAR 21.11.03.12 in terminating, canceling, or changing the scope of work/value of a contract with an MBE subcontractor and amendment of the MBE participation schedule: the difference between the dollar value of the MBE participation commitment on the MBE participation schedule for that specific MBE firm and the dollar value of the work performed by that MBE firm for the Contract.
- (d) Failure to meet the Contractor's total MBE participation goal and sub goal commitments: the difference between the dollar value of the total MBE participation commitment on the MBE participation schedule and the MBE participation actually achieved.
- (e) Failure to promptly pay all undisputed amounts to an MBE subcontractor in full compliance with the prompt payment provisions of the Contract: \$ 100.00 appropriate rate following calculation instructions from GOSBA>> per day until the undisputed amount due to the MBE subcontractor is paid

39.2 Notwithstanding the assessment or availability of liquidated damages, the State reserves the right to terminate the Contract and exercise any and all other rights or remedies which may be available under the Contract or Law.

40. Parent Company Guarantee (If applicable)

(Corporate name of Contractor's Parent Company) hereby guarantees absolutely the full, prompt, and complete performance by (Contractor) of all the terms, conditions and obligations contained in this Contract, as it may be amended from time to time, including any and all exhibits that are now or may become incorporated hereunto, and other obligations of every nature and kind that now or may in the future arise out of or in connection with this Contract, including any and all financial commitments, obligations, and liabilities. (Corporate name of Contractor's Parent Company) may not transfer this absolute guaranty to any other person or entity without the prior express written approval of the State, which approval the State may grant, withhold, or qualify in its sole and absolute subjective discretion. (Corporate name of Contractor's Parent Company) further agrees that if the State brings any claim, action, lawsuit or proceeding against (Contractor), (Corporate name of Contractor's Parent Company) may be named as a party, in its capacity as Absolute Guarantor.

41. Federal Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Exclusion Requirements

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with federal provisions (pursuant to §§ 1128 and 1156 of the Social Security Act and 42 C.F.R. 1001) that prohibit payments under certain federal health care programs to any individual or entity that is on the List of Excluded Individuals/Entities maintained by DHHS. By executing this Contract, the Contractor affirmatively declares that neither it nor any employee is, to the best of its knowledge, subject to exclusion. The Contractor agrees, further, during the term of this Contract, to check the List of Excluded Individuals/Entities prior to hiring or assigning individuals to work on this Contract, and to notify the Department immediately of any identification of the Contractor or an individual employee as excluded, and of any DHHS action or proposed action to exclude the Contractor or any Contractor employee.

42. Compliance with federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and State Confidentiality Law

- 42.1 The Contractor acknowledges its duty to become familiar with and comply, to the extent applicable, with all requirements of the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), 42 U.S.C. § 1320d et seq., and implementing regulations including 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164. The Contractor also agrees to comply with the Maryland Confidentiality of Medical Records Act (MCMRA), Md. Code Ann. Health-General §§ 4-301 et seq. This obligation includes:
- (a) As necessary, adhering to the privacy and security requirements for protected health information and medical records under HIPAA and MCMRA and making the transmission of all electronic information compatible with the HIPAA requirements;
 - (b) Providing training and information to employees regarding confidentiality obligations as to health and financial information and securing acknowledgement of these obligations from employees to be involved in the Contract; and
 - (c) Otherwise providing good information management practices regarding all health information and medical records.
- 42.2 Based on the determination by the Department that the functions to be performed in accordance with the scope of work set forth in the solicitation constitute business associate functions as defined in HIPAA, the selected Bidder shall execute a business associate agreement as required by HIPAA regulations at 45 C.F.R. 164.504 and in the form as required by the Department.
- 42.3 “Protected Health Information” as defined in the HIPAA regulations at 45 C.F.R. 160.103 and 164.501, means information transmitted as defined in the regulations, that is individually identifiable; that is created or received by a healthcare provider, health plan, public health authority, employer, life insurer, school or university, or healthcare clearinghouse; and that is related to the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of an individual, to the provision of healthcare to an individual, or to the past, present, or future payment for the provision of healthcare to an individual. The definition excludes certain education records as well as employment records held by a covered entity in its role as employer.

43. Hiring Agreement

- 43.1 The Contractor agrees to execute and comply with the enclosed Maryland Department of Human Services (DHS) Hiring Agreement (Attachment O). The Hiring Agreement is to be executed by the Bidder and delivered to the Procurement Officer within ten (10) Business Days following receipt of notice by the Bidder that it is being recommended for Contract award. The Hiring Agreement will become effective concurrently with the award of the Contract.
- 43.2 The Hiring Agreement provides that the Contractor and DHS will work cooperatively to promote hiring by the Contractor of qualified individuals for job openings resulting from this procurement, in accordance with Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article §13-224.

44. Limited English Proficiency

The Contractor shall provide equal access to public services to individuals with limited English proficiency in compliance with Md. Code Ann., State Government Article, §§ 10-1101 et seq., and Policy Guidance issued by the Office of Civil Rights, Department of Health and Human Services, and MDH Policy 02.06.07.

Appendix 1. – Abbreviations and Definitions

For purposes of this MS-IFB, the following abbreviations or terms have the meanings indicated below:

- A. **Bid** – The Bidder’s Bid.
- B. **Bid Price Form** or **Bid Form** - The Attachment B Bid Form.
- C. **Bidder** – An entity that submits a Bid in response to this MS-IFB.
- D. **Business Day(s)** – The official working days of the week to include Monday through Friday. Official working days excluding State Holidays (see definition of “Normal State Business Hours” below).
- E. **COMAR** – Code of Maryland Regulations available on-line at <http://www.dsd.state.md.us/COMAR/ComarHome.html>.
- F. **Contract** – The Contract awarded to the successful Bidder pursuant to this MS-IFB. The Contract will be in the form of **Attachment M**.
- G. **Contract Monitor** – The State representative for this Contract who is primarily responsible for Contract administration functions, including issuing written direction, invoice approval, monitoring this Contract to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract, monitoring MBE and VSBE compliance, and achieving completion of the Contract on budget, on time, and within scope. The Contract Monitor may authorize in writing one or more State representatives to act on behalf of the Contract Monitor in the performance of the Contract Monitor’s responsibilities. The Department may change the Contract Monitor at any time by written notice to the Contractor.
- H. **Contract Officer**- The Office of Procurement and Support Services (OPASS) designated individual assigned to facilitate the procurement process. The Procurement Officer may designate the Contract Officer to conduct components of the procurement on behalf of the Procurement Officer.
- I. **Contractor** – The selected Bidder that is awarded a Contract by the State.
- J. **Contractor Personnel** – Employees and agents and subcontractor employees and agents performing work at the direction of the Contractor under the terms of the Contract awarded from this MS-IFB.
- K. **Data Breach** – The unauthorized acquisition, use, modification or disclosure of State data, or other Sensitive Data.
- L. **Data Entry** – Key entry of data from paper source Document to electronic media.
- M. **Data Entry Error** – Any key stroke entry that does not match the data of the source Document, e.g., entry of one or more incorrect characters or omission of required characters as defined in the Document specifications.
- N. **Document** – Distinct type of form to be processed under this Contract. Document types are identified in Section 2 of the MS-IFB.
- O. **eMMA** – eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (see MS-IFB **Section 4.2**).
- P. **Error Rate** – The Error Rate of one percent (1%) is defined on a per record and Document type basis. Any record with one or more Data Entry errors counts as an “error”. The Error Rate
- Q. is calculated by dividing the total errors (per month) by the total records (per month) of a particular Document type.
- R. **Key Personnel** – All Contractor Personnel identified in the solicitation as such that are essential to the work being performed under the Contract.

- S. **Local Time** – Time in the Eastern Time Zone as observed by the State of Maryland. Unless otherwise specified, all stated times shall be Local Time, even if not expressly designated as such.
- T. **Maryland Department of Health** - MDH or the “Department”.
- U. **Minority Business Enterprise (MBE)** – Any legal entity certified as defined at COMAR 21.01.02.01B (54) which is certified by the Maryland Department of Transportation under COMAR 21.11.03.
- V. **Multi-Step Invitation for Bids (MS-IFB)** – This Multi-Step Invitation for Bids issued by the Maryland Department of Health (Department), with the Solicitation Number and date of issuance indicated in the Key Information Summary Sheet, including any amendments thereto.
- W. **Normal State Business Hours** - Normal State business hours are 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday except State Holidays, which can be found at: www.dbm.maryland.gov – keyword: State Holidays.
- X. **Notice to Proceed (NTP)** – A written notice from the Procurement Officer that work under the Contract, project, Task Order or Work Order (as applicable) is to begin as of a specified date. The NTP Date is the start date of work under the Contract, project, Task Order or Work Order. Additional NTPs may be issued by either the Procurement Officer or the Contract Monitor regarding the start date for any service included within this solicitation with a delayed or non-specified implementation date.
- Y. **NTP Date** – The date specified in a NTP for work on Contract, project, Task Order or Work Order to begin.
- Z. **Output Format** – Output data shall be in a fixed field length and fixed record length .txt file format conforming to output positions, record length, and other requirements defined in the relevant Document Data Entry Specifications.
- AA. **Personally Identifiable Information (PII)** – Any information about an individual maintained by the State, including (1) any information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual identity, such as name, social security number, date and place of birth, mother’s maiden name, or biometric records; and (2) any other information that is linked or linkable to an individual, such as medical, educational, financial, and employment information.
- BB. **Procurement Coordinator-** – The State representative designated by the Procurement Officer to perform certain duties related to this solicitation which are expressly set forth herein.
- CC. **Procurement Officer** – Prior to the award of any Contract, the sole point of contact in the State for purposes of this solicitation. After Contract award, the Procurement Officer has responsibilities as detailed in the Contract (**Attachment M**), and is the only State representative who can authorize changes to the Contract. The Department may change the Procurement Officer at any time by written notice to the Contractor.
- DD. **Protected Health Information (PHI)** – Information that relates to the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of an individual; the provision of health care to an individual; or the past, present, or future payment for the provision of health care to an individual; and (i) that identifies the individual; or (ii) with respect to which there is a reasonable basis to believe the information can be used to identify the individual.
- EE. **Security Incident** – A violation or imminent threat of violation of computer security policies, Security Measures, acceptable use policies, or standard security practices. “Imminent threat of violation” is a situation in which the organization has a factual basis for believing that a specific incident is about to occur.

- FF. **Security or Security Measures** – The technology, policy and procedures that a) protects and b) controls access to networks, systems, and data.
- GG. **Sensitive Data** - Means PII; PHI; other proprietary or confidential data as defined by the State, including but not limited to “personal information” under Md. Code Ann., Commercial Law § 14-3501(e) and Md. Code Ann., St. Govt. § 10-1301(c) and information not subject to disclosure under the Public Information Act, Title 4 of the General Provisions Article; and information about an individual that (1) can be used to distinguish or trace an individual’s identity, such as name, social security number, date and place of birth, mother’s maiden name, or biometric records; or (2) is linked or linkable to an individual, such as medical, educational, financial, and employment information.
- HH. **State** – The State of Maryland.
- II. **Technical Offer** – A Bidder’s response to the Scope of Work requirements of this IFB. A Bidder’s Technical Offer will be determined to be acceptable or not acceptable prior to any opening of a Bidder’s Bid Price Form. See IFB Section 5.4.3 for more information.
- JJ. **Total Bid Price** - The Bidder’s bid price or evaluated bid price for goods and services in response to this solicitation, included in **Attachment B** – Bid Form.
- KK. **Veteran-owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE)** – A business that is verified by the Center for Verification and Evaluation (CVE) of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as a veteran-owned small business. See Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.11.13.
