Scope of Work Summary Statement

The Maryland Department of Health's (MDH) is issuing this Request for Proposals (RFP) to obtain a management consulting contractor to support the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) in finalizing its transition from a prospective payment system, to fee-for-service, and to further develop and provide direction to the DDA's Office of Change Management (OCM) and Stakeholder engagement.



Scope of Work Summary Statement

- It is the State's intention to obtain services, as specified in this RFP, from a Contract between the selected Offeror and the State. The anticipated duration of services to be provided under this Contract is three (3) base years with two (2) option periods. Each option period is one (1) year
- The Department intends to make a single award as a result of this RFP. See RFP Section 4.9 Award Basis for more Contract award information
- An Offeror, either directly or through its subcontractor(s), must be able to provide all services and meet all of the requirements requested in this solicitation and shall remain responsible for Contract performance regardless of subcontractor participation in the work Marvland

- Services are provided through a wide array of community-based services delivered primarily through a network of nonprofit Providers, as well as forensic residential centers and State residential centers

• The DDA has been engaged in transformation initiatives for the past six (6) years to improve its service delivery system and transition from its standalone legacy IT platform to the Medicaid LTSS*Maryland* system. The Long-Term Services Support System (LTSS) Maryland is a user-friendly system that streamlines the coordination, delivery, and payment for people in DDA's three Medicaid Waivers and State-Funded Services. DDA's intent is to complete its transition from the current Prospective Payment System (PPS) to a Fee-For-Service (FFS) model
