Due to Covid-19 the January 8, 2021 Board meeting was held via teleconference. The public was asked to submit questions via email prior to the meeting.

A. Minutes

Minutes of the Open Meeting held on December 4, 2020 were reviewed **A motion was made**, seconded and unanimously carried to accept the minutes as submitted.

B. Announcements

Ms. Smith reported that odd number renewals commenced on January 7th and would continue until March 31, 2021. Board members were reminded to submit continuing education documentation during their renewal year.

The legislative session was said to begin on January 13, 2021 and sine die is April 12th. Due to Covid-19 all hearings will be held virtually. The legislative committee will meet to discuss legislation put forth by the Maryland Psychological Association proposing that Maryland join the

Association of the State and Provincial Psychology Boards, Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact (PSYPACT).

Dr. Bishop proposed having a committee review the process for how new Board members are selected to serve on the Board. The Maryland Psychological Association currently facilitates this process.

C. Question

Mr. Felter reported that an email was received from a private psychology practice in Pennsylvania asking if they could provide teletherapy services to Slippery Rock University students who return home to Maryland during school breaks. The University contacted the practice for continuity of service as the students currently receive therapy through the University. After a discussion a motion was made, seconded, and unanimously carried to allow the practice to provide services via the COVID-19 Temporary Exception to Practice option since an existing client relationship was established through the University.
