A. Minutes

Minutes of the Open Meeting held on February 7, 2020 were reviewed **A motion was made**, seconded and a vote called to accept the minutes as submitted. For – 6; Abstention-1

B. Announcements

Executive Director - The list of registrants for the March law exam was reviewed. A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously carried to approve the list and others who may register later.

Ms. Smith reported that criminal history record checks are scheduled to begin during the 2021 renewal period. Background checks performed as early as July 1, 2020 will be accepted.

Ms. Smith reported on the following bills:

HB 0448 - Health *Care Practitioners-Telehealth* - **Passed with amendments** - Allows practitioners to provide asynchronously telehealth services.

SB 0067 - *Public Information Act-Applications for Inspection-Responses and Time Limits* – **Failed -** Altered the time for a custodian to respond to a Public Information Act (PIA) request from thirty (30) days to seven (7) days.

HB 259 - Health Occupations - Diagnostic Evaluation and Treatment of Patients – Disciplinary Actions (The Patient's Access to Integrative Healthcare Act of 2020) – Passed Prohibits health boards from disciplining a practitioner that uses non-conventional practices when performing evaluations and treatment.

HB 639- *Public Health - Health Care Professionals - Cultural Competency Coursework or Training -* **Withdrawn** - Required health care professionals who work in a hospital setting to submit proof of cultural competency and requires Boards to post cultural competency training courses on their website.

HB782- Health- Mental and Emotional Disorders- Consent (Mental Health Access Initiative)
No action - Allowed minors younger than 16 to consent to therapy without parents' permission

HB1551- *Health Practitioners – Minor Patients- Child Abuse Reporting -* **No action -** Required health care practitioners to inform minors that they can report abuse to practitioner.
