Dear Licensee/ Registered Psychology Associates:

The Budget Reconciliation Act of 2003 requires all Health Occupations Boards to verify that renewal applicants have paid all undisputed taxes and unemployment insurance contributions before renewing a license/registration. Thus, all renewals are subject to verification through the State Comptroller's Office. The Comptroller's Office has identified your name as delinquent in paying taxes or unemployment insurance contributions.

Under the requirements of this legislation, the Maryland Board of Examiners of Psychologists (the Board) must have verification from the Comptroller's Office that the tax or unemployment insurance contribution matter has been resolved before the Board's issuance of a renewed license/registration. You can renew your psychology license/registration once the Comptroller has notified us that the tax issue has been resolved.

If the Board does not receive verification from the Comptroller by March 31, 2025, your license/registration will be non-renewed. The Board has no additional information regarding this matter.
