Compliance Guide for New Regulations for Small Businesses

- What does this regulation do?
The purpose of this action is to increase the listed provider reimbursement rate by 7.25%, effective for Fiscal Year 2023, pursuant to Senate Bill 290 Fiscal Year 2023 Budget (2022) and the Governor's supplemental budget. This action will also update COMAR references as well as add clarifying language regarding the enrollment process.
- Who is subject to the new regulation?
Opioid treatment programs (OTPs), psychiatric rehabilitation programs (PRPs), and mobile treatment services programs (MTSS) enrolled as Maryland Medicaid health home providers will benefit from increased reimbursement.
- Why were the new regulations proposed?
This new proposal is required to update the provider rates in accordance with Senate Bill 290 Fiscal Year 2023 Budget (2022) and the Governor's supplemental budget.
- When are the regulations effective?
July 1, 2022
