## **ASWB Exam Cost**

### **ASWB Exam Registration:**

- To register with ASWB and pay the exam fee.
  - o Associate, Bachelors, or Masters exam: US\$230
  - Advanced Generalist or Clinical exam: \$250
- To register, you must be eligible to take a social work licensing examination. In most jurisdictions you must apply for licensure and pay any required fees to the social work licensing board. The board will notify you of your examination approval.
- If you have a disability, health condition, or other need, you must request and receive approval for nonstandard testing arrangements before registering with ASWB to take an exam

### Cost of Supervision

- Most offers are from private LCSW-C's.
- Can be group or individual (group rates tend to be cheaper)
- Varies, but generally around \$100/hour

### **Supervision Reciprocity**

- "2 years of active clinical practice experience as a professional counselor, marriage and family therapist or alcohol and drug counselor licensed or certified in another state, territory, or jurisdiction that has requirements that are equivalent to or exceed the requirements of Health Occupations Article, §17-302, 17303, or 17-304"
- Must have:
  - o 2 years of documented experience providing counselor supervision;
  - At least 3 semester credit hours of graduate-level academic coursework that includes counseling supervision;
  - A Board-approved continuing education program in counseling supervision, that includes a minimum of 18 direct clock hours with the trainer or trainers
  - The National Board of Certified Counselors (NBCC) Approved Clinical Supervisor (ACS) credential;
  - o Or Supervision training as defined in Regulation .02B(9)(a) and (b).

### Why can a Counselor Supervise a Social Worker?

- LPC's have ample training on mental health issues. Their scope of practice revolves around therapy and psychological health issues, whereas social workers have more interdisciplinary training.
- Therapy is a part, but not all of a social worker's workload. For LPC's they focus solely on therapy
- Similar education and supervision requirements to get licensed for both professions

#### Purpose of Supervision

• "The purpose of supervision in mental health counseling is to enrich the clinician's attitudes, knowledge and skills in order to competently provide quality care resulting in

improved clinical outcomes. In the context of evidence-based mental health practices, clinical supervision is a useful tool in disseminating evidence-based practices and ensuring the fidelity and effectiveness of a treatment program"

- Three types of supervision:
  - Educational/Clinical the supervisor teaches therapeutic skills and helps the clinician develop self-awareness in order to better the therapeutic interactions with clients.
  - Administrative objectives of the agency/organization's policy and public accountability are transformed into tasks to be accomplished by the clinician.
  - **Supportive** the supervisor guides the clinician in finding ways to decrease job related stress in order to improve job performance.

### • Goals of Supervision:

- Promoting supervisee growth and development through teaching.
- Protecting the welfare of the client.
- Monitoring supervisee performance and gatekeeping for the profession.
- Empowering the supervisee to self-supervise and carry out the above goals as an independent professional.
