

# Board Member Vacancy Announcement for Assisted Living Manager Positions – Applications Requested

The Board is providing notice that five assisted living manager (“ALM”) positions, as required under § 9-202(a)(2)(iii) of the Health Occupations Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, are vacant and open for appointment.

- Applications should be submitted directly to the Governor’s Appointment Office (“GAO”) via <https://govappointments.maryland.gov/>
- The requirements for the five ALM Board members are set forth in § 9-202 of the Health Occupations Article.
- The five ALM Board members must each be actively employed by an assisted living program and completed the manager training required under § 19-1807(a) of the Health-General Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, which includes at least 80 hours of training. There may be an exemption for those who fulfill the requirements of § 19-1807(d) of the Health-General Article.
- Each ALM Board member is appointed by the Governor, with the advice of the Secretary of Health. The Secretary shall recommend to the Governor ALMs who have a minimum of five years experience as an ALM and is actively practicing.
- Beginning October 1, 2024, each ALM Board member must be licensed by the Board.
- Each Board member shall be a United States citizen or has declared an intent to become a United States citizen and has resided in Maryland for at least one year before appointment.
- The term of a Board is four years, and a Board member may not serve more than two consecutive full terms.
- The full Board generally meets once per month (except for January, July, and August) at the Maryland Department of Health, 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland 21215. The full Board meetings begin at 9:30 a.m.
- The Board licenses and regulated Nursing Home Administrators and, after October 1, 2024, ALMs.
- The Board also has multiple committees, including, but not limited to, credentials, disciplinary, and legislative. Participation in the Board’s committees is encouraged for Board members.
