CONSENT ORDER

Background

On June 23, 2011, the Maryland State Board of Professional Counselors & Therapists (the "Board") received information concerning the practice of Certified Supervised Counselor-Alcohol and Drug (CSC-AD), Thomas F. Colbert, the Respondent, who was practicing supervised counseling-alcohol and drug under an expired certificate for a certain period of time. The Board subsequently opened an investigation in this matter.

On November 1, 2013, the Respondent and his attorney, Ian Friedman, attended a settlement conference with Board representatives in an effort to reach resolution of the case prior to the issuance of charges. As a result, the Respondent and the Board have agreed to resolve this matter as set forth in this Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds that:

- On December 16, 2011, the Board initiated an investigation into Thomas Colbert's
 practice of supervised counseling-alcohol and drug based on information received from
 the Respondent relating to his practicing supervised counseling-alcohol and drug on an
 expired certificate.
- 2. In the course of its investigation, the Board established that the Respondent practiced supervised counseling-alcohol and drug on an expired certificate on two separate

occasions from January 2007 through July 2007 and from February 2011 until April 2011.

- Notices were sent by the Board to the Respondent prior to the renewal period for his
 certification and during the period of time when his certificate had lapsed informing him
 that his certification had expired.
- 4. In an interview with Board representatives, the Respondent disclosed that he provided Supervised Counseling-Alcohol and Drug on an expired certificate on the above mentioned dates.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that the Respondent, Thomas Colbert, in violation of Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 17-301, § 17-401(b)(3)(i), (ii) and (iii), § 17-509, (6), (7), (8), (12) and (13), and (16), § 17-603(3) and COMAR 10.58.01.03(A)(B) and (C), (2), 10.58.03.03(A)(1) and 10.58.03.04(B)(2). These violations are based upon the fact that the Respondent practiced supervised counseling – alcohol and drug for six months on an expired certificate.

<u>ORDER</u>

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is this

of of the l, 201, hereby:

ORDERED that within twelve (12) months of this Consent Order:

a. The Respondent's practice shall be supervised, at his own expense, by a licensed counselor/therapist Board-approved alcohol and drug counselor with experience and expertise in the field of alcohol and drug counseling;

- b. As part of the approval process, the Respondent shall submit to the Board the name and professional credentials of a counselor to supervise his practice;
- c. The Respondent shall provide the Board-approved supervising counselor with a copy of this Consent Order, and whatever other written materials the Board deems relevant;
- d. The approved supervisor shall report quarterly to the Board's Rehabilitation

 Committee on the Respondent's progress toward completing his continuing education
 unit (CEU) requirements, including the ethics course required by this Consent Order,
 and ensuring he files his renewal during his designated renewal period, and
 Respondent's overall work-performance with regard to his responsibilities as a

 Certified Supervised Counselor-Alcohol and Drug; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent shall enroll in and successfully complete a three (3) credit course in ethics related to professional, legal and ethical responsibility or specific to alcohol and drug counseling that is an in-class only course to be completed within twelve months of this Consent Order.

- a. This course may count toward Respondent's required CEUs. After the successful completion of the in-class ethics course, the instructor shall provide the Board with a written report detailing the Respondent's participation in and completion of the course;
- b. The Respondent is responsible for ensuring that he completes the required Continuing Education Units, and the ethics course, in a timely manner;
- c. The Respondent is responsible for submitting to the Board proof of his successful completion of all Continuing Education Units, and the in-class ethics course;

d. If the Respondent files renewal applications for the next two renewal periods, the Board shall audit his renewal applications; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent shall file his renewal for certification within the designated renewal period of November 2014 to January 2015;

ORDERED that failure to comply with the terms of this Consent Order may be deemed a violation and the Board may impose additional terms or sanctions as it deems appropriate; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order is considered a PUBLIC DOCUMENT pursuant to Md. State Gov't Code Ann. § 10-611 et seg. (2009 Repl. Vol.).

my right to a full evidentiary hearing as set forth above, and any right to appeal this Consent

Order or any adverse ruling of the Board that might have followed any such hearing.

I sign this Consent Order voluntarily, without reservation, and I fully understand and comprehend the language, meaning and terms of this Consent Order, consisting of 4 pages.
