#### CAC-AD <u>Educational</u> Requirements:

- 1) Hold a bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally accredited educational institution approved by the Board in a *health and human services counseling field*; **OR**
- 2) Hold a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited educational institution approved by the board in a program of studies judged by the board to be substantially equivalent in subject matter under COMAR 10.58.07.06A(3)(a); <u>AND</u>
- 3) Complete a minimum of 33 semester credit hours or 50 quarter credit hours in alcohol and drug counselor training from a regionally accredited institution of higher education approved by the Board including:
- (i) A 3-semester credit hour or 5 quarter credit hour course taken at a regionally accredited educational institution **in each** of the following courses:
  - 1. Medical aspects of chemical dependency;
  - 2. Addictions treatment delivery;
  - 3. Group counseling;
  - 4. Individual counseling;
  - 5. Ethics that includes alcohol and drug counseling issues; and
  - 6. Abnormal psychology; and
- (ii) *Any three* of the following 3 semester credit hour or 5 quarter credit hour courses taken at a regionally accredited educational institution:
  - 1. Family counseling;
  - 2. Theories of counseling;
  - 3. Human development;
  - 4. Topics in substance related and addictive disorders; and
  - 5. Treatment of co-occurring disorders; and
- 4) Complete an internship in alcohol and drug counseling that totals 6 semester credit hours or 10 quarter credit hours.

# **CAC-AD Course Descriptions**

- A. **Medical Aspects of Chemical Dependency**: (1) Brain structure and function as it relates to psychoactive drugs, and (2) Classes of psychoactive drugs, including their addiction potential, withdrawal syndromes, and associated medical problems. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Intro to Psychopharmacology (2) Pharmacological Aspects of Addiction.
- B. Addictions Treatment Delivery: (1) Screening (2) Intake (3) Orientation (4) Case Management (5) Crisis intervention (6) Education and prevention (7) Referral (8) Consultation (9) Reports and record keeping (10) Assessment and diagnosis based on standard criteria and (11) Treatment planning. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Substance Abuse Counseling (2) Addictions Counseling Theories and Approaches.
- C. **Ethics** (with a focus on Alcohol & Drug): (1) Self disclosure of recovering counselors (2) Ethics of being a two- hatter (3) Self-help fellowship participation (4) Avoiding dual relationships (5) Relapsing Counselor (6) Confidentiality Laws.
- D. Alcohol and Drug Counseling Internship/Practicum/Field Placement (6 credits)
- E. **Individual Counseling**: (1) The formation of therapeutic relationships, and (2) Therapeutic communication skills. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Counseling Methods (2) Techniques of Counseling.
- F. **Group Therapy**: (1) Therapeutic factors in groups (2) Stages of development, (3) Types of therapy groups. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Group Counseling (2) Group Therapy and Practice.
- G. **Family Counseling**: (1) Family systems theory and dynamics (2) Family processes in addiction and (3) Family recovery Models. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Marriage and Family Counseling (or Therapy) (2) Family Systems and Intervention.
- H. **Abnormal Psychology**: (1) Major categories of mental disorders, and (2) Theoretical models of mental disorders. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Abnormal Psychology (2) Psychopathology.
- I. **Topics in substance related and addictive disorder**: (1) Various theories of addictive disorders (2) Models of treatment and (3) Other topics related to alcohol and drug dependency. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Alcoholism and Other Drug Dependency (2) Issues in Theories in Alcoholism and Other Drug Dependence.
- J. **Theories of Counseling**: major theoretical schools and theorists. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Theories of Counseling (or Psychotherapy) (2) Introduction to Psychotherapy Theories.
- K. **Human Growth and Development**: (1) Developmental stages and (2) Expected milestones. Examples of courses in this area: (1) Human Growth & Development (2) Personality Development.
- L. **Treatment of Co-Occurring Disorders**: (1) Screening, assessment and treatment of people with co-occurring disorders (2) types of integrated treatment. Examples of courses in this area (1) Dual Diagnosis (2) Treatment of Substance Abuse and Mental Health Disorders.
